NOTTS. II. v. LINCOLNSHIRE.

VISITORS OVERPLAYED.

Play in this match at Trent Bridge was restricted to one day owing to the unsettled state of the weather on Tuesday, and there was scarcely sufficient time to bring it to a definite conclusion. The Notts. second eleven had much the better of it yesterday, however, and entitled themselves to a 60 per cent. pointage by their first innings' advantage.

They obtained first use of an easy-paced wicket, and the first pair of batsmen—Hemingway and Armstrong—made merry at the expense of Cooke and Gibson, who later gave way to Day and Riley. A round 50 had been totalled in half an hour when the professional was cleverly caught and bowled. Lee came next and saw Hemingway make a couple of capital shots behind point which reached the boundary, but the newcomer fell to a catch at mid-off after making a single, the second wicket falling at 61. Joined by Stapleton, Hemingway cut Riley very cleanly to the ropes, and swung the next delivery over his shoulder deep on the leg-side, five runs accruing from the stroke. The amateur passed his 50 when he had been at the crease about an hour, but in the next over he failed to get hold thoroughly of a ball he attempted to drive, and was taken from a simple "skier" at mid-off.

During the earlier association of Stapleton and Whyall—both of whom are wicket-keepers, by the way—the cricket was somewhat slow, and the second 50 took an hour to collect. The fourth wicket had put on 28, (thanks to some productive on-driving by Stapleton, when Whyall was snapped by the stumper, standing close up.

Meantime Brooke, a right-arm, medium-paced bowler, who delivers the ball from well behind the stumps, had relieved Riley, but it was Day who should have secured the next wicket, Stapleton when 29 being let off from a "skier" in the "country." Shortly afterwards Staunton, the Notts. captain, was smartly slumped, half the side being then disposed of for 133, which had been put together in exactly a couple of hours.

Stapleton left seventh out after bailing seventy-five minutes for his 46, a large proportion of which accrued from drives to the on. The others gave little trouble, and the innings having lasted a little less than two hours and a half, closed at lunch time for the serviceable total of 150.

CLIFTON'S CAPITAL BOWLING.

Lincolnshire, who were first represented at the wickets by the Rev. C. G. Ward and Riley, made an indifferent start, the professional slaying one for the wicket-keeper to run back and catch when only eight had been scored, while for an addition of nine Ward and Day were sent back, Clifton taking all three wickets before a run had been made off his bowling.

The visitors continued to fare badly, having six wickets down for 30, but Thompson and Geeson managed to put a bit of stiffening into the batting and carried the aggregate to 48, when the first bowling change was made, G. Wain relieving Barnes.

The separation was brought about from the other end, however, Thompson leaving for obstructing Clifton when the seventh wicket partnership had added 22 in half an hour.

Brooke showed some useful vigour on the off side of the wicket, and a final stand between Gibson and Geeson enabled the visitors to make a fairly respectable show after all. Even so they could only aggregate 81, which left them in a deficiency of 69.

Notts. started their second innings in a very bad light, and one felt sorry for Hemingway when he upped the third ball of the first over into the hands of the stumper. Three runs had then been scored, and Broughton got rid of Lee and Armstrong with slow deliveries that broke the width of the wicket for an addition of 22. Stapleton and Whyall, showing more enterprise, rattled up a further 17, and upon the dismissal of the former the innings was declared closed, leaving the visitors the impossible task of obtaining 112 runs to win in rather less than an hour.

The Lincolnshire batsmen again showed with uncertainty against the fast bowling of Clifton, but some dogged play by Broughton and Cooke placed defeat out of the question, the visitors being 75 behind, with five wickets in hand, when stumps were pulled up. Clifton came out with the fine record of 10 wickets for 54 runs, and that on a pitch which was too slow to suit him exactly. Barnes, too, bowled capital, but without much luck; while the Lincolnshire attack was steady, Broughton mixing them up with pussling effect during the second innings of the home side. The Notts. second team are worthy of infinitely more generous support than they had yesterday. Score:—

Only one day's play was possible in the Nottingham v. Lincolnshire match at Trent Bridge, but that was sufficient to show the Lincolnshire batting in a none too favourable light, for the batsmen made a very poor show against the Nottingham trundlers.

A day's rain on Tuesday prevented any play, so that the match resolved itself into a tussle for points on the first innings result, though Nottingham were, as events proved, so completely masters of the situation that there was a slight possibility they might claim the full complement.

