MINOR COUNTIES' CHAMPIONSHIP.

DEVON v. BERKSHIRE.

Heavy rain during the night made the wicket at the County Ground, Exeter, somewhat soft when Devon yesterday commenced their match with Berkshire in the Minor Counties' Competition. The pitch was unplayable for a time, and there was a delay of half-an-hour in starting the game. Both counties were fairly well represented. When the Devon team was published the previous day there was one vacancy, and this was filled by the inclusion of Capt Basalgette, of Exmouth, who played against Surrey 2nd XI at the Oval. The inability of H. V. J. Wells, W. F. Sturt, and Light-to-play prevented Devon placing their strongest side in the field. Berkshire won the toss, and the game commenced at noon on a difficult batting wicket. Sir Charles Newman was bowled by Hartley in the first over of the match, but Bennett and Collins carried the score to 41, when the last-named was also bowled by the Ottery man. Considering the wicket, runs were scored fairly fast, the first 50 being obtained in less than an hour. Woodburn was caught in the slips by Gerratt at square leg off Waller, the score at this stage being 128 for seven wickets. In the next over Ferryman was given out leg before wicket to Hartley before he had scored. With the following ball the last-named dismissed Simpson. The Ottery amateur was rather unfortunate in not doing the "hat-trick," as Todd, the last man in, knew nothing about the first ball he received, it breaking in and going for byes. A couple of minutes later Todd was caught in the slips by Carroll off Hartley, the visitors' innings being brought to a conclusion a little before half-past 3 for 197. The innings lasted two hours and three-quarters.

Devon commenced their innings with Orchard and Basalgette, the Sidmouth man nicely driving Hawksworth to the boundary in the first over. The Exmouth captain also got the professional well away a minute later. However, when the score had reached 12 Orchard was bowled by Hawksworth with a surprising break. MINOR COUNTIES CHAMPIONSHIP.

DEVON v. BERKSHIRE.

This match in connection with the Minor Counties Championship was commenced at the County Ground, Exeter, yesterday. Previous to this fixture Devon had taken part this season in three games. The first, with Surrey 2nd XI., was drawn, the second won by Surrey 2nd XI., while Devon won the third against Cornwall at Tavistock on Saturday, after an exciting race against time, by five wickets. From the side that defeated Cornwall L. H. Amory, W. E. Sturt, and E. V. Watts were unable to play, their places being taken by Captain Hartley, H. F. Linnell, and Captain Basalgette. The rain overnight had rendered the wicket somewhat heavy, and consequently there was a late start. Devon lost the toss, and G. U. W. Bennett and C. Y. Nepean went in for the visitors against the attack of Captain Hartley and H. F. Linnell. The former took the first over, and Bennett drove the ball for 1, and in the fourth delivery Nepean was clean bowled. Captain Collins then partnered Bennett, and both men halted well. The score went rapidly up, and at 40 Waller replaced Linnell. One run later Collins was dismissed for 14 by Hartley. Captain C. G. Hill then joined Bennett, and after forty minutes' play the visitors had compiled a total of 60.

Later Ashford went on for Waller, and the century had only just been telegraphed when Hill was bowled by Aston for 36, the score being 101 for three. Both batsmen hitting out bravely runs came fast, but just on the luncheon interval Aston captured Brougham's wicket for 17, the total then being 127 for four.

Resuming after luncheon, Bennett, following a couple of overs, was dismissed by one of Hartley's deliveries. He had made 66 in splendid style, without presenting a single chance. Shoosmith and Hawksworth then came together, but the latter before many minutes had passed returned a ball to Aston. The total then stood at 131. With Woodburn and Shoosmith together a capital stand was made, both men hitting freely. Changes were made in the bowling, but the telegraph showed 186 before Woodburn succumbed to a catch by Garrett off Waller. After nearly three hours' play Berks. were all out for 177.

J. B. Orchard and Captain Basalgette opened for Devon, but the first-named's stay was short, he being bowled by Hawksworth for 7. Fifteen minutes of play produced 20 runs for the home county, but at 28 Basalgette was caught in the slips. Shelley got out for a "duck," and Carroll, after contributing 16, was dismissed by Woodburn, the total then being 41. The first ball by Woodburn to Captain Hartley disarranged his wicket, and Davies joined Gerratt. Runs came slowly, although the pro, occasionally sent to the boundary. The innings eventually closed for 106, and Berkshire going in again late in the day, scored 12 for the loss of one wicket.

