BEDFORDSHIRE v. SUFFOLK.

At Wardown, on Friday, this match was started in pleasant sunshine, but before noon had passed heavy clouds came up from the west. Lightning was visible some time before the rain came, but about half past twelve a torrent descended, and continued to fall until three o'clock. The rain seemed to abate then, but all the damage was done, and the pitch was in a very sad state. It was hoped that the wet would percolate through quickly, but this unfortunately proved not to be the case. Soon after five o'clock, as the turf got no drier, the Beds captain announced that play would be suspended for the day. Suffolk won the toss, and of course, commenced to bat. Wilson and Francis took the wicket to the bowling of Morecom and Grierson. Both batsmen played carefully, but after Morecom had bowled six overs, three of them maidens, and had had six runs registered against him, Orr took up the trundling. Grierson bowled eight overs, three of them maidens, at the cost of seven runs, and then Pilgrim was given a chance. He however, had only got through one over and that a maiden, when rain on causing a cessation. At this point Wilson had made 24, Francis 10, and a bye for four had escaped the wicket keeper's vigilance. Suffolk consequently stood 38 up without the loss of a wicket. Of their runs 17 were scored off the Beds captain's three overs.

Leaving at half-past ten on Saturday morning, Wilson and Francis returned to the wickets, but misfortune soon overtook them. Morecom and Pilgrim were the bowlers. Francis had made but a single when he gave a chance to Leventhorpe off Morecom's bowling, and the Bedfordian took it. The first wicket was down for 46 runs. Wilson fell at 56, having added 11 to his overnight score. Things began to look rosy for the home county at this stage, especially when Bird, after making 10 sent the ball to Leventhorpe, for him to make a smart catch. Raynor was caught by Lyon, and Ireland by Holdstock, with very slight addition to the score. Good as had been the progress made by Bedfordshire towards getting the visitors out, more success was to follow. A very smart catch by Orr accounted for the dismissal of Penfold. Wood was also dismissed by a catch in the slips, Saunders falling down on knees and elbows in seizing the ball. Ball and Holdstock were associated, and the two men attempted a run when Raynor struck Bert's stumps, and although he appeared to be in, the umpire gave him out, and so the loyal stalwart retired also at 53. This unfortunate circumstance was not calculated to set at peace any little attack of the nerves that Ball had got. It was quite evident that Fred had "got 'em," and when he and Morecom were in together he was always on the qui vive to see that no runs

were missed on his account. Two or three defensive hits of his restored his confidence, but it was not long before his dismissal followed that of Holdstock, for he had made but three when Trudgett bowled a "break," and Ball found his leg stump crooked. Jack Lyon followed in, and unfortunately Trudgett quickly got his measure too, and sent him back to the tent without a single to his name. The spectators had hoped against hope that the local lads would come off, but in the Suffolk bowlers they had met captains of attack, and these men proved that club cricket after all is different from county. Perhaps the Beds captain may give them just another trial. Ball tried his best in the second venture, but he needs a little of that patience which distinguished W. E. Thompson's play in the Lincolnshire match. Lyon's time came at a critical period in the game. The first Beds wicket furnished 53 runs; the remainder of the ten (nine wickets) produced only 56. Beds found themselves 14 runs behind.

Cricket is a game of glorious uncertainties. Saturday's play proved that to the full. Suffolk re-started their innings about three o'clock. The outstanding feature of the display was unquestionably that of J. Francis. He actually batted for 53 minutes before he got a run, and eventually carried his bat out for 27! Once he was adjudged to "play the game," and when a few minutes later he "broke his duck," a loud round of applause started up, in acknowledgment of which the Suffolk player lifted his cap. When once a start had been made, the Beds bowlers had it pretty much their own way. One wicket was down for 24, two and three for 29, four for 30, five for 53, six for 58, seven for 63, eight for 75, nine for 80, and the last for 83. Pilgrim carried off honours in bowling, accounting for three batsmen at a cost of 14 runs, Morecom having 36 registered off his bowling for a similar number. Orr took a couple to his credit for 8 runs, and Wharmby one for 10 runs. It was close on five o'clock when the visitors were all dismissed. Tea had to be partaken of, and the clock stood at 5:20 before the first ball was bowled in Bedfordshire's fateful second innings. They required 93 runs to win and stumps were to be drawn at 6.15 at the latest. Orr and Grierson began the innings to the bowling of Trudgett and Penfold, the two Suffolk pros. At 15 the Beds captain retired, and at 19, after Leventhorpe had added 3 and Grierson a single, the latter was smartly caught by Raynor, who was quite a terror in the field. F. Ball was quickly dismissed for a duck, whilst Aphthorp was run out. A similar fate befel Wharmby, Raynor throwing the ball in and knocking down the stumps whilst Wharmby was out. The fielders were all placed on the outskirts to prevent boundaries, and taking advantage of this, Wharmby tapped the ball a couple of yards, and before the astonished Godley could dash forward and secure the leather, he found that the two batsmen had exchanged sniles, smiling broadly at the huge joke they had played. The home team were quite adepts at "short running," whilst if the ball fell between the first and second line of fielders they were almost sure of a couple or three runs. The game was certainly a merry one. The first 50 runs were obtained in 30 minutes, and there remained 41 runs to get in 25 minutes. Leventhorpe and Wharmby had proved valuable bats men to Bedfordshire, whilst Holdstock was proving himself the man of the moment. Time crept on, and each over was felt to be a fateful one. Seconds were lost in men leaving and entering the field. Francis took a little time to loosen his arm for an expensive over as it proved, whilst Trudgett got a blow on the ankle that seemed to cause him some pain. The last over then came, and Bedfordshire wanted to score 13 to win. The total was reduced to 10, then to 6, when two boundaries were all that were required. Trudgett took care they were not obtained, and so the match ended in a win for Suffolk on the first innings, after a most exciting finish. Everybody, including the Suffolk men, felt that another five minutes would have told a different tale. Bedfordshire might then have rejoiced in getting five much-needed points in the Minor Counties' Championship table. The following were the scores at the close of play:—
