BRIGHT BATTING AT TRENT BRIDGE.

NOTTS. II. AND NORFOLK SCORE NEARLY 600 RUNS IN SIX HOURS.

A good number of spectators at Trent Bridge yesterday thoroughly enjoyed the fine batting of both Notts. II. and Norfolk, who opened their Minor Counties engagement under the pleasantest weather conditions. The wicket was in perfect condition and favoured the batsmen, who, in a couple of innings, collected no fewer than 560 runs in just over six hours—a capital performance. Norfolk took first turn Thursday and Dunning opening to the attack of Barnes and Armstrong. Runs came slowly for a while, and with only 10 on the board Norfolk lost Thurnby, but subsequently Dunning and Stevens hit vigorously, and the century had been passed before Armstrong disturbed Stevens' wicket. With the total at 164 the Rev. G. B. Raikes, the visiting captain, was out for obstruction. Falcon and Birkbeck continued the good work after luncheon, and scored freely till the former got his leg in front of a straight one from Armstrong, the second century having been reached just before his dismissal was brought about. Another wicket was captured with only 9 added, Thurgar's middle stump being disturbed by Godfrey. Birkbeck and Compton afterwards played with the greatest composure, the former making the straggles all round the wicket. Compton played stylish cricket for his 16, and Fulcher put on 13 in a quarter of an hour, but the remaining batsmen were easily disposed of, the innings, which lasted three hours, terminating at a quarter-past three for the final total of 258. Undoubtedly Stevens was the best individual performance. He hit out with much freedom, his chief strokes including a dozen 4's, a 3, and three 2's.

Armstrong and James opened Notts. innings in promising style and knocked out 60 runs in half an hour when the former was caught at cover-point by Falcon. Then Lee joined James, and despite smart work in the field added runs at a good pace, the hundred being telegraphed in fifty-five minutes. James was the next to leave. Notts. were then only 91 short of the Norfolk total with eight wickets in hand. For an hour and half he played fearfully, never giving a chance until he had reached 86, when he skied a ball, which was smartly taken by Dunning. His best hits were thirteen 4's, a 3, and five 2's, and his partnership with Lee produced 107 runs in just under an hour.

Stapleton, C. Turner, Barnes, and Godfrey contributed useful totals, but meanwhile Whyhall was knocking up a big score by free and vigorous hitting all round the wicket. Frequently he was warmly applauded for fine driving and cutting and when a neat catch by Birkbeck sent him back and brought the visitors to a close he received an ovation. He never gave a chance and hit 5, nine 4's, two 3's, and three 2's. Notts. hold a lead of 44. Score—

NORFOLK BEAT NOTTS. II. BY 228 RUNS.

No fewer than 1,000 runs were scored in the encounter between Notts. II. and Norfolk, which ended at Trent Bridge yesterday in the result of the home side by 228 runs, and the aggregate is probably a record for Minor Counties cricket. Undoubtedly the feature of yesterday's play was the magnificent performance of the Norfolk captain, the Rev. G. B. Raikes, at Trent Bridge, who practically won the match for his side.

There was a large attendance when the game was resumed, and the spectators were treated to a further display of the meretricious batting. The Norfolk captain and his partner, Thurnby, were in great form, and a big total was hit up for the first wicket.

Mr. Raikes played dashing cricket, hitting vigorously and with much composure all round the wicket, and was frequently applauded for fine boundary strokes. The hundred went up in less than an hour, and the first wicket partnership realised no fewer than 200 runs in an hour and three-quarters. Thurnby, whose chief strokes were a 6, five 4's, four 3's, and six 2's, being the first to reach century caught by R. H. T. Turner for the excellent total of 74.

With 19 runs added, the dismissal of the Norfolk captain was brought about by Stapleton, and included in his magnificent innings of 186, made in two hours, were thirteen 4's, seven 3's, and three 2's. Stevens also contributed a useful total, whilst Fulcher played magnificently for 85, his chief hits being thirteen 4's, four 3's, and three 2's.

