Notes: This match was drawn after the weather limited play to under four hours. On the first day rainstopped play at 4.40 pm with the Surrey score 244-4 wickets. When play was resumed at 5.30, the remaining batsmen were dismissed in 25 minutes for 28 runs. On the second day shortly before the start there was a 'terrific downpour' which ceased at 12.30 and an early lunch was taken hoping to resume play in the afternoon. However, further rain fell during the interval and the match was abandoned at 2.40 pm when it was clear no further play was possible. For the home side, there were 1 six, 1 five and 10 fours in Spring's 68, scored in 40 minutes. For the visitors, Ashford took 7 wickets in the Surrey innings for 81 runs.

**COLLAPSE FOLLOWS HOME-TERRORS GOOD START.**

**REMARKABLE BOWLING BY ASHFORD.**  
 Although there was not a full day's play in this Devon's opening match, cricket was brimful of interest, the Surrey juniors' batting being brisk and lively. Owing to heavy rain, in spite of the fact that the wicket had been protected, it was not possible to make a start until twenty minutes past two. On the soft wicket, however, the home side gave a brilliant hitting display, their innings, which realised 278, lasting two hours and forty minutes. Only big hits abounded, as may be judged by the fact that two 6's, three 5's, and twenty-two 4's were hit during the progress. Pring was the chief exponent with a contribution of 68, which he knocked up in forty minutes, his share of big hits being one 6, one 5, and ten 4's. When rain stopped play at 4.40 Surrey had 244 up for the loss of four men. There was fifty minutes' delay, and on the game being resumed Ashford, the Devon bowler, met with remarkable success, six wickets going down in twenty-five minutes for 28 runs. Fifteen minutes remained for play when Devon opened their innings. Orchard was caught by Jackson off Platt before he had scored, and at the close Devon were 258 behind with nine wickets to fall. **CRICKET NOTES.**

**DEVON'S DISPLAY AGAINST SURREY.**

An unusual amount of interest was taken in the Devon v. Surrey 2nd XI. match, and it was a great pity that no satisfactory substitution was arrived at, owing to the unfavorable atmospheric conditions, which really interfered with play on the first day, and made any possibility on the second. This was the first occasion on which the Western County had met Surrey. Consequently, there was considerable uncertainty as to which side would win. Of course, the excellent manner in which the Surrey players acquitted themselves during previous seasons proved that they were a very good all-round team.  
 And, leaving in mind the forecasts of rain which fell on Friday before the game commenced, the performance of Surrey, on a wicket which certainly favored the bowlers, was exceptionally good. In fact, when the rain again started, somewhat late in the afternoon, it was really fortunate for Devon, as Surrey had compiled a somewhat tall score for the first few wickets. However, when the game was resumed quite a change came over the position. The Surrey batsmen, up to the time the players were driven back to the pavilion, had carried practically everything before them, hitting the Devon bowling all over the wicket and scoring no less than 244 runs in a little over an hour and a half for four wickets. The rain caused a delay of nearly an hour and a half. Then the Surrey batting totally collapsed. W. Ashford, with six wickets for 28 runs in less than half an hour.

Only those who have had an opportunity of playing against Ashford know how he can turn a ball on a soft wicket. When Surrey had totalled the 244 for four wickets it certainly seemed as though Devon would have an exceptionally difficult task to avoid defeat, and had not the batsmen played for a time, the probability is that Surrey would have continued to score heavily, and put Devon in to bat with a falling bat at the end of the day's play. However, owing to the man and the fine bowling of Ashford, Surrey's hopes were not realized. In the last six wickets only added comparatively few runs. Surrey's innings for 272, and was a good total, considering everything. Spring, who was top scorer, batted exceedingly well, and contributed 68 in 40 minutes. He once knocked the ball out of the ground, and ten times sent it to the boundary. Harrison, A. W. P. Butty, and H. S. Arden were also in excellent form, each making over 40 runs.

