BERKSHIRE v. CORNWALL.

**IMPROVED DISPLAY BY THE VISITORS.**  
 Cornwall commenced their return match with Berkshire at Reading yesterday. Berkshire were at full strength, but Cornwall were somewhat weak in batting. A storm broke over the ground at 11.30, and only a quarter of an hour's play was possible before lunch. Winning the toss Cornwall elected to bat first and opened with H. Treawna and W. Bickford-Smith to the bowling of Belcher and Hawksworth. Bickford-Smith got a 4 off the former bowler, and the Cornwall captain made a 5. At lunch the score was 7 for no wicket.

When play resumed, the sun shone brilliantly, and scoring proceeded at very slow pace, 9 runs only being scored in the first twenty minutes. Bickford-Smith gave a difficult chance, and afterwards drove Hawksworth splendidly for 4. Treawna, after making a couple of singles, was mixed badly by Captain Hill of Belcher. Both batsmen displayed caution, and were not to be tempted. Bickford-Smith got three 4's in quick succession off Belcher's bowling. At 2.30 the score was 23 for no wicket.

With the score at 57, Bickford-Smith was caught and bowled by Baker in trying to drive to leg. It was a bad stroke. His 40 included five 4's. W. Coad filled his place, and runs came readily. Coad got four 4's in quick succession, and in one over scored 10 off Woodburn's bowling. Berkshire made many bowling changes, and with the score at 96, Coad, after making 24, was caught by Brougham, the bowler being Hawksworth. Vibart was caught without scoring, as also was Whitworth, and four were down for 96.

The 100 was hoisted after play had been in progress just over two hours, and at that score the fifth wicket fell. Treawna, who batted patiently for 32, being splendidly bowled by Hawksworth. J. Bickford-Smith and Pridoux subsequently made a capital stand, and added 31 runs for the seventh wicket. The innings ultimately closed for 191, Bickford-Smith contributing an excellent 50, his driving being splendid. Hawksworth took six wickets for 76 runs.

Berkshire did not make a very auspicious start, the first two wickets being captured with only 19 runs on the board. Bennett, after being misled by W. Bickford-Smith, fell to a splendid catch by Trevarthen. Bickford-Smith also failed to accept an easy chance from Capt. Collins, before the latter had resolved double figures, but he was dismissed when his score stood at 24. Brougham was run out as the result of some very smart fielding. Cornwall's bowling was keen, Whiting being especially good. At the close of play Berkshire had scored 77 for four wickets, an even state of affairs.

CORNWALL WELL BEATEN BY BERKSHIRE.

The game between Berkshire and Cornwall was resumed at Reading yesterday morning. Berkshire were left to get 90 runs to win and the task was entrusted to Bennett and Capt. Hill. Both opened cautiously. Runs, however, came steadily. Cornwall made several bowling changes, but to no purpose. Subsequently the batsmen drove splendidly, and runs began to come at a quick pace. Captain Hill's driving was distinctly good, and 50 runs were obtained without loss. Berks thus won by ten wickets.

Cornwall's defeat by ten wickets was surprising, considering they led Berks on the first innings. A remarkable bowling performance on the part of Woodburn, in no doubt led to the visitors' collapse. In the second venture he got a great deal of assistance from the wicket, and only W. Bickford-Smith and Coad saved him with any confidence. Altogether Woodburn took six wickets for 28 runs. Trevarthen's analysis in Berkshire's first innings was even more satisfactory. He took six wickets for 21 runs. The feature of the game was Treawna's splendid fielding at extra cover point. Better has never been seen at Reading.

BERKSHIRE v. CORNWALL.

Cornwall commenced their return match with Berkshire at Reading yesterday. Both sides had strong sides in the field, although the visitors were not at full batting strength. A heavy storm broke over the ground in the morning, and only a quarter of an hour's play was possible before lunch. Cornwall won the toss and elected to bat first. Bickford Smith and Tresawna made a good start. Both displayed great caution, but at times Bickford Smith was rather severe on the bowlers. With the score at 57 the latter was caught and bowled by Baker in trying to drive to leg. Bickford Smith's innings of 40 included five 4's, and he batted so well that a faulty stroke was exceedingly rare. With Coad in runs came at a fast pace. The newcomer scored ten in one over off Woodburn's bowling, and the score was carried to 96 before Coad was dismissed, his 24 being an embodiment of bric-a-brac. Both Vibart and Whitworth were dismissed without any addition to the score, Hawkesworth thus securing three wickets in four balls. The hundred was hoisted after play had been in progress two hours, and then Tresawna was splendidly bowled by Hawkesworth after compiling a very patient 32. Subsequently J. Bickford Smith and Prileaux made a capital stand and added 34 for the seventh wicket, whilst the former and Davies later put on 22 runs for the ninth wicket. Ultimately the innings closed for 194 runs. J. Bickford Smith's contribution was 59, and was far and away the best batting effort on the side. Hawkesworth bowled well. Berkshire started none too well, losing two wickets for 19 runs. Bennett was missed by W. Bickford Smith with the score at 7, but with the addition of five runs was splendidly caught by Trevarthen, Captain Collins was also badly missed by W. Bickford Smith, but with 24 to his credit was smartly caught. At the close of play Berkshire had lost four wickets for 77 runs. Score—

CORNWALL v. BERKSHIRE.

COLLAPSE OF THE VISITORS.

Cornwall's defeat at Reading yesterday by ten wickets was very surprising. On Wednesday the Westons scored 194, and by lunch time yesterday had dismissed Berkshire for 189 runs. But in their second venture Cornwall collapsed in a remarkable manner, the whole side being disposed of for a paltry score of 64. Berkshire were thus left with 80 runs to secure victory, and those they obtained without loss, the match being all over at 4.10. Berkshire resumed yesterday with Garnett and Belcher. Early on the former was missed by Prileaux, and this proved very expensive to Cornwall, for Garnett took his score to 68 before he was disposed of. Prileaux's failure to accept the chance of making his side fully 50 runs. Belcher and Nepean were the only two other Berkshire batsmen to make a stand against Cornwall's attack. Trevarthen's batting was really splendid, his analysis of six wickets for 21 runs testifying to the value of his bowling. Special note should also be made of the fielding of Tresawna of extra runs. Certainly finer has not been seen on the Berkshire ground. Cornwall's downfall in the second innings was attributable to a splendid bowling performance on the part of Woodburn and Belcher, who got a great deal of assistance from the wicket. For a time Cornwall seemed likely to make a fight, as W. Bickford-Smith and Coad batted creditably for the second wicket partnership. But after their departure the remainder of the side collapsed, not one man reaching double figures. Woodburn, who got six wickets for 28 runs, made the ball turn a great deal. Scores—
