Daniell made some delightful off-hits during the 50 minutes he was in. Surrey lost Hobbs at 13, Hayes at 37 and Bird at 59. Hayward, fortunately, defended well and Ducat stayed with him whilst 56 were added without further loss. In all, the stand for the fourth wicket amounted to 77, and Hayward scored 47 without a mistake in just over two hours and a quarter. Ducat was seventh out, at 100, to a catch at point. He made some excellent strokes on the off-side, hit eleven 4s, and batted for a trifle over two hours for his flawless innings of 68. Following his dismissal Smith played vigorous cricket, and was so well supported by Hitch that the eighth wicket added 62 in 25 minutes. Going in for the second time with arrears amounting to 92, Somerset could score only 135. Lewis and Daniell alone did much; the former made 32 in 35 minutes and the latter 36 in 65.
