**Yorkshire Colts.**

Glorious weather prevailed at Shaw Lane on Wednesday and Thursday, on the occasion of the match between Yorkshire 2nd and Durham. Roy Kilner, well-known in local cricket circles, was included in the team. Broadbent, the Sheffield United bowler, and Harrison dismissed Durham for the small score of 48. Both were quite irresistible. Broadbent took seven wickets for 28 runs.

Yorkshire commenced the response with Wilson and Kilner, the Mitchell Main batsman, but the crowd was intensely disappointed when Kilner received his quietus with only one on the score board. Hardisty supplied the innings of the match. He played extremely steady at first, but when he was joined by Hartington the crowd were treated to a brilliant exhibition of batting. Hardisty was the most polished of the two. He obtained complete mastery of the bowling, and it was not until he had reached the century that he was bowled by Morris. Hartington hit lustily for his 79, and he made no serious mistake. The partnership between him and Hardisty realised 132. Yorkshire's innings closed at 301, thus leaving Durham with 253 to get to save the innings defeat.

Notwithstanding the magnificent displays of Hardisty and Hartington, the feature of Wednesday's play was the wonderful bowling of Morris, who in a broiling sun sent down 37 overs of fast bowling. He accomplished the feat of taking all ten wickets at a cost of 13 runs each. A magnificent performance!

Durham fared much better at their second attempt, but could not avert the innings defeat. They totalled 238—15 short of the required number. Broadbent was again amongst the wickets, he claiming six. Full score and bowling analysis are given below.

MORRIS'S GREAT ACHIEVEMENT  
AGAINST YORKSHIRE II.

A. E. WALKER & C. PICKERSGILL  
HIT OUT FOR DURHAM.

POSER FOR DURHAM.

The Yorkshire second eleven and Durham, fresh from their decisive triumphs over Cheshire and Norfolk respectively, met for their return engagement under the auspices of the Minor Counties Cricket Championship. As the result of the day's play, the home county were exceedingly well placed. A number of remarkable achievements was made by the players on both sides. After Durham had fallen to Broadbent and Harrison in 30 overs for 48 runs, Yorkshire stood with six wickets down for 87. Hardisty, however, who has thus far been dead out of form, came to his side's rescue with a splendid century, being well backed up by a fine display of hitting from Hartington.

Alfred Morris, however, distinguished himself by a remarkable bowling feat, his record being the whole ten Yorkshire wickets for 190. He was bowling under a broiling sun for three and a-half hours.

The story of the sad collapse of Durham in the first innings is soon told. Mr. Coulson won the toss, and although the dew had been heavy he could hardly do any other than bat.
