County Cricket at Hitchin.

HERTFORDSHIRE MEET GLAMORGAN-SHIRE

WITHOUT A FAST BOWLER

AND LOSE BY FIVE WICKETS.

E. L. WRIGHT'S BIG HITTING.

In meeting Glamorganshire for the first time on Wednesday and Thursday in the Minor Counties Championship on the Hitchin town club's ground Hertfordshire were greatly handicapped by Coleman, their fast bowler, not being well enough to play. Coleman is not only the shire's best bowler, but this season he has also been batting as well as anyone else in the eleven, so his loss was very severe. As events proved, the effect of Coleman's enforced absence from his side was quite sufficient to change a likely victory for the home county into a decisive-sounding defeat—although in reality there was very little in the state of the game at the close which was flattering to the Welsh shire, who lost five wickets in getting the 22 runs set them to win, and would probably have had hard work to total 50 had the innings been played out. Hertfordshire lost the game on the first day, in part owing to their unexpected shortness in bowling and partly because of some unsteady batting at a time when steadiness was above all else desirable.

Winning the toss probably gave the visitors a big advantage, as although they scored runs freely before the wicket had been out up they could do very little with any of the Hertfordshire bowlers afterwards. Riches and Whittington scored 56 for the first wicket, and then the former and Bancroft—the famous Rugby full-back—stayed together while 51 more were added. At 107 Shelford, who had previously bowled well without any luck, got rid of Riches, and although Bancroft stayed a considerable time afterwards he and the others had difficulty in making runs. The remaining wickets fell—the 3rd at 118; 4th at 155; 5th at 158; 6th at 161; 7th at 177; 8th at 185; 9th at 186; 10th at 194. The innings was closed by Shelford bringing off a good catch in the long field off Marsh's bowling. The Harpenden amateur's figures were flattering, two of his three victims being out leg-before.

R. C. Grellet and Golding made a fairly good start, and the former played quite the right game on the wicket in going out at Creber, the slow left-hander. At 21 Golding, playing half-heartedly when his partner would have tried for a boundary hit, was well taken at deep mid off. Titchmarsh made a neat stroke or two to leg and then had his wicket shattered by the fast bowler. Cuthbertson came in to see Grellet lose his wicket by foolishly feeling for an offside tempter, and then had his own wicket spread-eagled by Nash, a similar fate befalling Marsh the first ball he received. Meanwhile E. L. Wright, getting nearly all the slow bowling, aroused some enthusiasm by twice lifting the ball through the trees into the field across the "Coachwalk," a feat which he repeated with Anderson in. The last-named played a ball hard on to his wicket at 64, and at this stage, with Harford and Wright in, play ceased for the day, after a long wait caused by a very light rain.

There was a heavy downpour during the night, and on resuming on Thursday Hertfordshire quickly lost the remaining four wickets for the addition of 28 runs. Wright, who added 6 to his overnight score, was caught out for an excellent 30, after which Grellet's 18 was the highest score on the side. Following on 102 in arrear the home county did well for a time, despite the treacherous wicket. Grellet and Golding made 39 together, both being out at this total, the professional being credited with a large proportion of the runs. Titchmarsh improved on his first innings form, and with Cuthbertson, made a useful stand, the Varsity player leaving at 64 and the Royston amateur 2 runs later. Wright and Marsh were together at the luncheon interval, when the total was 70 for four wickets, and afterwards they raised this to 102. Once they were separated the end soon came, further wickets falling at 104, 110, 112, 115 and 124.

Left with only 22 to make, the Glamorganshire captain altered the batting order, with unfortunate results from his point of view, Burton and Shelford bowling with great effect on the broken wicket. Two men were sent back at 5, another at 12 and two when only 1 run was needed to win; but shortly before four o'clock the Welshmen won the game with just half their wickets in hand. The fielding on both sides was very good, Harford at point, Shelford at slip and long-on, Grellet at cover and Titchmarsh at mid-off, all being seen to advantage for the home side.
