GLAMORGAN WON BY 92 RUNS

SWANSEA PRO'S SUCCESS.

MAXWELL SCORES A CENTURY FOR GLAMORGAN.

No corresponding match last year. Glamorgan and Surrey H. met for the second time this season on Friday at South in the Minor Counties' Championship. Glamorgan won the previous match at Goulished by ten wickets. Surrey brought a strong eleven to Wales and was confident of reversing this result. A good deal of interest was taken in the game, which was played in beautiful weather, and the "gate" was evenly a record one. The home eleven was the team led by A. L. Whittington and M. V. H. Hobbs faced the attack of Platt and J. C. Wilkinson. Glamorgan met with early disaster, Norman Hobbs being clean bowled by Platt without a run having been scored. Whittington kept his end up a long time for 12, but R. A. Gibbs and Captain Yates gave him trouble, four wickets going down for 60. Hancock and Maxwell, the Swansea pros, put quite a different complexion on the game by their excellent batting, and both men were going strong at the interval, when Glamorgan had reached 100 for the loss of four wickets. "W" did not stay long afterwards, for he only added a single to his score of 50 when his wicket was taken by Blackidge. Hancock had hit two 6's and four 4's. Maxwell continued to bat splendidly, and, notwithstanding frequent changes in the bowling, he was left with Nash at the bat wicket. He was heartily applauded when he passed 50, and when he reached the century he received a great ovation. At 100 he was caught by J. H. Jewell, of Platt. He had played fine cricket, and only gave one chance. His partners included four 6's and nine 4's, and Glamorgan's venture closed for 188. The visitors tried five bowlers, the most successful being Blackidge, who took five wickets for 55; Platt captured four for 75, and Spring one for 55. Neither C. J. Wilkinson nor Harrison were successful, and 23 runs were knocked off them. The visitors started their first innings at ten minutes past four, and lost five wickets for 51 runs. Gosley and J. H. GLAMORGAN IN THE FINAL

REMARKABLE BOWLING AGAINST SURREY SECONDS AT NEATH.

No corresponding match last year. The splendid victory of Glamorgan over Surrey, scored by 52 runs on Saturday sets at rest all doubts in the mind as to the result of the final of the Minor Counties' Championship. The second day's play at Neath was rendered very interesting at one stage, when J. P. Campbell and H. Hooker troubled the Glamorgan bowlers for a long time, and it appeared that an outstanding Glamorgan's helpful lead on the first day, the visitors were going to make a bid for victory. Campbell was missed when J. H. out, having scored by force to the half-century. Nash found the Glamorgan bowlers fortunate in Surrey's second innings in getting Gosley, who had made a fine run on Friday, dismissed for a "duck." Hooker, bowled magnificently, taking extra wickets for 51 runs. Furry had 22 extra, nearly all leg-bye. They only added 7 to their overnight score, and the first venture against M. runs, Glamorgan, therefore, had a lead of 17 runs on the first morning, the result of capable bowling by Maxwell and Nash. Glamorgan were in a strong position when T. A. L. Wilkinson and N. H. Hobbs again started, and must for a time be very strong. The captain took no runs and was evidently trying to play himself in. Furry, however, started hitting out, but after a couple of boundaries he fell a victim to Platt. Hancock then came in, and resumed matters up. He had a look at the bowler, and hit him for a couple of 6's and a 4 of 4's. Then Harrison retired. The second wicket carried the score to 11, and, although Gibbs, who was playing well, was very shaky at the start, he succeeded in reaching 50 before being caught after the interval. Meanwhile, T. A. L. Whittington had been dismissed for a century played 55. None of the other Glamorgan batsmen gave much trouble, and the innings closed at 10, leaving Surrey Seconds with 208 to get to win. The visitors, however, were all dismissed at ten minutes to five for 113, although, as already stated, J. P. Campbell made a valiant attempt to avoid dismissal, but Hooker was almost unplayable. side by two wickets. On three subsequent occasions he visited this country, taking 138 wickets for the great team of 1882, notwithstanding that owing to a strain his services were not available after August 12th, and 132 for the side which came over two years later. In 1886, by which time he had come on very much as a batsman, he was not up to his previous standard with the ball; still, in addition to scoring 1,028 runs with an average of nineteen in eleven side matches, he took 106 wickets for slightly over twenty-one runs each—figures, however, which enabled Giffen, Spofforth, Garrett and Evans to rank above him in the averages.

As a batsman Palmer was often most useful, but it must be acknowledged that in England he never did quite so well as was expected. One of his earliest successes with the bat was in the great run-getting match at Sydney in February 1882, when Victoria, although scoring 315 and 322, were beaten by an innings and 138 runs: he carried out his bat for 76 in the first innings and in partnership with W. H. Cooper, the big leg-break bowler, who made 29, put on 100 for the last wicket. His highest score in first-class cricket was 113 for Smokers v. Non-Smokers at East Melbourne in March, 1887, and in England 94 v. Yorkshire at Sheffield, in 1886, off the bowling of Bates, Emmett, Peate, Peel, Preston, Ulyett and Wade.

Among Palmer's best performances with the ball in England may be mentioned the following:—
