Match 97 - Did E S Boddy carry his bat in Bucks second innings? I compiled the original notes for this match and there was no reference to the proposed feat which one would have expected given match reports of 20 plus lines. The newspapers checked at my end for Berkshire were the Reading Standard and the Reading Observer, and for Buckinghamshire the South Bucks Free Press and the South Bucks Standard. Is it possible the 'feat' was identified by the CricketArchive computer programme? Whatever the source, I would agree with you in deleting it.

Math 79 - Dorset v Monmouthshire - Was Arundell one of the not out batsmen. There were two different Dorset first innings batting orders in the original I typed which needed to be resolved. The first day score Dorset second innings of 68-4 wickets is confirmed by both the Sportsman and the Western Mail. To resolve the point I think the best thing for me to do is send you copies of some of the original papers. Fortunately I was still using a colour coding system, the last year for which I was. One point at was whether Knight batted third or seventh in the Dorset first innings. The papers should get to you on Tuesday morning.

Keep up the good work. It is encouraging that David has raised these questions,

Tony,

During proof reading, David Harvey has raised a couple of queries:

1. E S Boddy is shown in the list of people who carried their bats but the batting order in match 97 has not been found. I assume he was included on the basis of something in one of the sources but 20 out of 169 is a bit hard to believe.

My instinct is that he did not open the innings in the 2nd innings and therefore that we should remove him from the list of those who carried their bats. Do you agree? Douglas's response was "I can only agree with your instincts. It is all so long ago – eight years since I last re-visited the score – that I recall nothing, but will have recorded what I could at the time. Reference to the North Bucks Times means that I trogged all the way to Milton Keynes. My notes say that all the reports were brief."

2. Match 79 If Arundell was not out with 4 down overnight, he probably did not bat at 7 in the second innings unless somebody retired hurt.

This makes sense but can you resolve? My guess is that the overnight score is correct but the batting order is wrong.

I am just waiting on a final set of comments from David before I submit all changes to Pete to update the draft.

After an idle day on Monday owing to rain the start of this match was delayed on Tuesday until noon and there were a couple of interruptions later. Surrey gained an advantage by winning the toss and late in the afternoon declared—prematurely, as many thought—with eight wickets down for 221, leaving Middlesex an hour in which to bat before stumps were drawn. Hayward was in an hour for 4, but Hobbs scored 59 out of 94 in 95 minutes by faultless and skilful cricket. The best batting of the day was shown by Campbell, who forced the game splendidly and obtained his 55 out of 80 in 50 minutes: he hit two 6's and six 4's in his delightful display. Hayes made his 60 in 135 minutes, but was not seen at his best, though his innings was a most valuable one.
