DORSET V. CARMARTHEN.—EXCITING FINISH.—This game commenced at Poole on Monday and was notable for the fluctuations experienced in the respective sides' chances. On a dry wicket, but not too good a light, and the absence of screens, the home side ran up the moderate total of 156, in which there was no confident display of batting against James and Gee. The visitors started off much better, but after Sewell had been the means of getting rid of Evans and T. Williams—the latter for a well compiled 46—a lengthy stand was made, and a promising opening concluded with a total of 14 less than the home side. Places were given in the home team to Mason, of Sherborne, and Bolton, of Rosall School, and they both justified their places for their batting, the former being the top scorer. After a bad start the home batsmen recovered to a fair extent, but did not succeed in going much beyond their first attempt. They left the visitors 176 to get to win, and it seemed a certainty for Dorset, the first five wickets falling cheaply. Gravell, after playing himself in steadily, then began to open his shoulders, and hit well all round the wicket. He was missed in the long field when he had reached his half-century. He received valuable assistance from Gee, and the pair ran the score up to within a score of the required runs before they were parted. Gravell forced the game, and with 170 on the board and five minutes to play the game became very exciting. With the next over Gravell reached his century, and with a lovely snick by Davis, and some byes, the total was reached with some two or three minutes to spare. Gravell was unbeaten, and the members of his team shouldered him to the pavilion. Sewell had an excellent analysis for the home team in the first innings. Scores:—

CARMARTHEN COUNTY ELEVEN VISIT DORSET.

VICTORY ON TIME.

GRAVELLE MAKES ANOTHER CENTURY.

The return match between Carmarthenshire and Dorsetshire was played at Fyne on Monday and Tuesday. Carmarthenshire left off on Monday evening in an interesting position, being 41 behind Dorset's 156 with four wickets in hand. Since Monday screens had been procured. The weather was all that could be desired, the sun shining brightly, with a fresh breeze. Gee and Davies resumed, but the former left at 127. C. P. Lewis filled the vacancy, but after scoring 8 was caught by Mason. Almost immediately Davies went leg before for 13. Carmarthen's innings closed for 142, or 14 behind.

When Dorset went in a second time, the batsmen failed repeatedly before exceptionally good bowling. Bolton and Gordon made a temporary stand, but nine men were out for 116. Then Webb and Mason remained together for a long time for the last wicket, and carried the total to 161, before Gravelle bowled Mason, whose left-handed drives had bothered the visitors in the field.

Carmarthen to win had to score 177 in two hours and a half, but the compilation of 50 occupied the first hour. Gravelle, however, was in great batting form and, settling down to vigorous cricket, reached 50 in a little over half an hour. When 74 he broke the bat, and then continued to cut and drive to all parts of the field. Gee lent him every support. Davies joined Gravelle at 158, and the latter continued to treat repeated changes in the bowling in the same relentless fashion. He reached the century two minutes before time, carrying the score to 177, and winning a sensational victory for Carmarthenshire by four wickets. Scores:—

CARMARTHEN'S WIN.

GRAVELLE MAKES A CENTURY.

Play opened at Poole Park on Tuesday morning under improved weather conditions, a beautiful breeze making things more comfortable. Since Monday screens had been procured, and better batting was anticipated. There was again a very small number of spectators. Gee and Davies continued for Carmarthen, who overnight, with four wickets in hand, were 41 runs behind Dorset's total. Gee and Davies were not partners long, fielding preventing more than a single being made. Gee, who hit at almost every ball, gave several chances, and eventually the ball was held by Greenhill. With the total at 127, Lewis replaced him, but after three was caught by Bolton. W. P. Williams went down quickly before Sewell, and the innings closed at noon with Carmarthen 14 behind. Dorset opened badly, Arundel being caught by Davies from the last ball of the first over. Knight was smartly stumped by Davies, but Bolton gave the bowlers considerable trouble until Gee reached the wicket with a tricky ball.