During the 15 minutes' batting which Devon had at the end of the first day's play the visitors lost a very valuable wicket by the dismissal of J. F. Orchard, or, at least, who was caught by Jackson off Platt before he had scored. However, Captain Bazalgette, of Exmouth (who came into the side owing to the unavailability of Knight to play), and Devon's South Devon professional, stayed at the wicket for the remainder of the period. Consequently, when rain came on for the day Devon had lost one wicket for 14 runs. The downpour of rain during Friday night and on Saturday made play out of the question on the second day, and the match therefore ended in a draw. From Devon's view, this was a somewhat satisfactory conclusion, as practically the whole of those playing for the Western County anticipated defeat.

The return match between the two counties will take place at the County Ground, Exeter, next Friday and Saturday, when L. L. L., one of the popular professionals, will take his "benefit." According to the rule officially given, there will be two or three changes in the team compared with that which represented the county last week. G. V. L. Hudson, who has been batting exceedingly well during the last fortnight or so, will certainly strengthen the side in batting, but it is doubtful whether young Knight, of Toppam, would not have been preferable to one or two others selected. Captain Hartley and G. Not are principally selected for their bowling. Although Ashford did so well at the Oval, there is no doubt that Devon had a weak bowling side. However, the inclusion of the two mentioned will give satisfaction. Of course, there may be surprise in some quarters at the selection of C. G. Nutt, of Budeinvol. On the other hand, there are many who approve of the action of the Selection Committee in giving him a place. The scarcity of good bowlers makes it a necessity for offering encouragement to promising players, and it is satisfactory to note that the Committee are only too anxious to do everything in their power to utilize what talent there is in the county. Of course, Budeinvol does not play against many strong teams. But nevertheless, Nutt has been doing exceedingly well. Budeinvol are in every way well equipped, and all interested in the welfare of junior cricket in the county hope that the trial of Nutt at the end of the present week will be a success.

There never was a time when a bowler had a better opportunity of securing his place in the county team, there not being the same competition among bowlers as among batsmen. After the very fine performance of W. Ashford, there is not much doubt that he will be again seen. Having in the evening at the County Ground on Friday and Saturday, Leggit, who had to stand down, owing to a slight injury, has not yet recovered. The professional will take his "benefit" on the last two days of this week, and there is no man in the county who more thoroughly deserves a hit. During the time Leggit has been at the County Ground he has made himself exceedingly popular. Not only is he an exceptionally good cricketer, but he knows how to prepare wickets. He is also obliging and enthusiastic, and it would be impossible to secure a man who has the welfare of Devonshire cricket more at heart. Leggit certainly deserves a good benefit, and all those who have reason to be grateful to him for his excellent work in many directions have an opportunity of showing how much they appreciate it by subscribing in connection with the forthcoming match.



LANCASHIRE v. SURREY.

Played at Manchester on June 30, July 1 & 2. Drawn.

Owing to the state of the wicket after heavy rain play could not commence on the first day until after lunch, and four times during the afternoon the cricket was interrupted by showers. In the time available thirteen wickets went down for 209 runs, Lancashire, who got three wickets down for 27 after scoring 182, having much the best of matters. The home side lost their four best wickets for ten runs, and six men were out for 63. The turning point came when Heap joined Whitehead, for in 70 minutes the pair added 93; the former batted for 100 minutes and the latter for 80. Lancashire were in one respect very fortunate; showers keeping the ball wet and the wicket easy. Surrey made 27 for three wickets at the end of the day, losing Hayward and Hayes for 1 and Bird at 15. On Friday the play was restricted by rain to 65 minutes, during which time Surrey, thanks to Hobbs, raised their score of 27 for three wickets to 100 for seven. Hobbs played very skilfully against good bowling, and at the drawing of stumps carried out his bat for 51. Ducat also played well, and helped to add 40 for the fourth wicket.
