Torrential rain fell after the close of play on the first day and it caused a ½ hour delay in the start on the second to allow the pitch to dry out. For the winners, Woolley took 10 wickets in the match for 52 runs, including 6 for 21 in the Cornwall first innings. There ? fours in Gordon's 69. For the losers, Whiting took 14 wickets in the match for 102 runs, with 7-82 in the first innings and 7 for 20 in the second. W N Bickford-Smith top-scored with 35.

MINOR COUNTIES' CHAMPIONSHIP.

DORSET V. CORNWALL.—VICTORY FOR DORSET.
 Brilliantly fine weather favoured this match, which commenced on Bank Holiday on the Dorchester ground. The Executive of the County Cricket Association had exerted themselves to secure a thoroughly representative eleven for the fixture, and though there were one or two disappointments, notably that of Fowler and W. Harrison, the fast bowler, both of whom were on the injured list, the team was one of the strongest the county has put into the field for some years. Cornwall sent up a good side, the only absentees of importance being Dr. Tresawna, who was unable to leave his county, and R. Rogers, who is leaving for South America with the Corinthians for their football tour. The ground was in capital order; both as regards the pitch and the outfield, though the recent rains had made the playing pitch rather difficult. There was a large attendance, between 400 and 500 paying for admission, and the membership of the association was also well represented. The interest in the match was largely increased by the fact that the officers of the Depot were "at home" and entertained a fashionable gathering of guests in a spacious marquee erected by Mr. R. B. Brown. The Dorset captain (Mr. Cecil P. Goodden) won the toss and elected to bat first, sending in Sewell and Harrison to face the deliveries of Hawken and Whiting. Play opened excessively slow, and the bowling was made to appear more difficult than it was. Whiting was undoubtedly sending down good ones and wanted a lot of watching. None of the batsmen met with much success at the start, but Harrison got into double figures before he was cleverly caught by Hawken off Whiting. It was not till Gordon came in that the spectators found the cricket interesting, and the way the old Wellington boy treated the bowling was delightful to watch. He displayed great freedom and played all round the wicket with perfect style, once hitting the ball to the cemetery wall for six. At lunch time Gordon was still in, but to show the slowness of

the scoring during the morning the century had not been reached when the players went in. Gordon's partner at the time was D. J. B. Webb, who rendered invaluable service to his side by a careful and good innings. After lunch Gordon and Webb resumed the batting, and the former hit with greater brilliancy than ever, and was not dismissed till he was caught in two minds and clean bowled by Whiting. Gordon was lucky in being badly missed in the long field both by Tresawna and Bickford-Smith, but these were the only blemishes in one of the brightest exhibitions seen in local cricket for some time. Webb's total was 37, and though the old Middlesex man was less free in his hitting he kept his end up at a time when things appeared to be none too promising. The Dorset captain did not stay long, Vibart, who kept wicket splendidly, snapping him off Whiting for 5. Greenhill made things lively for a time, but after some good strokes he was caught by Tresawna. Chester-Master shaped well, but was cleverly caught by Trevarthen. The Rev. W. H. Arundell, who had been batting with his usual soundness, and had been in a considerable time for his 20, was the last wicket to fall. Woolley, the "not out," retiring without having a ball. The Dorset innings totalled 207, and at one time it seemed as if the home aggregate would have been a good deal more. The Cornwall captain (H. Tresawna) went in first with W. N. Bickford-Smith to face the bowling of Sewell and Cummins. After a few overs the latter gave way to Gordon, but the fast deliveries of the latter met with no success. The Cornish innings started well enough, and the two batsmen appeared to be settling down when the captain was bowled by Sewell for 12. But it was when Woolley went on in place of the Old Weymouthian that the troubles of the visitors commenced. The Dorchester pro. was bowling exceedingly well, and the Cornishmen had great difficulty in timing him. Woolley, after a maiden, clean bowled Coad for 7 and followed this up with holding a hot return from Vibart, the Cornish big hitter. This disaster for the visitors was followed by an even worse loss, W. N. Bickford-Smith, who had knocked up 35, pulling one of Cummins, who brought off a brilliant catch. No one could score off Woolley, who secured three more wickets before stumps were drawn, his five wickets having been secured at a cost of only four runs. The Dorchester man was warmly congratulated on his fine performance. The Dorset fielding was wonderfully keen and nothing was given away.

