MINOR COUNTIES' CHAMPIONSHIP.

DORSET V. SURREY.

This, the opening match of the Dorset County Club, was played at Poole Park on Wednesday and Thursday, and set aside for Stacey's benefit. The adverse weather experienced, together with the counter attractions at Bournemouth, probably accounted for the small attendances, but apart from these it might have been expected that the fixture would have drawn together more sportsmen. Stacey has done good service for the county during his seven years' residence, and it is hoped that the subscription list will atone for the lack of spectators at his benefit. A. W. Ruttly, the Old Shirburnian, was in charge of the Surrey XI. He won the toss, had first knock, and obtained top score by ingenious cricket in each innings. His driving was especially good. Harrison also was in good batting form on a wet wicket, whilst Woolley and Webb did excellent service with the ball. The South Dorset professional headed the analysis, and his seven wickets for 76 runs was a good performance. On a rather soft but easy wicket the visitors scored freely in their second innings, and just before lunch, seeing the wicket drying and having a lead of over 280, the Surrey captain declared. It was thought that the home side would go down quickly on the broken and drying wicket, but, thanks to an excellent stand by Fowler and Harrison—both of whom batted soundly, and seldom let off a loose ball—the game was not finished until after five. Neither batsman gave a chance. Harrison, Canby, and Knight also did useful service for the home side. Spring was far ahead of the other bowlers on the visiting side, and he certainly deserved his wickets. Goatley, however, was decidedly lucky in securing 3 for 12 runs. Scores:—

MINOR COUNTIES' CHAMPIONSHIP.

Dorset v. Surrey (2nd XI.)

The Dorset County Cricket Club opened their season with a match against Surrey 2nd XI. in the Poole Park on Wednesday and Thursday. The committee had set aside the match for the benefit of Stacey, the county professional, who has been with the club for the past seven years, and during that time has always given the greatest satisfaction. The home team was not at full strength, such well-known players as Williams, Sewell, Gooden, Cummins, Udall and W. Harrison being absent. Surrey won the toss, and batting first on a dead wicket, were dismissed for 149. Dorset batted on a wicket which was affected by the sun, and were got rid of for a total of 98; Fowler, Canby and A. M. Harrison did well under the difficult circumstances. Surrey started their second innings with Goatley and Harrison, and 55 runs were scored before the drawing of stumps on Wednesday evening. On Thursday the wicket was still very wet, and Goatley was soon got out for a well played 38. Harrison's contribution to the score being 53. Ratty, the Surrey captain, gave a fine display of hitting, knocking up 62 in 40 minutes. The innings was eventually declared closed for 239 with the loss of nine wickets. Of the Dorset bowlers Woolley did well in both innings, and Webb also accomplished some useful work with very little luck. Dorset went in to get 300 to win, on a wicket which was considerably cut about. A good start was made and 140 runs appeared upon the board for the loss of four wickets, when a collapse occurred and the whole side was out for 160—a good score considering the state of the wicket. Surrey thus won by 130 runs. The attendance of the general public was not large, and it is feared that Stacey will not reap a big reward on the gate receipts, but it is hoped the amount will be supplemented by donations, as the fund will not close until the end of the present season. A GREAT GAME.

Eton won by 9 runs.

One of the most remarkable games of any importance was that which commenced at Lord's on Friday last between Eton and Harrow. Until late in the second afternoon the former's position appeared to be hopeless, but as the result of some extraordinary cricket Harrow were beaten by 9 runs after a thrilling struggle. On the first day Harrow had, in difficult circumstances, scored 232 and afterwards got down half the wickets of their opponents for 40 runs. On the second morning Eton were obliged to follow-on and when their ninth wicket fell, when they were only 4 runs on, a victory for Harrow by a large margin appeared to be almost a certainty. The last pair, however, Lister-Kaye and the Hon. J. N. Manners, gave a lot of trouble, adding 50 before the innings closed for 219. This left Harrow 55 runs to win—a task which appeared to be very easy, on paper. Fowler, however, bowled magnificently and, supported by excellent fielding, pulled off the game for Eton by the margin stated.