MINOR COUNTIES CHAMPIONSHIP.

DEVON BADLY BEATEN BY BERKS.

The second and concluding day's play in the Minor Counties' match between Devon and Berks was resumed at the County Ground, Exeter, yesterday. As a result of the first innings on Wednesday Berkshire were 91 runs ahead, and before 11-amps were drawn they had increased that by 12 for the loss of one wicket. The overnight not out, G. Bennett and Capt. Hill, resumed the innings, the attack being started by Aston and W. Ashford (pavilion end). The pair scored rapidly, and the total reached 80 before Bennett was brilliantly caught at first slip by Carroll. H. Brougham joined Hill, and the former quickly obtained a couple as the result of a misfield by Hartley. At 66 Hill was missed at mid-on, and then Brougham placed nicely to the leg boundary. The partnership between Aston and Carroll was broken at 156, Aston getting Nepean caught in the slips. The outgoing batsman had played a splendid innings for 60, which included six 4's and a 3. Hawksworth joined Brougham, and the pair were still together at lunch.

The pair added 28 when Hawksworth was taken behind the wicket. Brougham was clean bowled at 281 by Hartley for a brilliant 138. His innings included nineteen 4's, and his display was almost perfect. The side was eventually dismissed for 368.

Devon, who required 343 to win, commenced their task with F. Orchard and Capt. Basalgette. The latter drove Hawksworth to the boundary and cut Simpson past cover point for 2. The first wicket fell at 34. Basalgette being caught at mid off by Bennett, and 2 runs later F. Carroll played a delivery from Hawksworth into his wicket. J. Shelley then joined Orchard, and the runs came a little faster. Shelley obtained a 4 off Hawksworth, and Orchard placed Woodburn through the slips for 3. The next ball, however, hit Shelley's ball, and Hawksworth captured Major Gerratt's wicket at 64. Orchard continued to play freely, but Davies and Ashford were both bowled without scoring. At 88 Orchard was caught behind the wicket for 84. He had played very cautiously, and his innings included two 4's. Captain Waller sent up the century with a boundary off Hawksworth. LANCASHIRE v. YORKSHIRE.

Played at Manchester on August 1, 2 and 3. SHARP'S BENEFIT.

Lancashire won by an innings and 111 runs.

After some rain during Sunday night this match was opened on a wicket which gave the bowlers some assistance. Runs were very hard to obtain, and during the first day only 248 were made for twelve wickets. The attendance numbered 23,898 and a collection on the ground realised £70 16s. Yorkshire, still without Denton, had first innings, and in just over two hours were dismissed for 103. Three wickets were down for 7, and half the side were out for 31. Only Hirst showed any ability to cope with the attack, and he played very skilfully for 100 minutes: though defending very strongly, he hit eight 4's. Brearley, who made a most welcome re-appearance, and Dean bowled very well. Lancashire lost Hartley before he had scored, but, aided by fortune, Spooner and Tyldesley (J. T.) put on 62 for the second wicket in an hour. Each of the latter was twice missed, and, after Tyldesley had been bowled, Sharp and Spooner added 70 together without being parted, two wickets being down for 145 at the end of the day (Spooner 66 not out). The weather was dull when the game was continued on Tuesday. The pair mentioned stayed together until their stand for the third wicket had realised 99 in 105 minutes. Sharp, who made some fine drives, was then dismissed for 51. Spooner reached three-figures in three hours and three-quarters, and added 63 with Makepeace and 84 with Heap. In Hornby he found a brilliant partner, the pair putting on 123 without being parted, and then, with Spooner reaching 200, the innings was declared with five wickets down. Spooner scored chiefly on the off-side, and although he was missed twice in making his first 14 runs he was seen at his best on Tuesday. During the 370 minutes he was in he hit twenty-one 4's. After the closure rain caused a delay until 5.30, and then Yorkshire, facing a deficit of 292, scored 32 without loss. During the day 11,157 persons paid for admission. Yesterday Rhodes and Wilson were together until 69, when both left. Bates left 2 later, Hirst at 95 and Booth at 119. Myers, missed when 14, scored a valuable 33, and when the match was almost over—9 wickets down for 158—rain caused such a long delay that it seemed not unlikely that the game would be drawn. At length, however, it was found possible to continue, and Lancashire eventually won easily. During the three days 33,874 persons passed through the turnstiles and Sharp is assured of a sum exceeding £2,000. Score and analysis:—
