VANTAGE TO DURHAM

In their first of the two matches of their final tour which commenced at Bowden, Cheshire, yesterday, Durham left off in a splendid position. As matters now stand they are still 23 runs on, and have four of Cheshire's best bats out, so that with fair luck they ought to record their second win over Cheshire, and thus repeat last season's performance. The Bowden wicket was a bit soft owing to heavy dew when the game commenced. Only Wild and Moorhouse made a stand for the home county, the former hitting eight 4's, and the latter five. The Durham players individually, excepting Ashley, did nothing great when batting, but collectively did well, and just failed to reach the second century by two runs, no fewer than eight players recording double figures, the captain alone failing to score. The innings lasted two hours and forty minutes. Apart from a chance off a fast ball, Ashley made no mistakes, his score including three 4's and only nineteen singles. Bewick and Morris each hit a six, the latter being particularly lively, and also getting two 4's and two 3's. Thackeray and he added 32 for the last wicket. Smoker bowled well, and Hunter, in his first three overs, took three for 11, but was hit hard later, both 6's being off his bowling. Cheshire started badly in their second innings, losing Wild and Church in the first two overs, Potter followed at 13, and Blundell at 35.

LORD HAWKE'S VIEWS.

In connection with cricket, as with the theatre, there is a strong tendency to look back upon the past through rose-coloured spectacles. Of this truism I was reminded on reading the interview with Lord Hawke on his fiftieth birthday. In the course of his remarks Lord Hawke said: "We have not the great men of the old school. I look around and I ask myself, Where are the A. G. Steels, the Palarets, and Studds? You will never see another W. G. Grace." As regards W. G. everyone must agree. We cannot hope to see another—but for the rest Lord Hawke's statement is calculated to give young people not well versed in cricket history rather a false impression. I grant that there is no sign at present of a new A. G. Steel, but since Steel's day we have had quite as great a cricketer in F. S. Jackson, and the Studds and Palarets together certainly would not outweigh the Fosters. Of the Studds only C. T. was an England player. G. B. and J. E. K. were not so good as many young amateurs of their own time and ours. L. C. H. Palaret was a fine batsman with a beautiful style, but in my humble opinion he was never so good as Spooner or Hutchings, and not to be compared with Fry or R. E. Foster. R. C. N. Palaret was, I think, nearly as good as his brother at school, but he fractured his knee-cap at football directly he got to Oxford and could not afterwards do himself full justice on the cricket field.

Lord Hawke was on much firmer ground when he spoke of the altered conditions and the effect on cricket of the growing stress of work. If R. E. Foster, Spooner and Bosanquet had been independent men, able every summer, like the Walkers years ago, to give up all their time to the game, amateur cricket to-day would have been vastly stronger than it is. Our deficiency in batting of the highest class has, of course, been much accentuated this season by the unexpected withdrawal from the field of Fry. Lord Hawke ended his interview on a hopeful note, and, though far from optimistic by nature, I think there is good promise for the future. It is difficult to believe that the brilliant school cricketers of this year—with young F. H. Knott at the head of them—will not do something for us.—Mr. S. H. Pardon in *The Sunday Times*.
