FINE BATTING PERFORMANCES.

The return game between these neighbouring counties opened at Portman Road on Wednesday in superb weather. There was not a very large number of spectators at the outset. The wicket was in good condition. The Suffolk captain succeeded in winning the toss. H. Hassett was provided from playing by an injury to his leg, and his place was filled by F. J. Wood.

K. Bynner and the Rev. F. N. Bird began the batting, to the bowling of Allsopp and G. J. Fulcher. Bynner opened the scoring with a single, and in the same over the Rev. F. N. Bird broke his spell by hitting with a capital cut for a couple. Bynner was disposed of by Fulcher's first ball. One for 3. W. Catchpole opened his account with a single, and followed this by a beautiful stroke to the boundary off Fulcher. Four runs brought up 10. Bird gathered a couple, and followed on with a capital cut for a quartette. Playing in good style, he did the major part of the scoring for a time. Catchpole, after remaining quiet for a time, hit a single off Fulcher. At this stage a smart shower drove the players to shelter, the score then standing at 27 for one.

Shortly after the resumption Catchpole was out very unluckily, playing on to Fulcher off his foot. He had made 8 of the 29 which appeared on the board when the rain came down. Hill-Wood came next, and was contentedly greeted. Stevens continued to play well, and it was not long before 50 appeared. Fulcher was snarely sent back by the Suffolk "keeper," and six wickets were down for 55. Fulcher and Stevens indulged in some free hitting, and the score rose rapidly, and the spirits of the men from Norfolk rose correspondingly. One over of Trudgett's cost 15 runs, and Stevens had now reached his 50. Fulcher was well stunned by Cornell with the score at 90. The Rev. H. P. Steel bowled in stead of Trudgett, and Stevens raised his side's total to 100 with a quartette, his own effort having produced 65. Trudgett failed to hold a catch offered by Gomez Williams. The chance was very difficult, however. A similar incident occurred shortly afterwards. Norfolk started the following which was bowled out in prospect. P. P. Wood was tried vice Steel, and Trudgett again bowled, while K. Bynner tried his hand, and Stevens attempted to Baynor, being caught at the wicket. His five 2's included twelve 4's. When stumps were drawn Norfolk had made 112 for eight.

ANOTHER TRIUMPH FOR SUFFOLK.

When play was continued in the two-day match at Portman Road, Ipswich, on Thursday, the weather was perfect, a gentle breeze tempering the heat. There was but a small number of spectators. On Wednesday Suffolk had completed an innings for 228, and Norfolk had lost eight wickets for 102. Gomez Williams (not out 25) and Allsopp batted to the bowling of K. Bynner and Trudgett. The professional displayed good style, and managed to secure a boundary off his brother "pro." Penfold superseded Bynner. Allsopp repeated his hitting performance at the expense of Trudgett, but at another stage he was sent back by Penfold. Nice for 156. Gibson was last man in Williams, who had started quietly, got Trudgett very prettily through the slips for a brace, and sent Penfold to the boundary. The end came immediately afterwards, Gibson succumbing to Penfold, the aggregate being 176. It will be observed that the net aggregate was given away by the Suffolk "stumper."

The home county entered upon the second venture to the field. The first representatives were the Rev. F. N. Bird and H. L. Wilson, who were opposed by Allsopp and Gibson. In the first over Bird made a single, and the Suffolk captain 5 of Allsopp. Both batsmen displayed attractive style, and runs came fairly freely at both ends. He was treated with some respect by Bynner, who drove him hard for 4. Catchpole lifted the last one of the over somewhat dangerously, but no harm resulted. He was prettily injured by Gibson off Birkbeck for 11. Three for 108. The partnership had yielded 64. F. P. Wood, who had done so well of the previous day, partnered Bynner; but was unfortunately run out when he had made 5. The finding that produced this result was described as a "stumper." A. Early after the resumption Bynner gathered four for a capital shot of Birkbeck, who yielded place to Allsopp a little later. Hill-Wood let out at Gibson, who sent the boundary with a delightful effort. His stay was not prolonged, however, for at 131 he was caught by Baker, whose amazement on the occasion stood in a measure for previous lapses. Bynner was lbw to Gibson at 151 for a well-played 44. His batting had been amongst the noisiest of the match, and

was extremely valuable to his side. Six wickets were now down. Penfold credited himself with a 4-to leg off Gibson soon after his arrival. Another came a couple of minutes later. Two for 140. On Lewis departed at 144, lbw for the second time in the match. The Rev. H. P. Steel took Penfold at 147, the "pro" being bowled by Gibson for 11. DERBYSHIRE v. NOTTINGHAMSHIRE. Played at Blackwell on August 18, 19 and 20.

