**WILTSHIRE CRICKET.**

**WILTSHIRE V. GLAMORGAN.**

Wiltshire, the champions of the second class counties, entertained Glamorgan at Trowbridge on Monday and Tuesday. The visitors had previously won all their four championship matches, whilst Wiltshire had lost on the first innings in the only match it had played—Bury Second.

The home captain won the toss, and commenced batting on a rather difficult wicket, while the light was far from good. O. S. Awdry and Roff were the first batsmen, but a disastrous start was made, the latter being run out at five, through an exceedingly smart return by Symonds, while with the score at 11 Awdry was bowled. Newman, who followed, opened with a late cut through the slips for 100, off Nash, and followed with the same stroke two balls later, but in the next over he popped up a ball in the slips. R. Awdry opened his account with a beautiful stroke to the boundary, but without adding to his score he was bowled, and at the same total Sellick was stumped. Five being down for 34. With Laverton and Miller in play was quiet, ten minutes going by without a run, but then the former got Nash away for two fours, the second being a delightful leg glide. The captain took fifteen minutes to score, but the first ball he had from Nash disturbed his stumps. Grant was out in a peculiar fashion. He hit a ball hard to cover point which was too hot for Bancroft to hold, the leather going to Maxwell some ten yards away, who held it. Laverton was well caught at the wicket, having contributed a useful 29, in which were five fours. Mitchell was caught first ball, and the innings closed for 68.

Glamorgan had a few minutes batting before lunch, and in the second over on the resumption Newman bowled Riches with a ball that broke back a lot, the score being only four. Riches was caught and bowled by Mitchell. Miller held a ball put up by Rees, and with the next ball Whittington was bowled, four wickets being down for seven runs. Maxwell nearly played on the next ball he received, but he turned round in time to prevent it rolling into the wicket, thus robbing Newman of the hat-trick. Arthur had been bowling remarkably well, and at this point his analysis read: 8 overs, 7 maidens, 1 run, 3 wickets. When seven, Bancroft, who had previously been missed in the deep field by Smart, fielding substitute, was nearly caught by Grant at mid-off, the ball being too hot to hold. Maxwell ought to have been held in the country twice afterwards before being bowled for 16. At 36 Elers played forward to Mitchell, the ball removing the balls. Creber was nicely caught by Davenport, running to short leg, and the innings closed for 67, one less than Wiltshire.

At ten minutes to four the champions commenced their second venture, but the start was again a poor one, O. Awdry being out with two on the board. Newman and Sellick, however, settled down nicely, scoring freely, each finding the boundary by pretty strokes. Forty-eight runs were put on in thirty minutes, the Moonrakers being 50 on, when Newman was bowled. Ten runs later Laverton had to retire, and R. Awdry only repeated his performance of the first innings, viz., getting one boundary before being bowled through playing late. Sellick left at the same total—64, but Roff scored freely. Miller was bowled in attempting a big hit, and Davenport gave a return to the bowler, being held at the second attempt high up. With Grant in the century was hoisted, but nine wickets were down for 107. Mitchell and Grant hit merrily, the last wicket putting on 28, the innings yielding 135. This left Glamorgan 137 to win.

Just before six the visitors went in again, and Bancroft quickly hit up 16. The first wicket fell at 24, and with the hope of getting another wicket down overnight Laverton went on with his fast ones. The hope was realised, he bowling Rees with the last ball of the day, the score being 32 for two.

