Lincolnshire made a startlingly poor show against the Suffolk bowling in their second innings of the return engagement at Ipswich, and the result was that the Suffolk men were able to easily reverse the decision of a year ago, and claim a seven wickets victory.

The defeat is one which is to be regretted in that Suffolk are a side we expect Lincolnshire to beat, though it has to be admitted that the last side for various reasons did not go to Ipswich.

But many people in Lincoln, at any rate, are asking why certain players were excluded from the side, and others included. Personally, I think we have more than one Lincolnian, who have recently justified their inclusion for these matches at Ipswich, Luton and Lincoln.

For instance, E. Pullett and R. E. Williams might have been chosen; I will go so far as to say ought to have been, after their consistent displays for the Lindun and during the Lincoln Week.

It cannot be argued with any hope of success that both these men were not worthy of inclusion. Their work against the M.C.C., when they were opposed to bowling as strong as any in the Minor Counties, and probably a good deal stronger, was sufficient proof, while Pullett's 153 not out against such bowlers as Llewellyn, Mead and Collins on Friday and Saturday spoke for itself.

I believe the side against Notts., at Lincoln, on Wednesday and Thursday is already chosen, and I do not know at the time of writing exactly what its constitution is. If these two are not playing, Lincoln supporters of cricket will be greatly disappointed. They most certainly ought to be, whoever stands out.