With the total standing at 376 for Notts. Mr. Raikes applied the closure, and Notts. were set the task of getting 330 to win. They started none too well, for with only 37 on Armstrong, who had collected 24, fell to a catch by Dunning, and 4 runs later James was dismissed for 17.

Lee did not survive long, (his half-century having just been passed when he was smartly stumped, and 18 runs later another wicket fell, whilst R. H. T. Turner was out leg before with the total unaltered.

The Notts. batsmen continued to fare disastrously against the capital bowling and fielding of the visitors, and wickets fell cheaply. Warner and Staunton added only 20 to the total, and Godfrey was smartly caught by Birkbeck off the second ball sent down to him by Allsopp, whilst C. Turner also survived only a couple of balls, neither batsman scoring.

Whyhall and Barnes contributed 25 between them, and the whole side was out for 105, leaving Norfolk the victors by 228 runs. Score and analysis—

NORFOLK V. NOTTS SECOND

RAPID SCORING AT TRENT BRIDGE.

A bright day's cricket was witnessed at Trent Bridge yesterday in glorious weather, and at the close of an innings Notts led by 41, their last wicket putting on 45 runs in barely twenty minutes. Both sides were well represented, and Norfolk, who had the good fortune to win the toss, compiled the satisfactory total of 258 as the result of three hours' batting. An even better aggregate at one time appeared probable, for the fourth wicket only fell at the luncheon interval for 164, but subsequently, although the victors hit freely, no one made a prolonged stand. G. A. Stevens, who was the highest scorer for Norfolk, compiled his 66 in just over an hour by delightfully fine cricket, his total including no fewer than twelve fours. Raikes and Falcon, especially the last named, played breezy cricket and, although he was in an hour and three-quarters, Dunning hited stylishly. Of the four Notts bowlers tried, Lee was always the most difficult to play. Notts made a capital start, Armstrong and James, who opened the innings, batting with the greatest confidence, and in barely an hour put on 60 runs before Armstrong was neatly taken at given point. Then followed some of the brightest cricket of the match. James and Lee went for the bowling in the most aggressive fashion, and in a little over an hour increased the total by 107 before James was sought from a short. James's 66, compiled in ninety minutes, included thirteen fours, one three, and five twos. Lee hit seven fours, one three, three twos. Afterwards the attack met with more success until Whywell and Barnes made the last wicket stand, which gave Notts a useful lead. Whywell hit one five and nine fours.

NORFOLK V. NOTTS SECOND

SPLENDID VICTORY FOR THE VISITORS.

RAIKES IN GREAT FORM.

At Trent Bridge yesterday Norfolk gained a brilliant victory over Notts. II. by 208 runs. The visitors outplayed the home side at every point of the game. On Monday Notts scored a lead of 44 runs as the result of an innings apiece, but these were easily wiped out by Raikes and Thurbury. The Norfolk captain hit with great power and fairly dominated the cricket, albeit his partner was not idle. Change after change was tried in the bowling, but the century went up under the hour, and in an hour and three-quarters the total exactly reached 200. Thurbury then left for a capital 74. Raikes was dismissed 19 runs later. His brilliant 126 included nineteen fours, seven threes, and three twos; while Thurbury hit one six, five fours, four threes, and six twos. By this time the Notts bowling was thoroughly worn out, and Stevens, Birkbeck, and Fulcher punished it freely; the last named, whose innings lasted only thirty minutes, claiming no fewer than thirteen fours in his dashing 88. It was a brilliant display on the part of Norfolk, and with the total at 273, scored in three and a-half hours for five wickets, the innings was declared.

Notts had three hours in which to make 202, but against the bowling of Raikes and Alisopp they gave a very feeble display, and in an hour and a-half were all dismissed for 106, Armstrong being top scorer with 24, and only five men getting double figures. Raikes bowled in splendid form, his variations of length completely nonplussing the batsmen. He took seven wickets for 46, and was indeed the hero of the day. A word should be said for the fielding of the visitors, which in the last innings was almost perfect. No chances were missed, some excellent catches were brought off, the two made by Dunning being particularly brilliant.