Dorset commenced their second innings with Bolton and Sewell. The latter was leg before to C. Lewis, but his early dismissal was made amends for by a finely compiled 20. Bolton also batted well. The interval came with Dorset 60 for 5. Cummins came to grief immediately after the resumption, being run out when trying to snatch a run. Goodden was clean bowled by James, and Gee cleverly caught Greenhill. Harrison drove straight into James' hands after a strong delivery from the latter. Webb and Mason saved the situation by a fine partnership, the latter's left-handed drives, which puzzled the fieldsmen, were loudly applauded. Dorset were all out at a quarter to four. Their second innings was undoubtedly better cricket than yesterday's performance. They showed more enterprise, which proved a paying game, and very few balls were left. Gee and James again bowled well.

Carmarthen, with two and a half hours in which to beat Dorset's total of 176, took an hour to secure the first 50. Gravelle, however, was in great form, and after opening carefully, settled down to make the score of the match. Twos, threes, and now and again boundaries came off his bat in rapid succession, and he made his 50 in just over half-an-hour. He continued to cut and drive to all parts of the field, Cummins and Gordon being unable to do anything with him. Gee, who had well supported him, gave a high chance when the score stood at 158, and Davies joined Gravelle. The latter reached his century two minutes before time for the drawing of stumps, carrying the score to 177, and winning the match for Carmarthen. His total included 1 five, 5 fours, and 10 threes.

KENT v. SURREY.
Played at the Oval on August 22, 23 and 24.

APTED'S BENEFIT.

Surrey won by 71 runs.

The fact that Kent and Surrey were respectively first and second in the Championship table and that the match had been given to S. Apted as a benefit combined to cause very great interest to centre in the game. On Monday 13,694 persons paid for admission and a collection round the ground amounted to £67. Kent were at full strength, and so were Surrey, except that Knox was unable to play. A few hours' rain in the forenoon made the wicket decidedly difficult, and in 40 minutes Surrey had lost Hobbs, Hayes, Hayward and Ducat for 34 runs. Bird, however, batted splendidly, and Campbell helped him to add 32 and Harrison 59. Cutting, driving and hitting to leg with equal facility, he scored 77 out of 128 in 100 minutes, hitting nine 4's. Carr came out with the best analysis, and bowled even better than his figures would lead one to suppose. Kent, like Surrey, made a bad start, Humphreys and Seymour making only a single between them. Knott and Hutchings, however, pulled the game round by adding 80 for the third wicket in an hour and a-quarter. Then, owing to Bird (who took three wickets for 9 runs), a collapse occurred. He got rid of Hutchings and Woolley with the first two balls he sent down, and a little later bowled Mason for 4. At ten minutes past six bad light caused stumps to be drawn, Kent then having made 136 for six wickets. On Tuesday over 12,000 persons were present at the start: during the day 20,518 paid for admission and a collection on the ground brought in £36 6s. Kent's last four wickets added 35 in 50 minutes, giving the side a lead of 9 on the innings. Kirk took three of the wickets for one run, though his analysis for the innings was three for 19. Hobbs was out for 2 when Surrey went in again, and the total had been taken to 27 without further loss when a shower stopped play. With the ground eased by rain, and the bowlers handicapped by a wet ball, batsmen subsequently did well, 162 being made for five wickets by the end of the day. Hayward made 33 of the first 54 runs by fine cricket in less than an hour, and was well seconded by Hayes, who hit well for 35 and was out at 34. Two other interruptions occurred through rain, but Campbell and Ducat had time in which to add 44 for the fourth wicket, the latter, when play ended with Surrey 153 runs on with half their wickets in hand, being 48 not out. Yesterday, when there was another good attendance, play was continued at the advertised hour although there had been a deal of rain in the night. When Kent took the field it was seen that Carr was an absentee, and it transpired that he had been struck severely on the chin on the previous day by a ball bowled by Smith and had been advised not to continue play. As it happened, his absence did not handicap the side to a great extent for, on a wicket which helped the attack, Blythe and Woolley proved equal to getting down the outstanding wickets for 24 runs in 27 minutes. This left Kent 178 to win—a very heavy task as the wicket was. Against Smith and Kirk a couple of disasters soon happened, both Knott and Seymour being out for 16. Hutchings, playing more carefully than usual, scored 27 before being caught at point, and with Humphreys and Woolley together Bird and Hitch took up the attack. The pair were still in at lunch time, but with only a single added Humphreys was caught low down at cover for a very patient innings of 13. With another run made Woolley was bowled, and only Hooman of the others reached double-figures. Smith took his last four wickets in 21 balls for 4 runs. Score and analysis:—
