CRICKET.

CHESHIRE v. YORKSHIRE SECOND ELEVEN.

Meeting a cosmopolitan Cheshire team—including three men who have played with other counties—at Bollington, near Macclesfield, yesterday, the Yorkshire Second Eleven found themselves, at the close of the play, with a lead of 32 runs and two wickets in hand on the first innings. This was accomplished in a rather tedious afternoon's cricket, distinguished alone by the good bowling of Broadbent and Richardson on the Yorkshire side, and Mr. Roberts on the Cheshire side.

Rain delayed the start until half-an-hour before lunch, and when Cheshire won the toss they took possession of a wicket which was at first quite lifelike, and which at no time gave much assistance to the bowlers. Bad batting in a measure accounted for the dismissal of the Cheshires in under two hours for 84 runs. They had only 11 runs on the board when Richardson got Mr. Chadwick caught at cover-point by Robinson for four, and the captain, the Rev. W. S. Caldwell retired in Richardson's next over.

At the luncheon interval only 17 runs were on the board for two wickets, and on resuming Broadbent got through the defence of Mr. MacLaren with the total at 31. The outgoing batsman, who is a cousin of the famous Lancastrian, had played correct cricket for 17, which turned out to be Cheshire's top score. Smoker, who succeeded, was out to a smart catch low down by Turner at long-on off Broadbent's bowling. The first 50 was signalled after an hour and a quarter's batting, and was almost immediately followed by the dismissal of Mr. Hunter by Broadbent for five. Mr. Jones, who had been batting very carefully, was next man out for 14, being clean bowled by Richardson, who also, with a catch off his own bowling, captured the wicket of Mr. Turner, who has a reputation for hard hitting, and Broadbent finished off the innings by taking the last three wickets in quick succession.

CRICKET.

**CHESHIRE V. YORKSHIRE
 SECOND XI.**

Owing to the inclement weather there was only a handful of spectators on the Bollington ground on Wednesday when Cheshire met Yorkshire II in connection with the Minor Counties' Championship. Notwithstanding the showers of the morning the ground was in fairly good condition, the creases having been protected by mats. During the past week much interest had been centred in the fixture among the villagers, though when the Cheshire team was first picked there was great disappointment at the non-inclusion of A. S. Turner in the Cheshire team, after his fine display against Manchester University last week, when he made 78 for Bollington. However, owing to an injury to Moorhouse, of Crewe, the local champion's services had to be requisitioned, and Dixon, the local professional, was also selected late to play in place of Mason, of Oxton, injured.

This was Cheshire's first match this season, but the Yorkshiremen had already been in the field, and they brought a very strong team, among them being Hardisty, Rudston, Bates, Broadbent, Dolphin, and Foster. Cheshire were fairly strong, one well known player being the Rev. W. S. Caldwell, formerly of Bollington, who has lately played for Worcester. The Cheshire eleven included only two professionals.

A LATE START.

The match started about two hours late owing to the rain. Cheshire went in first, MacLaren and Chadwick going in to face the somewhat fast bowling of Broadbent and Richardson. The batsmen shaped well at the start, Chadwick holding his wicket steadily, while MacLaren made a boundary with his first stroke, following this up with a cut for two. After a stay of a quarter hour, however, in which time he had made four, Chadwick was caught by Robinson at mid-off, and the Rev. W. S. Caldwell took his place, but after several ineffectual attempts to get the ball away the rev. gentleman was bowled by Richardson without any score. With the score at 17 for two wickets the luncheon interval was taken.

AFTER LUNCH.

On resuming it was seen that there was an appreciable increase in the number of spectators. W. E. Jones took the place of the Rev. Mr Caldwell, and after several attempts lifted a ball from Broadbent to the boundary. A couple of maiden overs followed, the visiting fielders being very smart. A single and a couple from MacLaren were all that the next two overs yielded, but in the following over the bowler's efforts were rewarded, MacLaren's middle stump being upset by a low delivery which dismissed him after scoring 17. Smoker, the professional from New Brighton, took his place at the wicket, but though securing a three off the fourth ball he received, his attempts to hit out were not effective during the next few overs. Jones made a good boundary hit, though missed at long-on, and brought up his score thereby to 10. The batting was very slow, twenty-four overs only yielding 50 runs. Broadbent made an unsuccessful appeal against Smoker, the latter reaching his crease only just in time, but the bowler had his satisfaction shortly afterwards in tempting Smoker to lift a ball into Turner's hands, the New Brighton man being sent to the pavilion after having compiled a half-century. His place was taken by Hunter, who immediately sent the ball into the slips for two. Jones with a long drive sent the ball over the boundary, and

was brought up by Hunter with a hit for three, but that batsman in the next minute was clean bowled by Broadbent. K. J. Shute was next at the wicket, but soon his companion's balls were disturbed by Richardson, the batsman retiring with 14 to his credit. As A. S. Turner took up his place in the crease he was loudly applauded by the spectators, whose enthusiasm grew as he made a boundary with his first ball and a three with the next he received. He then adopted cautious tactics owing to the ball rising badly, but anticipating his intentions the fielders were widely distributed. Turner hit out with spirit and soon brought up his score to sixty, but receiving a high ball from Richardson he sent the ball back to the bowler, and thus brought about his downfall, retiring after adding ten to the score in about as many minutes.

After making eight Shute was caught at square leg by Robinson. Bratby made 10, but Roberts and Dixon failed to add to the score.

YORKSHIRE BATTING.

After an interval the visitors went in to bat, Hardisty and Rudston first handling the willow. Scoring was much faster than in the Cheshire innings, Roberts' bowling being severely punished, but Smoker was more difficult. After a quarter hour's batting Rudston was out leg before after making ten runs. Bates took his place, and off his first ball made a boundary. The score was added to at a good pace, and Turner took the ball from Smoker, but his first ball was sent to the boundary by Bates.

Shortly afterwards Hardisty was caught by Roberts after making 15, and Bates after receiving a nice ball from A. S. Turner was caught by Caldwell for 17. Farrar was dealt with in a similar manner to Hardisty, and Richardson was bowled leg before by Roberts after making four. Turner, who was fourth man in, was now partnered by Tattersall, and the score soon reached 70. Turner tried hard to strike out, but the balls sent to him by Roberts prevented him doing so. He at last, however, had an opportunity, Roberts sending him a high ball, which he sent to mid-off for two. Stanley Turner now left off bowling and immediately caught his namesake, who had made nine. The latter's place was taken by Broadbent, and Hunter took the ball in place of Stanley Turner. The batsmen were unable to get many runs off him, but the score gradually increased until the Cheshire score was passed, and when the score marked ninety Dixon took the place of Hunter as bowler. He was placed to great disadvantage owing to the sun being in his eyes, but he bowled fairly well.
