Brilliantly fine weather favoured this match, which commenced on Bank Holiday on the Dorchester ground.
The Executive of the County Cricket Association had exerted themselves to secure a thoroughly representative eleven for the fixture, and though there were one or two disappointments, notably that of Fowler and W. Harrison, the fast bowler, both of whom were on the injured list, the team was one of the strongest the county has put into the field for some years. Comwall sent up a good side, the only absentees of importance being Dr. Tresawns, who was unable to leave his county, and R. Rogers, who is leaving for South America with the Corinthians for their football tour. The ground was in capital order; both as regards the pitch and the outfield, though the recent rains had made the playing pitch rather difficult. There was a large attendance, between 400 and 500 paying for admission, and the membership of the association was also well represented. The interest in the match was largely increased by the fact that the officers of the Depot were "at home" and entertained a fashionable gathering of guests in a spacious marquee erected by Mr. R. B. Brown. The Dorset captain (Mr. Cecil P. Goodden) won the toss and elected to bat first, sending in Sewell and Harrison to face the deliveres of Hawken and Whiting. Play opened excessively slow, and the bowling was made to appear more difficult than it was. Whiting was undoubtedly sending down good ones and wanted a lot of watching. On Thursday last Hampshire made 344 in four hours and a-half and Lancashire replied with 47 without loss of a wicket. The former were well represented, but the latter lacked the services of Dean, who was absent owing to a chill. Stone, who made 47 with Mead and 98 in 70 minutes with Johnston, batted in excellent style for two hours and hit eight 48: Johnston batted half-an-hour longer and made a 6 and ten 48. The latter was out at 237, and after his departure Sprot, litting freely, made 75 out of 101 in 65 minutes, his brilliant innings including two 68 and nine 48. In the last 35 minutes of the day Lancashire scored 47 without loss. Hampshire quite outplayed the visitors on the second day, and when stumps were drawn were 350 runs on with four wickets in hand. Lancashire's first wicket did not fall until 103, but the good start was not maintained, the last nine wickets adding only 135. William Tyldesley batted well for a couple of hours.

The Hampshire fielding was good, and, curiously, Cowie took the first five wickets and McDonell the last five. Geing in the second time, Hampshire made 253 for six wickets by the end of the day. They owed a very great deal to Mead and Stone, who made 193 for the first wicket in two hours and a-quarter. Neither batsman made a mistake. Stone's chief hits were thirteen 4's, and Mead's a 6 and thirteen 4's. The later players endeavoured to force the game, the consequence being that five more wickets fell for 10 runs in the last 40 minutes. On the third morning 43 runs were added for the loss of two more wickets, and then the innings was declared closed, leaving Lancashire 403 to make in 6ve hours—a truly formidable task. The pitch, fortunately, was in excellent order and the visitors made a good start.
