MINOR COUNTIES COMPETITION.

DEVON v. SURREY 2nd XI.

The side representing Devon against Surrey 2nd XI, at the County Ground, Exeter, in the two days' match, which commenced yesterday, in connection with the Minor Counties Competition, is about the strongest that can be placed in the field. The only notable absentee is Light, one of the ground professionals, who is standing down owing to an injury. This is exceedingly unfortunate for Light, as the match has been put aside for his "benefit."

Until a few days ago it was anticipated that Devon would again have the services of C. V. L. Hoeman this season. But all hope of his assisting the County has been dispelled by the Torquay man commencing his first-class cricket career with Great, the county in which he was born. Not, of course, in playing, but in bowing for the first time, his bowling to date having been very promising. W. F. Start, B. G. Cruwys, and W. Ashford were not in the side originally selected.

The ground was in excellent condition yesterday, but the light was not all that could be desired, and rain threatened during the greater part of the time play was in progress. An excellent wicket had been prepared.

Surrey defeated Dorset on Wednesday and Thursday by about 150 runs, and the visitors included several professionals, one or two of whom had obtained splendid service in first-class cricket.

Surrey won the toss, and opened with Harrison and Gostley, against the bowling of Capt. Hartley, Davies, and Aston, the United Services professional. Runs came so easily it was evident the wicket was not so easy to score on as a casual glance had suggested. After the game had been in progress for some minutes Harrison was very handsomely caught behind the wicket by Davies. The first wicket fell with Davies, 22 runs. Ten minutes later W. Ashford, who had been bowled out by the Devon end, a little later Nott took Hartley's place, but 12 runs were scored off his first over. However, he improved in length in the second style, second wicket when duly taking 34. Gostley being caught by Hartley at point. J. E. Jewell was bowled by Ashford, the following over, when the amateur had only scored one. Twenty additional runs had been registered when Spring, who stamped first ball after the first over, at the pavilion end, and when the game had been in progress a hour-and-a-half. Six runs later the century was signalled. Ratty strongly driving Aston for two. A century superseding Aston by two. In the following over he gave a difficult chance to Hartley, off the off-side when stood at 121 for four wickets.

Ratty and J. E. Jewell continued to bat well when the game was resumed, and the last named eventually reached the half-century. The bowling was entrusted to Hartley and Ashford, but runs came quicker than before the interval. Goatsly, after a good innings for 41, was caught at point by Sturt off Ashford. J. E. Jewell partnered Brooker, and was dismissed by Ashford with only three runs added. Spring had a nasty hit on the knee off Aston's bowling, and was eventually stumped by Davies. A. W. F. Rutty came in next, and the hundred was signalled after an hour and 30 minutes' play. At luncheon, the score was 121 for four wickets. Both batsmen quickly placed fifty runs each to their credit, and Aston, a minute later, bowled Rutty.
