CRICKET.

CORNWALL v. BERKSHIRE.

Played at Camborne on Friday in dull weather and before a small gate. The wicket was a bit swampy owing to recent heavy rains. Cornwall won the toss and chose to bat first. W. N. Bickford-Smith and W. Coad opened for Cornwall, but the latter was dismissed after making three. B. S. Whitworth next followed. His innings was of short duration. He was caught in the slips before he had an opportunity of opening his score-sheet. Cornwall had lost two wickets for 13 runs. R. F. Vibart became Bickford-Smith's partner, and these batsmen made a few clever hits. After compiling 11—a six, four, and one—Vibart got out through striking the wicket with his bat. Trevarthen was the next to go in, and his first hit was a nice cut to boundary. Two minutes later he was caught behind the wicket. The score now read 41 with four wickets down. H. Tresawna followed. Bickford-Smith was bowled after making 29. The score was now 47. J. C. Bickford-Smith became Tresawna's partner. Careful cricket now became the order, but Bickford-Smith tried a neat shot, and got caught in the slips after making three. Escott retired, caught in the slips, after one stroke of two runs. Cornwall had now lost seven wickets for 54. Tresawna, who had a long innings but only scored three runs, was neatly bowled when the score sheet read 59. Hawken was run out after making two. Whiting was bowled after making a similar score.

Bennett and Collins opened for the visitors, and faced the bowling of Whiting and Hawken. The batsmen soon settled down, and were hitting the bowlers all over the field, especially Hawken. Whiting was taken off after three overs for Tresawna to take his place, but Hawken was still retained, although the batsmen were treating him unmercifully. Boundary after boundary was secured, and after twenty minutes' play when the score was at 60 Bennett was caught and bowled by Tresawna. Brougham joined Collins, and both scored with the greatest freedom. Boundaries and sixes were the order of the day, and so rapid was the scoring that the century was hoisted after thirty-five minutes' play. A quarter of an hour later Collins reached his 100, and after 62 minutes' play Berkshire's total was 200. After making 122 Collins was caught by Hawken off Trevarthen. Capt. Hill and Shoosmith were both dismissed for no score, and a few minutes later Sir C. P. Nepean for eight. The score was now 221. W. J. Woodburn was caught by Vibart after notching 19. J. C. Bickford-Smith missed catching Brougham when that player had reached about 70. When reaching 82 he was bowled by Hawken. The other players were easily dismissed.

Cornwall opened the second innings disastrously, W. N. Bickford-Smith and A. B. Whitworth being caught and bowled respectively, when the score sheet read two runs. H. Tresawna and Trevarthen were partners, and runs now came fairly freely. Trevarthen was caught after making 21. The score was 31 for 8. W. Coad retired after making five, and Vibart was bowled by Hawksworth when he only reached 12. Cornwall had lost 5 wickets for 54 runs. J. Davies fell before Simpson's bowling when he had scored eight. J. C. Bickford-Smith partnered Tresawna, and runs came more frequently. Hawksworth was taken off for the first time, and Shoosmith put in his stead. Simpson took Woodburn's place. By careful cricket the batsmen soon reached 100. When the telegraph read 112 Bickford-Smith was bowled by Shoosmith, the Helston player having made 26. Scores:—

MINOR COUNTIES CHAMPIONSHIP.

CORNWALL BEATEN BY BERKSHIRE IN A DAY.

At Camborne, yesterday, the home county gave a very disappointing display, doing very badly indeed with bat and ball. Going in first on a difficult wicket they were disposed of in less than two hours for 61 runs. W. N. Bickford-Smith alone being able to deal with any success with the splendid bowling of Hawksworth. It was a painful exhibition for the small crowd of spectators who witnessed the match. Man after man came and went, and Hawksworth finished with the excellent bowling analysis of six wickets for 20 runs. There was a striking contrast between the exhibition of the homesters and that of the visitors. Berkshire batted with remarkable freedom, scoring at the rate of more than three runs a minute, and at the end of an hour the double century was on the board. The first 100 went up after thirty-five minutes, and Collins reached three figures in fifty minutes. The partnership of Collins and Brougham produced 150 runs. They hit all round the wicket, the monotony of boundaries being relieved with an occasional drive out of the ground. Collins batted an hour and ten minutes for his 122, and his contribution included three 6's and twenty 4's. Brougham was ninth man out for 52, and in his score were twelve 4's. Once Collins and W. N. Bickford-Smith, who was put on to bowl, met with great success. The second wicket fell for 210, and only 55 runs were added afterwards, "W.N." getting five wickets for 29 runs.

Cornwall went in a second time 204 runs behind, and in the first over Hawksworth claimed W. N. Bickford-Smith and Whitworth as victims. Trevarthen and Vibart made useful stands, but five wickets were down for 54. Trowsawna, who was first in, and J. C. Bickford-Smith, batted carefully and well, and carried the score from 67 to 112 for the seventh wicket. The other wickets soon fell, and Berkshire won by an innings and 81 runs. Scores:—

MINOR COUNTIES CHAMPIONSHIP

CORNWALL v. BERKSHIRE.

Enthusiasts were greatly disappointed at the form shown by the Cornish eleven in their match with Berkshire at Roukear, Camborne, on Friday. It might be argued that the conditions were such as to minimise the chances of good cricket, but that the circumstances which prevailed applied equally to both team cannot be overlooked. A damp and heavy wicket rendered good bowling almost impossible. Yet the condition of the pitch tested the capabilities of both bowlers and batsmen to a considerable extent. Winning the toss, Cornwall batted first, W. N. Bickford-Smith and Coad facing the bowling of Woodburn and Hawksworth. Play was dull and uninteresting from a spectacular standpoint, Coad having been dismissed for 3. Whitworth went in, only to be caught in the slips for a duck. Two wickets were down for 13 runs. Vihart joined W. N. Bickford-Smith, but the partnership was brief, the former being sent back for striking the wicket. Trevarthen opened with a clean cut to the boundary, but almost immediately he was caught behind the stumps. There is little to be said regarding the form of the remaining players. After accumulating a hard earned 80, W. N. Bickford-Smith was caught out, and a similar fate overtaking Escott, 64 runs were registered for seven wickets, and a disappointing innings ended in a meagre total of 81. Berkshire provided a splendid contrast by making a splendid start with Bennett and Collins, both of whom soon got the measure of the bowling and hit out right merrily. Capt. Collins was especially vigorous, and the score increased with remarkable rapidity, a century being signalled after less than 40 minutes play. In just over an hour Capt. Collins had compiled a century, and with the assistance of Brougham, the score stood at 200. After Capt. Collins had been neatly caught by Hawken for 123, the scoring was not nearly so interesting. Brougham succumbed to what looked like a slow riser from Hawken, after making a capital 82, and an innings, remarkable for its refreshing start and indifferent ending, closed for a total of 265. Cornwall's second innings was quite an improvement, although the commencement was anything but promising. Mention should be made of the splendid stand made by Treawna—who carried his bat through the innings—and J. G. Bickford-Smith, who jointly contributed 65 to a total of 123. Scores:—
