Heavy rain fell in Exeter yesterday with the result that the Minor Counties' Championship match between Devon and Bucks on the County Ground had to be postponed.

MINOR COUNTIES CHAMPIONSHIP.

DEVON DEFEAT BUCKS ON FIRST INNINGS.

Postponed on account of the rain on Wednesday, this match was commenced at Exeter yesterday. The weather was fine, and there was a good crowd present. The wicket was soft, and favoured the bowlers. Bucks, winning the toss, decided to bat first, and opened strongly, 117 runs being obtained for the loss of only three wickets. Then, however, the batting collapsed, the remaining wickets falling for only 22 runs, leaving a total of 139. Devon opened their innings with J. F. Orchard and J. F. Shelley, and put on 83 runs before the former was beaten. Shelley continued to play very free cricket, and drove Vickerstaff to the boundary, and followed this by hitting him for six, while he also pulled Page to leg for 5. At 75, however, he was brilliantly taken in the slips by Kent for 60. Light and F. H. Carroll carried the score past the century, when the latter fell to a catch by Page, and Light, after a vigorous innings for 36, was caught and bowled by Wright. Seven wickets were down for 142 runs, and cricket was very slow for a considerable time. A two to leg by Davies won applause, and four byes were very welcome. Both Davies and Knight were very careful as to which ball to hit, and eventually the Bucks score was passed when the South Devon professional drove Wright to the boundary. Scoring was faster after this, and the score reached 135 before the innings closed. Bucks went in a second time, and when stumps were drawn had lost seven wickets for 86 runs. DEVONIANS WIN ON FIRST INNINGS.

Play in this match, postponed on account of rain on Wednesday, commenced at Exeter yesterday, the visitors going first to the wicket. Despite the fact that the wicket was decidedly in the bowlers' favour, Leat, Kent, and Orton batted to good account, and only three wickets had fallen when the total reached 117. But the condition of affairs was not to last long, and thanks to the deadly bowling of Light and Knight, the remaining seven wickets fell for the addition of 22 runs, and the Bucks' innings closed for 150, five wickets falling to Knight for 27 runs, while Light took four for 57. Devon did a little better than their opponents, compiling 100 in quick time. Starkey's batting inspired the batsmen to a considerable extent. His, the second wicket, fell for 73, the hard hitter having made 50 by free basing. Light also hit hard. Half-way through the latter county's innings affairs looked serious, as Coates, St. Maur, and Gerrard fell quickly. Davies, however, came to the rescue, and put together 27, the innings closing for 185. Bucks again going to the wicket gave a poor display, and seven wickets had fallen for 51 runs, when play ceased.