Drawn.

Rain caused play to be abandoned on the first day at half-past four, but during the time available Notts ran up 230 for six wickets. The feature of the play was the batting of Whysall, a new-comer, who brought off many good strokes in scoring 59 out of 112 in 80 minutes. He hit five 4's, and in partnership with George Gunn made 100 for the first wicket in 70 minutes. Most of his runs were made in front of the wicket, but when 18 he should have been caught at third man by Needham off Warren. The good start was not maintained, for the sixth wicket fell at 173. James Iremonger and Lee then raised the total to 230, and were still together when the rain came down. On Friday the innings closed for 261 after 45 minutes play. Derbyshire lost Needham and Humphries for 7 runs. Curgenvon then went in and played a splendid innings. In 40 minutes he scored 50 out of 67 and in 85 minutes made 101 out of 132. Altogether he made 109 out of 142 in an hour and a-half, hitting six 6's and eleven 4's. His brilliant cricket was not without fault, for he was missed when 23, 87 and 90. Following his dismissal, Root and Oliver added 68 in 35 minutes, and Derbyshire, after batting for three hours and ten minutes, were all out for 246—a very creditable performance. In the last 70 minutes of the day Notts scored 89 for three wickets (Geo. Gunn 61 not out). On Saturday not a ball could be bowled owing to rain. Score and analysis:—

AN INTERESTING POINT.

If the facts may be taken as admitted, the umpire's decision at Bath by which Cox was given out when stumped off a no-ball was deplorably wrong, remarks the Field. It seems to be beyond dispute that the batsman did not touch the ball, but he was dismissed by the umpire as "run out." This means that, although the striker is specially exempted by law 16 from being stumped off a no-ball, the wicket-keeper may get rid of him by going through the action of stumping in all the circumstances which fulfil the definition of stumping (law 23), and may procure an adverse verdict by the simple device of adjusting the indictment and asking "How's that for run out?" or, since the expression "How's that?" covers every conceivable count on which a batsman may be condemned (law 46), that the umpire, on being asked this simple question, must spontaneously bethink himself of this unworthy sophism for defeating the plain intention of the law.

It would seem to follow as an indisputable corollary that a striker whose wicket is broken by a no-ball, though he is not bowled, may be declared to be run out if he has gone out of his ground to hit. On this principle it may someday be contended that, in spite of law 16, no batsman has a right to leave his crease in the act of hitting a no-ball, or even to hit it at all, since by so doing he is interfering with a fieldsman's (the bowler's) attempt to run him out, and is out for obstructing the field (law 30). Yet it is obviously the intention of the law that every facility for punishing a no-ball should be afforded, and it is with this view that the umpire is directed to call the no-ball as soon as it has left the bowler's hand. That the striker must remain in his ground at his own peril when hitting is absolutely novel doctrine, which renders his exemption from the danger of being stumped entirely nugatory, and makes the law ridiculous.

The matter is worthy of serious attention because (1) in the face of the abortive attempt to procure a similar decision on the part of the Kent wicket-keeper at Maidstone in the Northamptonshire match it would appear probable that the umpire at Bath was not taken by surprise, but expressed his deliberate conviction; (2) attempts have been made both in print and in cricket field conversation to justify the quibble; (3) it may be regarded as one of the evil fruits of the thoroughly vicious decision given by the M.C.C. committee when they declared that the striker could be run out by the bowler throwing instead of bowling at his wicket. It is high time that a revision of this ruling and an official declaration of the true law of the case should be obtained.

In this connection it may be pointed out that any tampering with the logic of the laws of cricket may lead to an infinity of undesirable complications. For example, in addition to the aforementioned consequences, as soon as no-ball is called, the wicket-keeper, by the Bath decision, would be exempted from the action of law 42, and would be at liberty to take the ball for the purpose of a run out in front of the wicket, or even to "incommode the striker by any noise or motion." In short, as soon as a no-ball is delivered a state of anarchy ensues, and all law is suspended except martial law in the bowler's favour. The injustice to the striker in all these cases is aggravated if the umpire is slow in calling the no-ball.
