COUNTY CRICKET.

HEAVY SCORING IN A TAME MATCH AT JESMOND.

BATSMEN THE MASTERS.

At the end of a quiet and uninteresting day's cricket at Jesmond yesterday the Minor Counties match between Northumberland and Cheshire was in a fairly even position. With the home county putting on 219, and Cheshire replying with 70 for two wickets before the close of the day's play, it may be assumed that there will be a full day's cricket to-day.

The weather yesterday was in keeping with the character of the cricket—cold and cheerless. W. G. Davis, who was making his debut in county cricket, opened the innings for the Northumbrians, and until both got set the play was monotonous. Then Victor Norbury opened out to plant the ball all round the field for fours and into the cemetery for a six. He played good cricket before running himself out, and Davis, naturally patient and inclined to risk nothing, gave signs of being a useful man for the county.

After the Northumberland captain, F. W. Gillespie, had gone fourth out at 22 for a good innings of 77, which included a 6 and eleven 4's, there was little that was interesting in the play. The later batsmen went to make runs, to live up the proceedings apparently, and they got themselves out. The home county occupied the wicket for four hours and 10 minutes.

After the start had been delayed half an hour through rain Cheshire made none too good a start, for they lost their captain, Fallows, at 20, and six runs later MacLaren, a cousin of Lancashire's famous "A. C.," was dismissed by a great catch in the slips by George Eley. The detailed score given below is all that need be added of the day's play.

COUNTY CRICKET.

NORTHUMBERLAND BEAT CHESHIRE IN HOLLOW FASHION.

BATTING COLLAPSES.

Northumberland have commenced their Minor Counties cricket season as they did last year with victories over Durham and Cheshire in their first two engagements. Though the Northumbrians deserve every commendation for such achievements, the fact that the batting opposition in each case was not worth the proverbial candle robs the performances of some of the glory that may be put upon them.

Cheshire, after scoring 70 runs for the loss of two wickets overnight against Northumberland's total of 319, went all to bits yesterday, and in the end were defeated by ten wickets. Only two men in the side held out conspicuously as being able to play the bowling, those being Mason (not out 35) and Holland (30) in the first innings. Mason's display was a lesson in patience, for it took him three hours to make his runs, but with wickets falling fast before him he had no other option but to play steadily. His display was faultless, and he hit two sixes, three 3's, and four 2's, while Holland also batted with care in reaching his half century.

By the completion of a single innings, Cheshire found themselves 111 runs behind, and, of course, Mr Gillespie put the visitors in once more. For a time everything went wrong with them. Half the side was out for 43, and as George Eley, who by the way caused three men to play on, continued to bowl with success, the Cheshire score had only reached 75 when the last two men came together. Killick was last in, partnering Moorhouse.

Seeing the utter hopelessness of the situation, the former hit out boldly, and the means justified the end, for the last wicket put on 41 runs in a quarter of an hour. As a consequence Northumberland had to go in again, but Brown and Skinner knocked off the ten runs required to win in the first over, bowled by Groom. The bowling of Eley, Norbury, and Milne was particularly good, and as they were well backed up by the work in the field nothing was given away. Ideal weather conditions prevailed yesterday, and a good crowd watched the closing stages of the game. Scores:—

NORTHUMBERLAND v. CHESHIRE.

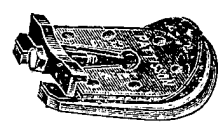
