Notes: Carmarthenshire won this match by an innings and 107 runs before noon on the second day with only 45 minutes needed by the home side to take the remaining eight Cornwall wickets. One newspaper report described the wicket on the second day as being 'very tricky' after heavy overnight rain. It was Carmarthenshire first win in the Championship [check] and they were to win again against the same opposition the following week. For the winners, there were 2 sixes, 20 fours, ? threes and ? twos in Gravelle's 132, an innings of ? minutes. Howell's 40 contained 7 fours. The two batsmen put on ? runs for the third wickets. For Cornwall, Vibart top scored with 42 which included 3 sixes and 3 fours. The Cornwall second innings total of 29 was the lowest of the season.

CORNWALL'S AMAZING COLLAPSE.

GRAVELLE AND GEE IN FORM.

The two days' match between Carmarthenshire and Cornwall opened on Friday. The heavy downpour of rain of the previous day made the wicket soft. Percy Rees and Ike Evans opened Carmarthenshire's innings, their partnership realising 32 runs. The Llanelly captain was the first to leave, 10 more runs being added before Evans received his marching orders. When Hugh Howell and G. Gravelle became associated the whole complexion of the game was changed so far as Carmarthenshire was concerned. Prior to their arrival runs had been coming at a painfully slow rate, but shortly afterwards things went along merrily, Gravelle, who hails from Kidwelly, punishing the bowlers, and no less than seven were tried, most unmercifully. Carmarthenshire usually put up a miserable fight, but on Friday, thanks chiefly to Gravelle, they gave a very creditable display. The Kidwellyite scored no less than 132 runs before being dismissed by Lewman, his score including 20 fours and 2 sixes. It would be difficult, if not impossible, to recall such an individual score by a member of the Carmarthenshire team. Gravelle occupies a unique position, and merited the ovation accorded to him on his return to the pavilion. Hugh Howell, too, played excellent cricket for his total of 40, which included seven boundary hits. Carmarthenshire were all out for 241, Lewman being the most successful bowler, taking three wickets for ten runs.

Cornwall sent in W. Coad and A. S. Whitworth first, and they faced the bowling of A. P. James and E. Gee. The Llaneloverly bowler, who had several maidens, soon captured two wickets, and Gee captured one, the three being down for 25 runs. When Vibart appeared on the scene, however, Gee was badly punished, and he was relieved by Hugh Howell. With the exception of Cornwall's "stumper," who scored 42 runs, which included 3 sixes and 3 fours, the visiting batsmen made a very indifferent stand. They were all out for 105 runs, Carmarthenshire thus having a big lead at the end of their innings. A. P. James captured five wickets for 18 runs, and Hugh Howell four for 33.

In the second innings Cornwall followed on, scoring 11 runs for two wickets overnight. When play was resumed H. Tresawna and W. Coad faced the bowling of E. Gee and Hugh Howell. The wicket was very tricky, and the batsmen were soon nonplussed. After only one run had been registered Tresawna was dismissed by E. Gee, the Llanelly left-hand bowler, in the first over. Vibart, the Cornwall wicket-keeper, was given out to Gee in the same over before the score had been increased. The visiting stumper made a great hit, the ball being caught by Wheldon on the very brink of the boundary line. It was thought the Carmarthenshire fielder was beyond the boundary when he took the catch, and an appeal was made to the umpire, who, after consulting the fieldsman, adhered to his decision. Gee was proving himself to be almost unplayable, and wickets were falling with remarkable rapidity. After only 45 minutes' play Cornwall were all out for 29 runs, Gee having taken six wickets for 11 runs, and Hugh Howell three for 18. Carmarthenshire thus routed their opponents, who were beaten by an innings and 107 runs.

Carmarthenshire batted first, and were dismissed after three and a half hours' play. Cornwall gave a disappointing display, and the whole side were out for 105. James and Howell bowled in brilliant fashion, but there was no excuse for the visitors cutting up so badly as they did. The only creditable feature of the innings was a steady display of batting by Vibart, whose 42 included a number of excellent strokes, and he did not give a chance. The visitors followed on 136 in arrears, and in the brief period that remained for play lost two wickets for only 11 runs. Forcing the game well, he made the runs in 190 minutes and hit a 6 and eight 4's. Kinnair and Byrne also were seen to advantage, and Baker took out his bat for a serviceable 42. After Derbyshire had lost three wickets for 34, Sale and Cadman added 27 without being separated. One stump was drawn. Matters went much in favour of the home side on Friday, and at the end of the day they were 276 runs on with four wickets in hand. For some time Derbyshire fared badly, the total being only 120 when the ninth wicket fell. Ten runs were then wanted to save the follow-on, and Forester and Humphries, rising to the occasion, put on 57 by vigorous cricket: the former hit a 6 and seven 4's in his plucky and meritorious display. Warwickshire, going in again, made 204 for six wickets before stumps were drawn. Lilley, hitting a 6 and eight 4's, made 67 in 110 minutes, whilst Quaife, batting steadily, was in for nearly two hours and a-half for 60; together they put on 85 for the third wicket. During the innings Morton obtained his 100th wicket of the season. On the third morning the innings closed for 221, leaving Derbyshire 294 to win—a task they never seemed likely to accomplish.
