NORTHERN RIVALS. DURHAM'S EASY WIN.

THACKERAY'S FINE BOWLING FOR DURHAM.

THE NORTHUMBERLAND BATSMEN FIND MORRIS TOO GOOD.

The Minor Counties game between Durham and Northumberland at Chester-le-Street yesterday was left in a most interesting position at the close of play, and excellent sport is promised for to-day.

One of the professionals on each side had a day out. Norbury, for Northumberland, got four wickets for 58 runs, and then put on the best score of the match by compiling 80 in an hour and forty minutes. But the most popular performance of the day was that of Thackeray, who got eight wickets for 40 runs. His bowling and Coulson's fielding were the salvation of the home team, the Durham fielding on the whole being very poor.

The five last Northumberland wickets only yielded 18 runs.

For the fifth year in succession the attendance was a record for the field and the county, the receipts amounting to just over £100.

For the sixth year in succession, at Chester-le-Street, Durham beat Northumberland yesterday in the minor counties competition. In the first innings Northumberland were dismissed very cheaply on an excellent wicket, and Durham went in a second time with a lead of 54 runs, which was increased to 126 before the close of play.

Charlie Adamson and C. Pickersgill, the not outs, made an excellent stand, the City man putting on the fine total of 116 without having given a chance. His hits included two 6s and 16 4s. The pair carried the score from 29 for two to 183 for three. Ashley did not long survive and then Hendren and A. E. Walker, the Darlington man, carried the score from 219 to 305. These were the best stands of the day.

When Thackeray was caught by Richardson, the last man on the home side, Durham were leading by 410 runs. There was a sporting chance that Northumberland might be able to play from 2.40 until 6.30, but the team collapsed utterly, and were all out at a quarter past four for 111 runs, Durham winning by 299 runs.

Norbury, who made the top score on Monday, was out to his first ball, while for the winners Morris got seven wickets for 51 runs. The fielding was not nearly so smart as on Monday, but it was the visitors who specially deteriorated.

In a three hours' occupation of a plumb and fast scoring wicket they certainly did not bat up to expectations in compiling a score three runs short of the second century, an innings in which it need only be said that C. Brooks, C. Y. Adamson, and T. Coulson played good cricket against some very fine bowling and fielding.

Northumberland would have given a very sorry account in response but for a fine betting display by Victor Norbury.
