In their second venture Notte made a better show and put together 135, leaving Lincolnshire to get 146 runs to win. Broughton bowled splendidly, taking five wickets for 28 runs.

The Lincolnshire batsmen could do little with the Notte's bowling yesterday and the whole side was dismissed for 103, Notte thus winning by 62 runs. Clifton again bowled with deadly effect, taking six wickets for 61 while Iremonger captured four for 34. Altogether 12 wickets in the match fell to Clifton for only 89 runs and eight to Iremonger for 85. Brooks made a big effort to secure a win for Lincolnshire, and he was the highest scorer in the second innings with 25 not out. It is somewhat unusual to find a bowler doing such yeoman service with the bat. The fact is a very creditable one to the Ravens' man considering the bowling to which he was opposed.

Tickets are already on sale, and I trust that local cricket secretaries will do all in their power to push them, so that Grimsby may provide the best gate of the season.