When play resumed on Tuesday morning the game was in an interesting state, but the wicket rolled out well, and it was evident that nothing short of a complete collapse on the part of Glamorgan would save the homesters from defeat. Whittington, not out, 13, was joined by Riches, who is regarded as the soundest batsman in Wales. Runs came freely, and at 50 Smith relieved Newman. The fielding of the homesters was exceedingly keen, Roff being especially good, but where there was just a chance the batsmen got a single. Once Whittington was nearly run out. When the batsmen had settled down runs came more quickly, in spite of the fact that several bowling changes were tried, and the 100 went up by means of four byes, the ball passing perilously near Riches' wicket, 68 having been scored in 45 minutes. With 20 added Whittington was captured at the wicket, for a sound 45, marred by a chance, low down in the slips, to R. Awdry, the previous evening. **Wilts v. Glamorgan.**

At Trowbridge on Monday and Tuesday the Wiltshiremen entertained Glamorgan, whom they defeated in the final round of the Minor Counties' Championship last season. The visitors were hardly up to full strength, while Wiltshire have this season lost one of their best batsmen, in the person of S. R. Nicholson, who has gone to Canada. The match was watched by a small number of spectators.

Wiltshire batted first, C. S. Awdry and Roff being the first batsmen, but a disastrous start was made, the latter being run out at five, through an exceedingly smart return by Symonds, while with the score at 11 Awdry was bowled. Newman, who followed, opened with a late out through slips for four, off Nash, and followed with the same stroke two balls later; but in the next over he popped up a ball in the slips. R. Awdry opened his account with a beautiful stroke to the boundary, but without adding to his score he was bowled, and at the same total Sollick was stumped, five being down for 34. With W. Laverton and Miller in play was quiet, ten minutes going by without a run, but then the former got Nash away for two fours, the second being a delightful leg glide. The captain took fifteen minutes to score, but the first ball he had from Nash distributed his stumps. Grant was out in a peculiar fashion. He hit a ball hard to cover-point which was too hot for Bancroft to hold, the leather going to Maxwell, some ten yards away, who held it. Laverton was well caught at the wicket, having contributed a useful 29, in which were five 4's. Mitchell was caught first ball, and the innings closed for 68.

Glamorgan had a few minutes' batting before lunch, and in the second over on the resumption Newman bowled Riches with a ball that broke back a lot, the score being only four. Sweet-Escott was caught and bowled by Mitchell. Miller held a ball put up by Rees, and with the next ball Whittington was bowled, four wickets being down for seven runs. Maxwell nearly played on his first ball, but he turned round in time to prevent it rolling into the wicket, thus robbing Newman of the hat-trick, who had been bowling remarkably well, and at this point his analysis read: 8 overs, 7 maidens, 1 run, 3 wickets. When seven Bancroft, who had previously been missed in the deep field by Smart, fielding substitute, was nearly caught by Grant at mid-off, the ball being too hot to hold. Maxwell ought to have been held in the country twice afterwards, before being bowled for 16. At 38 Elers played forward to Mitchell, the ball removing the balls. Creber was nicely caught by Davenport, running to short leg, and the innings closed for 67, one less than Wiltshire.

At ten minutes to four the champions commenced their second venture, but the start was again a poor one, C. Awdry being out with two on the board. Newman and Sollick, however, settled down well, scoring freely, each finding the boundary by pretty strokes: 48 runs were put on in 30 minutes, the Moonrakers being 50 on, when Newman was bowled. Ten runs later Laverton had to retire, and R. Awdry only repeated his performance of the first innings, viz., getting one boundary, and being bowled through playing late. Sollick left at the same total—64—but Roff scored freely. Miller was bowled in attempting a big hit, and Davenport gave a return to the bowler, being held at the second attempt, high up. With Grant in the century was hoisted, but nine wickets were down for 107. Mitchell and Grant hit merrily, the last wicket putting on 28, the innings yielding 135. This left Glamorgan 137 to win.

Just before six the visitors went in again, and Bancroft quickly hit up 16. The first wicket fell at 24. In the hope of getting another wicket down over night Laverton went on with his fast ones. The hope was realised, he bowling Rees with the last ball of the day, the score being 32 for two, leaving the game in a most interesting condition.

Returning on Tuesday morning, Whittington and Riches made a lengthy stand, both being applauded for pretty strokes. Between them they compiled 97. The visitors passed the Moonrakers' total with six wickets in hand, and won the game amid an ear-splitting chorus from a band of paper trumpets played by some of the Welsh team.
