CRICKET TOPICS

THE NORWICH WEEK

A VISIT FROM NOTTS PLAYERS.

The bowlers are having a better time than usually falls to their lot in August. Looking at some of the scores, one might imagine that the cricket season was in its infancy, and the turf is even now as green as it was in May. The weather has practically beaten several of the county sides, and it robbed Kent of two days' receipts during the Canterbury festival. We hope the fate will be kinder to the Norfolk County Club this week, as the club treasury is badly in need of funds to meet the extra heavy expenses incurred through the spirit of enterprise which has been associated with the county programme this season. If the weather be duly favourable, this Norwich week, which begins to-day, should be one of the best in the history of the festival. To miss the Norwich week is to lose the best entertainment that cricket affords. There is a charm about the cricket of the week which is not to be found at other times, and even those who do not take their cricket seriously find the gaiety of the occasion an attraction. To this section of the public the presence of the fine band of the 16th Lancers on three afternoons should be an additional inducement to support the festival, and the revival of the theatricals, which were at one time a pleasant feature of the week, should meet with the popular appreciation it deserves.

It is traditional of Norfolk cricket that it is seen at its best during the Norwich Week, and it is no reflection upon the Norfolk eleven and its captain of previous years to say that the present side is composed of desperately keen cricketers, and that they are led by one of the best and most enthusiastic players the County has ever possessed. The present week is the thirtieth of the series, and only one of the twenty-nine previous festivals has Norfolk lost two out of the three matches. Of the 37 matches which have been played, Norfolk has won 48, drawn 27, lost 18, and the remaining match ended in a tie. The tie match was played with Hertis in 1885, and for the first time for many years Hertis do not figure in the programme. The change is due to the fact that Hertis are this season placed in the Southern Section of the Minor Counties Competition. Hertfordshire's place is being filled by Notts II., and they should prove a big attraction. In the early eighteen these two famous Notts players, Shaw and Shrewsbury, brought a team to Norwich, and found the bowling of P. H. Morton and C. Tildard too much for them, and in 1884 a series of Norfolk Gentlemen soundly thrashed the Gentlemen of Notts; whilst some years later William Gunn was seen with a Notts team at Farnmouth. This is, however, the first visit to Norwich of a team from the Notts County Club. There are no fewer than seven professionals in the team captained by the Rev. R. Staggion, and they include a son of the late William Barnes, one of the finest all-round players of his day in England. Clifton and Lee were playing in the first team which beat Essex at Leyton on the stroke of time by three wickets on Saturday; and earlier in the week Clifton was taking Surrey wickets at the Oval. Another of the professionals, Whyatt, recently played a century innings against Bedfordshire, who had Sid Barnes bowling for them.

Notts will be anxious to avenge the defeat they received from Norfolk on the Trent Bridge Ground last month, but if the Norfolk captain is in anything like the form he showed on that occasion they will find the task a difficult one. In the match at Trent Bridge the Rev. G. B. Raikes and W. Thurstby scored 200 for the first wicket, and it is a matter for regret that young Thurstby is not playing this week, but the Castle Rising cricketer is fulfilling a long-standing promise to tour with a team from his old school. E. A. A. Berrisford and M. Falconer will be making their first appearance at Lakesham this season, and G. Williams has been included in the side after his promising debut at Ipswich last week. Cambridgeshire are the middle attraction of the week, and although they have yet to win their first match, it is worthy of note that they have beaten Norfolk at Norwich twice within the last six years. Last season the match was played at Lynn, Norfolk winning by an innings and 47, but at Newmarket Cambridgeshire gained a great triumph, Coulson getting Norfolk out for 28. As at present arranged, at least eight of the eleven playing against Notts to-day will figure in the side against Cambridgeshire, and not many changes may be expected in the third and last match, which is with Bedfordshire. The latter dropped 6 points in matches with Lincolnshire and Suffolk last week, but the inclusion of B. L. Peel materially strengthens their batting, and since Wharmby has apparently lost some of his bowling skill the side has found the presence of A. F. Mircrom very welcome. Bedfordshire have also a useful fast bowler in Pilgrim, who was on the Lord's staff.

Suffolk have had a glorious week of success. They secured 18 points out of a possible 18, and are now second to Yorks with 80 per cent. Norfolk have dropped to 38 per cent., and are now fourth on the list. We shall hope for an improved position after this week's matches. Suffolk lost the toss against Lincolnshire, but

it proved a blessing in disguise, as they had the best of the wicket, and in their matches with Norfolk and Bedfordshire they profited from the success of their captain with the coin. The wicket was worth a good 50 runs to them on Wednesday, and although the infusion of a little more aggression into the Norfolk batting on Thursday afternoon might have been attended with better results, the batsmen were more or less at the mercy of the bowlers on the crumbling pitch. A good deal of the Norfolk batting was disappointing on both days, and Geoffrey Stevens's superb innings was almost the best thing in the match. Frost and Penfold bowled finely, and the Bury professors have enjoyed a fine week, but the success of Raynor came as a pleasant surprise to Suffolk. He did not look a good enough bowler to get seven Norfolk wickets for 35. It is not often that one sees so many brilliant catches taken in the course of a two days' match, and Cornell exalted himself behind the wicket, the only help Norfolk receiving from extras being a couple of leg byes. There was an exciting finish to the match between Suffolk and Bedfordshire at Letch on Saturday, Bedfordshire at the close wanting 7 runs to win with two wickets in hand. It reminds one of Norfolk's experiences against Suffolk and Durham.

The East Norfolk League champions had got together a strong side to meet the Teachers on Saturday, but the latter could not raise more than seven players, and preferred to give the Churchmen a walk-over. Pich and Blagier found a game with the Travellers and Blofield, whilst Norman Stevens, who has failed to do himself justice in the Norfolk team, was seen at his best in making 144 for the County Asylum against Long Stratton. The Y.M.C.A. worked off two league fixtures last week, and after putting up a good fight at Overstrand on Monday they ran Carrow very close. The innings of each side lasted only eighty minutes, and Carrow headed the Y.M.C.A. total by just 11 runs. It might have been even closer, as Lyford was missed first ball. It was about the only mistake the Y.M.C.A. made, and if the catch had been taken the margin between the scores would have been but 5 runs. It was a very creditable achievement on the part of the Y.M.C.A. who had out their strongest side of the season. If Ames could have played more often the Y.M.C.A. would occupy a better position in the table. He is a good all-rounder. Carrow's remaining engagements are with Overstrand and Lowestoft away, and Lowestoft, Dereham, and Teachers at home. It is possible for them to get first honours, as they are only three points behind the leaders, and the Churchmen have played two more matches. The Churchmen's outstanding fixtures are with Dereham, Lowestoft, and Overstrand. The latter visited Lowestoft on Saturday without competition, and after beating the latter in the absence through a fall when running between the wickets at Ipswich on Wednesday—and suffered defeat by the narrow margin of three runs. Carrow's bowling and batting were largely impressive, and it is interesting to note his victory for Lowestoft. Mulharen pursue their winning career in the second division, and look like romping home.
