MINOR COUNTIES' CHAMPIONSHIP.

CORNWALL v. DEVON.

The match between Devon and Cornwall in the Minor Counties' Championship was commenced at Truro on Tuesday. The attendance was very small. Cornwall had first knock, but the start was very discouraging, Tresawna, Coad, and Bickford-Smith being dismissed with a total of 16 runs registered. Coad contributed 14 of the 16. Whitworth and Vibart then batted, and whilst the former kept his end the latter made some brilliant strokes. The score stood at 61 when Whitworth was bowled for seven, having stood for three-quarters of an hour. With Prideaux associated, Vibart continued to hit all round the wicket, and he was not out until he had made 85, having contributed three 6's, and twelve 4's. At lunch the total was 193 for five wickets. On resumption, play was slow, and it was not until after three hours' play that the score stood at 200. After an addition of one more run the innings terminated.

The start which Devon made was little better than that made by Cornwall. Harrison was out for three runs, and shortly after Orchard was caught by Vibart from behind the wicket, the score standing at 31. With Light, Carroll, and Shelley out, the total was taken to 75. Two other wickets were quickly put down, seven men being out for 88. Good play by St. Maur, Davies, and Tate raised the score to within one of the home total.

The game was in an interesting position when it was resumed yesterday. An early start was made in the morning, when the not outs (Whitworth and Davies) resumed to the bowling of Aston and Light. Cricket was slow, the batsmen taking no risks. The score gradually rose and a double bowling change was tried, Tate and St. Maur going on, but without success. On Light relieving the latter bowler at the pavilion end, he had Davies caught at the wicket for a useful 28. Vibart, the new comer, after a couple of lucky snicks, should have been easily caught at square-leg by Garratt. The mistake was not an expensive one, for in the next over he was caught just on the boundary behind the screen by Carroll. W. N. Bickford-Smith had a couple of good strokes to the leg boundary, and was completely beaten by Aston, three wickets being down for 62. Tresawna was the new comer, but the cricket continued slow, additions to the score being mostly by singles. Numerous bowling changes were tried, but the batsmen ran no risks. The century was sent up by Tresawna with a three off Shelley, the innings having lasted two hours and 10 minutes. Shortly after Whitworth had his stumps disturbed by Aston for a patient, but useful 43. Tresawna, by attractive cricket, collected 45 when he was bowled by Light, half the side being out for 138.

At lunch the score was 146 for six, but soon after resuming Trevarthen was caught, and at 168 Bickford-Smith was bowled, this player having previously had a ball knock his wicket without removing the balls. The last wicket gave some trouble, Whiting hitting out vigorously. The pair carried the score to 205, when the professional was bowled. This left Devon 205 to win and two hours and a half in which to get the runs. Harrison and Orchard forced the pace, the former going out for boundaries, and the score rose rapidly. Orchard did not stay long. Harrison continued to bat well, but the bowling of Whiting proved too dense, the only batsmen to make any stand being Cruwys, Shelley, Carroll, and Davies. Carroll played a very patient innings for his 33 not out. Davies and Garratt fell to two particularly fine catches by Trevarthen and Vibart respectively. Aston, the last man in, soon asked a ball, which was missed, but shortly after five o'clock he fell a victim to a good ball from Whiting. Cornwall thus won by 64 runs. This is their first win for the season, having previously lost to Devon at Tavistock, and Berkshire at Camborne. Scores:—

**EVEN PLAY AT TRURO.**

This match, in the Minor Counties' Championship, commenced in brilliant weather at Truro yesterday, but before a sparse attendance. Cornwall won the toss, but the start was disastrous, Tressawna, Coad, and Bickford-Smith being disposed of for 18, of which Coad collected 14. Whitworth and Vibart then became associated, and while the former kept up his end the latter hit brilliantly. Various bowling changes were made, but the score was advanced to 61 before Whitworth was bowled for seven, which took him three-quarters of an hour to make. With Pridcaux in Vibart continued to hit, and when he had scored 93 he was beaten by Light. It was a grand innings, marred only by one chance in the long field, and included three 6's and twelve 4's. At lunch the score was 193 for five, and on resuming, cricket was slow. Trevarthen and Davies offered little resistance, but Hawken and Pridcaux made a useful stand, and sent 200 up after three hours' play. The innings terminated soon after for the addition of one run. Light bowled splendidly throughout.

Devon started in none too promising a manner, losing Harrison with only three runs up. Vibart smartly caught Orchard behind the wicket, and three wickets were down for 31. Light had a brief stay, but Carroll and Shelley improved matters, taking the total to 73. Two other wickets fell speedily, seven men being out for 88. St. Maur stopped the rot, and played a faultless innings, and sound play by Davies and Tate enabled Devon to get within one of the home total. Scores and analysis:—

