Withhre, the champions of the second class counties, enterteined triamorgan at Trowbridge on Monday and Tuesday. The visiturs had previously with all their four championship matches, whiles with the first on the first innings in the only match is had played—Suriey Recond.

The homo captain won the toss, and commenced batting on a rather difficult wicket, while the light was far from good. C. S. Awdry and Roff were the first batsmen, but a disastrous start was made, the latter being run out at five, through an exceedingly smart return by Symonds, while with the score at 11 Awdry was bowled. Newman, who followed, opened with a late cult through the slips for fur, off Nash, and followed with the same struke two balls later, but in the next over he popped up a bail in the slips. R. Awdry opened his account with a beautiful stroke to the boundary, but without adding to his acore he was biwled, and at the same total fellible was stumped, five being down for 34. With Laverton and Milier in play was quiet, ten minutes going by without a run, but then the former got Nash away for two fours, the second being a delightful leg glide. ### CRICKET. Wilts v. Glamorgan.

At Trowbridge on Monday and Tuesday the Wiltshiremen entertained Glamorgan, whom they defeated in the final round of the Miner Counties' Championship last season. The visitors were hardly up to full strength, while Wiltshire have this season lost one of their best batamen, in the person of S. R. Nicholson, who has gone to Canada. The match was watched by a small number of spectators.

Wiltshire batted first, C. S. Awdry and Roff being the first batemen, but a disastrous start was made, the latter being run out at five, through an exceedingly smart return by Symonds, while with the score at 11 Awdry was bowled. When seven Bancroft, who had previously been missed in the deep field by Smart, fielding substitute, was nearly caught by Grant at mid-off, the-ball being too hot to hold. Maxwell ought to have been held in the country twice afterwards, before being bowled for 18. At 38 Elers played forward to Mitchell, the ball removing the balls. Creber was nicely caught by Davenport, running to short leg, and the innings closed for 67, one less than Wiltshire.

Ten runs later Laverton had to retire, and R. Awdry only repeated his performance of the first innings, viz., getting one boundary, and being bowled through playing late. The hope was realised, he bowling Rees with the last ball of the day, the score being 32 for two, leaving the game in a most interesting condition.

Resuming on Tuesday morning, Whittington and Riches made a lengthy stand, both being applanded for pretty strokes. Between them they compiled 97. The visitors passed the Moonrakers' total with six wickets in hand, and won the game amid an earsplitting chorus from a band of paper trumpets played by some of the Welsh team.