Owing to the torrential rain that fell shortly after the close of play the previous night, the start was delayed for half an hour on Tuesday morning, play commencing at 11.30, and had not the ends of the wicket been covered during the night play would not have been possible until lunch time. Continuing their innings Cornwall managed to save the follow on by one run, this being in a great measure due to a useful score of 23 by J. C. Bickford-Smith. Woolley had the splendid analysis of six wickets for 21 runs, and it is noteworthy that of the 18 overs bowled by him ten were maidens. On going in to bat a second time the Dorset team found run-getting a matter of difficulty, and against some excellent bowling by Whiting, supported by keen fielding, they were dismissed for the poor total of 90. The chief scorer was the Rev. Arundell, whose 26 was obtained by stylish cricket. F. C. F. Williams and C. P. Goodden also played well for 17 each. Whiting claimed seven wickets at a cost of but 20 runs. Cornwall were thus left with 190 for victory. Tresawna and W. N. Bickford-Smith were the first pair of batsmen, and the bowlers were Woolley and Sewell.

They kept an excellent length, and it was very seldom that the batsmen could get the ball past the fieldmen. Crickton proceeded at a slow pace, and as no wicket fell Gordon relieved Sewell. After a partnership lasting over an hour Tresawna was well caught by Goodden off Woolley's bowling, and then Sewell, who had resumed, bowled W. N. Bickford-Smith. Then wickets fell cheaply, and before half-past five the Cornishmen were all out, and having just topped the century by one, and Dorset had won handsomely by 88 runs. Sewell and Woolley bowled well with four wickets each for 28 and 31 runs respectively, and the fielding of the Dorset team was smart and clean. The full scores and bowling analyses were as follows:—

DORSET v. CORNWALL.

VISITORS IN A BAD POSITION.

This match opened at Dorchester yesterday in brilliant weather and before a large gathering. Dorset were without Fowler, who is on the injured list, while Cornwall were without Dr. Treasna, who could not get away. Winning the toss, Goodden, the Dorset captain, elected to bat first, and sent in Sewell and Harrison to the bowling of Hawken and Whiting. The batting was exceptionally slow. A GREAT PERFORMANCE.

Lancashire won by five wickets.

On Thursday last Hampshire made 344 in four hours and a-half and Lancashire replied with 47 without loss of a wicket. The former were well represented, but the latter lacked the services of Dean, who was absent owing to a chill. Stone, who made 47 with Mead and 98 in 70 minutes with Johnston, batted in excellent style for two hours and hit eight 4's: Johnston batted half-an-hour longer and made a 6 and ten 4's. The latter was out at 237, and after his departure Sprot, hitting freely, made 75 out of 101 in 65 minutes, his brilliant innings including two 6's and nine 4's. In the last 35 minutes of the day Lancashire scored 47 without loss. Hampshire quite outplayed the visitors on the second day, and when stumps were drawn were 350 runs on with four wickets in hand. Lancashire's first wicket did not fall until 103, but the good start was not maintained, the last nine wickets adding only 135. William Tyldesley batted well for a couple of hours. The Hampshire fielding was good, and, curiously, Cowie took the first five wickets and McDonnell the last five. Going in the second time, Hampshire made 253 for six wickets by the end of the day. They owed a very great deal to Mead and Stone, who made 193 for the first wicket in two hours and a-quarter. Neither batsman made a mistake. Stone's chief hits were thirteen 4's, and Mead's a 6 and thirteen 4's. The latter players endeavoured to force the game, the consequence being that five more wickets fell for 60 runs in the last 40 minutes. On the third morning 43 runs were added for the loss of two more wickets, and then the innings was declared closed, leaving Lancashire 403 to make in five hours—a truly formidable task. The pitch, fortunately, was in excellent order and the visitors made a good start. Hartley and Tyldesley (W.) scored 100 for the first wicket in an hour, but 18 later Tyldesley (J. T.) was lbw for 11 and at lunch three men were out for 141. Then followed an excellent stand by Sharp and Makepeace, who placed the result beyond doubt by adding 242 together in two hours and 40 minutes. Sharp nearly played-out when 23 and might have been caught in the slips when 70, but he reached three-figures in two hours and, in all, was batting for less than three hours for his 150 in which were a 5 and twenty-two 4's. Makepeace was slower, but his effort was invaluable: he made 50 in 100 minutes and scored his 95 in two hours 50 minutes, hitting ten 4's.