**MINOR COUNTIES CHAMPIONSHIP.**

**CORNWALL WINS RETURN MATCH WITH DEVON.**

The game between Devon and Cornwall, at Truro, was left in an interesting position overnight. On Tuesday each side had completed an innings, Cornwall leading by one run, and in the second innings A. S. Whitworth and Davies had scored eight without loss. An early start was made in the morning, when the hot sun resumed to the bowling of Aston and Light. Cricket was slow, the batsmen taking no risk. The score gradually rose, and a double bowling change was tried. Tate and St. Maur going on, but without success. On Light relieving the latter bowler at the pavilion end he had Davies caught at the wicket for a useful 68. Vibart, the new comer, after a couple of lucky cracks, should have been easily caught as square leg by Garrett. The mistake was not an expensive one, for in the next over he was caught just on the boundary behind the screen by Carroll. W. N. Bickford-Smith had a couple of good strokes, to the leg boundary, and was completely beaten by Aston, three wickets being down for 68. Tressawna was the new comer, but the cricket continued slow, conditions to the score being mostly by singles. Numerous bowling changes were tried, but the batsmen ran no risks. The century was sent up by Tressawna with a three off Shelley, the innings having lasted two hours and ten minutes. Shortly after Whitworth had his stumps disturbed by Aston for a patient but most useful 45. Tressawna by attractive cricket collected 43, when he was bowled by Light, half the side being out for 139. At which the score was 146 for six, but soon after erasing Trevarthen was caught, and at 168 Bickford-Smith was bowled, this player having previously had a bull knock his wicket without removing the ball. The last wicket gave some trouble, Whiting being out vigorously. The pair carried the score to 203, when the professional was bowled. This left Devon 205 to win and two hours and a half in which to get the runs. Harrison and Orchard forced the pace, the former going out for boundaries, and the score rose rapidly. Orchard did not stay long, and Harrison, in making 33, hit eight boundaries and a single. Cruwys made a useful 18, and then wickets soon went down, seven men being out for 90. Carroll and Davies made a fine stand, and carried the score to 133 before the professional was out to a catch on the boundary. The innings closed four runs later, and Cornwall won by 67 runs. WORCESTERSHIRE v. YORKSHIRE.

Played at Worcester on August 4, 5 and 6. Drawn.

With three of the brothers Foster in their side, Worcestershire were well represented in this match, but Yorkshire, journeying from Manchester after their defeat by an innings and over 100 runs, batted during the whole of Thursday, scoring 364 for eight wickets. The foundation of the fine total was laid by Rhodes and Wilson, who made 83 for the first wicket in 65 minutes. Of that number the latter, playing more freely than usual, claimed 52: he hit six 4's. At lunch three wickets were down for 126, and after Hirst's dismissal at 147 Rhodes and Myers added 54 in an hour. Rhodes was in for over three hours and a quarter for 87 and hit a 5 and seven 4's. Myers and Booth put on 50 in 40 minutes and subsequently Haigh, hitting splendidly, made 67 of the last 91 runs in an hour and carried out his bat. Hirst's play was marked by a splendid innings on the part of R. E. Foster, who, making his first appearance for the county for the season, scored 133 by brilliant cricket at a critical time. He went in when two wickets were down for 4 runs and was ninth out, at 209. Therefore he made his 133 out of 265 in three hours and a quarter. He hit a 6, fourteen 4's and three 3's, and put on 49 for the third wicket with Bowley and 101 for the fifth with Arnold. Not a chance marred his innings, which was marked by a great variety of strokes and skilful placing of the ball. Despite his great effort it appeared likely that the follow-on would not be saved as 74 runs were required when the ninth wicket fell. Burrows and Bale, however, were equal to the occasion and in the last 50 minutes of the day added 90 runs without being parted. On the third morning they were separated without addition, Yorkshire accordingly being left with a lead of 113. Going in again, the visitors made 234 with four men out, Wilson, after scoring 50 in an hour, reaching his hundred in 125 minutes. Driving with great power, he hit seventeen 4's and with Bates put on 95; he gave one chance, when 94. Worcestershire were left with 348 to win in three hours, and a draw was always assured. Bowley and Pearson scored 129 in 90 minutes for the first wicket and H. K. Foster was seen to advantage in making 53. Score and analysis:—

ESSEX v NOTTINGHAMSHIRE.

Owing to rain play on the first day of this match was restricted to 55 minutes, during which Essex, who won the toss, scored 37 for the loss of four wickets. There were several interruptions by rain during Friday, but in the time available Essex completed their innings for 212 and got one Nottingham wicket down for a single. Gillingham and McGahey remained together until their stand had realised 77 in 100 minutes. The latter found another partner in Gibson, who helped to add 49 in less than an hour. McGahey did not give a chance in making 89 not out, but it was not the kind of innings the occasion called for, being altogether too slow. At the end of the day Notts opened their innings in a bad light, and lost Riley for a single. On Saturday George Gunn was at once missed in the long-field by Freeman (E.), and the blunder probably cost Essex the game. The two Gunns put on 42 for the fifth wicket, and Iremonger and Lee also made useful scores, but Essex were 49 ahead on the innings. The home team made many blunders in the field, their fielding altogether being very poor. Upon going in again Essex quickly lost their advantage, Iremonger and Riley, bowling unchanged, getting rid of the side in an hour and a-half for 58 on a damaged wicket. This left Notts 108 to win in 100 minutes—a very interesting position, taking the state of the ground into consideration. At the end of 40 minutes five men were out for 31, and a win for Essex appeared highly probable. Alletson, however played a fine game, and in the next 40 minutes obtained 46 out of 66, giving his side the advantage. Lee stayed whilst 9 runs were added, and then, with Oates and Iremonger in, the winning hit was made within three minutes of time.
