A NEW HAT FOR NASH.

GLAMORGAN'S BOLD BID FOR THE CHAMPIONSHIP.

The match between Glamorgan and Surrey Second XI in connection with the Minor Counties Championship, was commenced at Guildford on Friday, and in it will be decided the question of supremacy in the Minor Counties' record. Glamorgan was fortunate to win the toss, and Whittington and Gibson opened the innings on a wicket favoured by the batsmen. They were opposed by Edwards and Harrison. After lunch the wicket greatly favoured the batsmen. Whittington got up the 70, and immediately afterwards Gibson, when on short of his 50, put up an easy 50ish to 100. Glamorgan called at the close, Symonds playing beautiful strokes, and were eventually out for the highly creditable score of 57. THREE WINS IN A WEEK.

GLAMORGAN'S BRILLIANT FINISH AT GUILDFORD.

The victory of Glamorgan over Surrey Second XI at Guildford on Saturday practically settles the question as to who are the semi-favorites for the second-class counties competition. Glamorgan now are practically certain for their division, whilst the same applies to Yorkshire Second XI, who, by defeating Staffordshire, are champions of the Northern Division.

This means that Glamorgan and Yorkshire Second XI will have to meet in the final.

In the ordinary way there would have been no difficulty in securing this interesting match for Glamorgan—probably at Cardiff. The Glamorgan officials, however, have become somewhat disappointed at the poor support accorded to their recent matches on the Cardiff Arms Park, and the result will probably be that the county will refrain from making an effort to secure the final, in which event the game will probably be played at Lord's.

When N. V. H. Ribbes came into the side Glamorgan started on a winning sequence that has been most commendable. There has been a fall in batting, rather a pronounced one, but N. V. H. Ribbes, T. A. L. Whittington, H. G. Symonds, and Harker have in a measure retrieved past disappointments, and now a glorious victory over a strong second eleven with such well-known players as Gough, Spring, Blackidge, and Harrison in the first-class side has given them exactly 100 per cent. The victories of the present tour were gained against Wiltshire and Gloucestershire some years ago. Hertfordshire, and Surrey Second XI they also defeated. Herefordshire and Carmarthenhire.

Too much praise cannot be given to the Glamorgan trundlers. Nash has been in delightful form, whilst Creber, Maxwell, and Harker have also "caused mischief" with the ball.

Glamorgan, in addition to their first-class fixture with Sussex, have yet to play Wiltshire at Cardiff on August 1, Hertfordshire at Swansea on August 3, and Surrey Second XI at Nash on August 5.

Mason was caught at the wicket, Brooker in attempting a fast run was easily thrown out, and Harrison was leg before. Only Blackidge and Vigar survived, a bowing of Nash, Maxwell, and Creber for any time, and before much Glamorgan had won seven clean wickets. This was a very creditable performance on the part of Glamorgan, and boded materially to keep their position at the head of the table in their section of the Minor Counties' Championship Competition.