150 all out was not a formidable task on paper for Lincolnshire to commence to overcome, but they failed badly before the bowling, and were all out for 81, so that they could not come nearer than 69 off the home side's performance.

Having thus cheaply disposed of the visitors, for whom the best stands were made by Thompson, Geeson, and Brooke, Nottingham set up a fight for the full five points, and in their second venture took just an off chance, declaring at 42 for four, and leaving Lincolnshire 111 in arrears.

undertaking a great deal of research, which I am far too busy to do, I could not attempt to say. But there are several octogenarian survivors, Surrey claiming three in Caffyn and Sherman, who are 82, and Lawrence, who has been settled many years in Australia, 81. If Heartfield, of the same county, is alive, he will be 87. Joseph Wells, of Kent, the father of Mr. H. G. Wells, the novelist, will be 82 next month; he it was who took four wickets with consecutive balls against Sussex at Brighton in 1862. Another Kent player, W. H. Fryer, was 81 last March.

"VETERANS" AND THE GAME.

Mr. Pelham Warner was rather right when he laid down the dictum that well-preserved physique meant a much longer career in big cricket than was commonly understood of the theorists. No sooner had Rugby and Oxford spoken than instances of rejuvenescence recurred at every turn. This was the retort in substance for those who would be rating "mid-thirty or forty men" as veterans. The Triangular Tests of 1912 were in the minds of the "shelving" fraternity. Tom Hayward came out with a great innings at once; then followed demonstrations of the retention of bowling skill by George Hirst and sundry other bowlers of his years or thereabouts. The fallacy of the critics was universally exposed. Mr. Archie MacLaren has wrought another bolt for their discomfiture. He discovered again the glorious power of his game, the lightning sympathy between an unerring eye and a tremendous wrist that no other Harrovian of our time possessed to such a classical degree—we are forgetting neither Mr. W. H. Patterson nor Mr. F. S. Jackson. It is nice to see the early triumphs of youth; it is well to see the old guard go on to the end of its normal tether, getting heaps of runs or many wickets, and maintaining activity in the field and holding the catches.—The Observer.

ESSEX v. SURREY. Played at Leyton on June 2, 3 and 4. Surrey won by three wickets.

Two hours' heavy rain in the morning had affected the pitch, and Essex certainly gained no advantage by winning the toss. They might have done better had they put Surrey in, but certain it is that not one captain in a hundred would have done so. Weak batting had a good deal to do with the poor total by Essex, only Gillingham and the cousins Gibson playing with much resolution. Smith's bowling was very true, and the Surrey fielding was very good indeed, the catches which dismissed Perrin and Gillingham being brilliant. After Harrison had been dismissed without a run, Hobbs and Bird put on 87 together in 57 minutes. Hobbs drove splendidly and hit seven 4's. Spring and Davis continued the good work by adding 69 in 40 minutes, but both players were missed. The last five wickets fell for 48, but Surrey led by 126 on the innings. At the end of the day Mead and Tremlin made 2 runs without loss. On Friday Mead was caught at mid-on with only 5 added, and then the bowlers met with such success that the total was only 86 when the sixth wicket fell. An innings defeat for Essex seemed in store, but at this point McGahey joined Douglas, who had gone in upon the fall of the first wicket and settled down to a strong defensive game. During the first hour he was in he made only 11, but when McGahey joined him the Surrey bowling was mastered. Douglas reached 50 out of 155 in two hours and a-half, and McGahey made the same number in 80 minutes. That the Surrey attack was thoroughly mastered is evident from the fact that Hitch went on with leg-breaks. The stand for the seventh wicket lasted 95 minutes and yielded 125 runs. Douglas took three hours and a-quarter to make 70; he played a slow game and was not seen at his best, but as to the value of his cricket there cannot be two opinions. McGahey made his runs in two hours and hit ten 4's, and after his dismissal Kenneth Gibson and Buckenham put on 51 for the last partnership. Surrey wanted 153 to win, and in the last 105 minutes of the day lost six wickets for 131. Hobbs and Harrison made 76 for the first wicket, and Abel and Smith put on 34 without being separated after six men had been dismissed for 97. On Saturday the pair took the score to 142, when Smith was bowled. With Strudwick in, Abel quickly made the remaining eleven runs, and Surrey won by three wickets.
