MONMOUTHSHIRE v. GLAMORGANSHIRE.

Fresh from their big victory over Carmarthenshire, Monmouthshire to-day opened on the Athletic grounds a two-day match with their great rivals and neighbours, Glamorgan. The spectators were not numerous when the match opened.

Monmouthshire, having won the toss, sent in A. M. Malby and Silverlock to the bowling of Maxwell and Nash. The defence of the batsmen was good, but at 13 Silverlock gave Maxwell an easy catch, and retired for a second. On Phillips coming in the latter made a nice square leg hit for three off Nash, and added a couple through the slips. The next few overs produced few runs, but Phillips added a three and Malby a couple, which took the score to thirty for one wicket. A leg hit by Malby in the next over produced three, and a couple from Phillips were reduced by a short run. Phillips took the score to 40 with a nice leg hit, after 40 minutes play.

Malby nearly lost his wicket, but the wicket-keeper was a bit slow, and the batsmen seemed to have the measure of the bowling, getting whenever opportunity offered. Thus, however, was not too often, for the bowling was smart. A change was made in the bowling at 40, Trevor coming in for Nash, and at 46 G. L. Rattenbury was sent on with Maxwell. Trevor's first over was a maiden, and his second over sent back Malby, from a slip catch. Malby, who had put together 21, was succeeded by Captain Giles, the score then standing at 48 for two.

The 50 went up after an hour's play, and runs were added slowly until Captain Giles, with a boundary hit, raised the score to 10. He, however, soon put one up to Maxwell, and he fired with the score reaching 31 for three, his own contribution being 7.

Diver joined Phillips, and when the score stood at 38 Maxwell relieved Rattenbury. Runs came singly, but Diver drove a ball to long-on, for four, on Phillips lost his wicket to Trevor, and the score stood at 38 for four, of which Phillips had 15 up to 31.

T. B. Williams succeeded, and he and Diver were announced until the luncheon interval, when the score was 63 for four wickets.

After lunch Diver and Williams added steadily to the score, and then the latter was bowled after contributing 15. Diver was eventually caught from a weak stroke at mid-on. Raikes did not play Maxwell with confidence, but after two or three faulty and unproductive strokes he just touched a ball which went into the hands of the wicket-keeper.

Smith followed and scored a two off the first ball. Phillips made one or two good strokes, one lofty hit to long-on which falling out of reach realised four. But after playing with apparent confidence he laboured, and Creber failing to get hold of the ball he gave Rattenbury an easy catch at mid-off, and the old Briton made no mistake.

W. A. Williams was bowled first ball, helplessly falling at a good length ball from Creber. Foster Steadman was the last man, and scored a single at his second ball. He then sent Maxwell and hit out. The ball went straight to Creber at mid-off, all along the ground, and was very fast, but the batsman missed, and then stood still and watched, presumably confident that it would reach the boundary. It did nothing of the kind, however, and the batsman ran six. At the next ball Steadman scored 3, and brought the individual score to 49. He got a single in the next over, and after Smith had played the other five balls the Newport captain got a 4 for a run off Maxwell.

In Creber's next over Smith hit out, and returning a two brought the 150 up. Then in attempting a third he was run out, and the innings concluded at 1 1/2 p.m. for 150.

Captain Veale and Whittington opened the visitors' innings at 1 35 to the bowling of Gordon Phillips and Raikes. Veale opened well, playing Raikes with ease, and letting hard he was chiefly responsible for sending the 22 up in ten minutes. He, however, played quite a much more carefully, and in that bowler's second over he was far from comfortable. One ball, which rose very quickly from the pitch, he ducked to avoid. In Phillips's next over he was clean bowled by the second ball, which he knew nothing about. The first wicket fell at 26, of which his retiring batsman had contributed 21. Silverlock had gone on at the other end for Raikes just before Stanley Bess followed, and not a single brought the slips from his first ball. Whittington was playing very easily and once or twice opened his shoulders to Silverlock. Bess got a four, all run, for a pretty leg glance off Phillips. Both batsmen played with confidence, and scoring freely the game became very bright.

After 40 minutes' play Bess sent the 50 up with a well placed stroke to the on which realised two.

W. A. Williams went on for Phillips, and the change had the desired effect, for 58 Bess was caught at slip by Creber, having contributed 18. The bowling had no terms for Whittington, who after Gibbs had joined him made several good strokes. The bowling was uneven, and Smith at slip made one or two mistakes. Both batsmen played well and confidently, and Whittington continued to show good form. At 4 40 he sent the 100 up with a stroke to long-on, which only just failed to reach the boundary. Bess, after wards Phillips, who had just resumed, took Whittington's wicket, the batsman just touching a first rising ball and being well caught by Diver. The third wicket fell with the score at 101. The second 50 took half an hour to obtain.

MONMOUTHSHIRE v. GLAMORGAN.

The Visitors' Easy Win.

The Monmouthshire v. Glamorgan game should have been considered as 11 o'clock this morning, but when the time for commencing operations arrived a heavy storm of rain made a practical start impossible. Overnight the game was set greatly in favour of the visitors.

Monmouthshire had compiled 151 in their first innings, to which Glamorgan had replied with 242. Monmouthshire had five minutes' play, and opened with Malby and Smith. The former played a maiden over from Creber, but Smith added the second ball he received from Veale, which was easily caught by Maxwell at slip. They thus lost one wicket without scoring, and are 51 behind.

When a start was made the remaining ball of the previous night's unfinished over were bowled when another storm caused a temporary cessation.

Just before noon play was continued, Creber and Nash again sharing the attack. Both Silverlock and Malby played carefully, and took ten Creber ducks to the country, but only got a single, and a little later another single secured to him as the result of a nicely placed leg hit. Malby scored a single from Creber, and at the other end Silverlock, with a late cut, sent the ball away to the boundary.

Two balls later, however, he just touched a rising ball from Nash and was caught by W. Bancroft at mid-on. The second hour then of his first ball, when another heavy storm caused a further adjournment.

At 2 1/2 the umpires inspected the wicket and it was decided there should be no further play before lunch.

The weather cleared and still threatened when play was resumed at 1 1/2, and there was only a small amount of play. In the second over after lunch Malby was caught in the slips by Rattenbury off Nash, the third wicket falling at 41. The partner, E. S. Phillips, was taken at mid-on with 19 on the board, and Capt. Giles secured a similar fate with one run added. The total was completed when Nash bowled Diver in the next over, and with six wickets down and 81 taken about the home county were indisputably in a winning condition. Gordon Phillips and T. B. Williams made a big effort to put a better complexion on the game and the bats had been missed they played free and attractive cricket. At 3 1/2 Phillips was bowled by a good ball from Creber, and then followed by T. B. Williams who emphatically caught and bowled by Creber, his contribution of 31 being the top score. W. A. Williams was caught in the slips and as Monmouthshire only got 10 runs in the field, their century closed for 60, Glamorgan winning at 2 30 by an innings and 41 runs.
