All the other papers give Linnell 4 Ex 7 Total 147 but also give same runs conceded by the bowler.

MINOR COUNTIES' CHAMPIONSHIP  
SUFFOLK v. BEDFORDSHIRE.

At Felixstowe, on Wednesday, this return game opened in delightful weather, and attracted a moderate number of spectators. Bedfordshire were somewhat stronger than in the match at Luton at the end of last week. Capt. Wilson was unable to turn out for Suffolk, and his place was filled by C. M. Blount, who will yield to 'Frustrate' in the encounter with Usamb. on Friday and Saturday. Bedfordshire, winning the toss, elected to bat on a plumb-wicket. Holdstock and B. L. Peel opened the venture to the bowling of P. W. Cobbold and Penfold, runs came slowly at the outset. K. G. Ireland, however, had a few slips. J. F. Ireland superseded Cobbold, who bowled at the outset and Holdstock caused the first to be bowled with a pretty stroke. Paul left at 14 leg-before wicket to Cobbold. Wharmby hit one from Cobbold for 6. The Suffolk holding and bowling were very good, and runs were difficult to obtain. A boundary to Wharmby caused 50 to come up on the board. Penfold let Holdstock off, failing to secure a change of caught and bowled. The Bedfordshire 'two' was nearly finished at 33. H. L. Wilson orr notched a quartette soon after joining Wharmby. Wilson got Grierson to the boundary, and a couple fell to the same hitter, while a single followed next ball. When the home aggregate had been carried to 49, Wilson fell a victim to the wiles of Morcom. C. H. Blount, a member of the Harrow team, captained at Felixstowe, was the new-comer, and he opened his account with a neat three. Pilgrim succeeded Grierson at 53. At Felixstowe on Thursday morning in dul but fine weather the Bedfordshire innings was continued. Overnight it had been secured the loss of one wicket. Wharmby and Holdstock resumed to the bowling of Cobbold and Penfold. The visitors' aggregate had been carried to 48 when a smart stumping feat by C. M. Phillips got rid of Wharmby. E. E. Apthorp came in and early started hitting, and with a fine stroke to leg obtained a boundary. A capital stroke to the on by the same player was similarly productive. **MINOR COUNTIES CHAMPIONSHIP**

**SUFFOLK v. BEDFORDSHIRE.**

As stated last week, this match commenced on Wednesday at Felixstowe, and was continued on Thursday, when Suffolk won the game by four wickets.

Bedfordshire, winning the toss, elected to bat on a plumb wicket. Holdstock and B. L. Peel opened the venture to the bowling of P. W. Cobbold and Penfold. Runs came slowly at the outset. K. G. Ireland gave Peel a life in the slips. J. F. Ireland superseded Cobbold, who bowled at the other end. Holdstock caused the first to be hoisted with a pretty stroke. Wharmby hit one from Cobbold for 6. The Suffolk fielding and bowling were very good, and runs were difficult to obtain. A boundary to Wharmby caused 30 to come up on the board. Penfold let Holdstock off, failing to secure a chance of caught and bowled. The Bedfordshire "pro." was smartly stumped at 32 for 10. H. R. Orr notched a quartetto soon after joining Wharmby. Cobbold very neatly caught and bowled the visitors' captain, the chance being a very hot one. Wharmby hit successive deliveries of Penfold to the boundary. He was imitated by his "skipper." Orr was misced by Cobbold, and signalled his escape by driving Penfold hard for four. At the end of an hour 60 runs had been obtained. Wharmby was missed by Phillips at the wicket. With the total at 89, Orr was well caught by Francois. At the same aggregate, Wharmby was sent back by Raynor. He had made 30 in good style. G. S. Leventhorpe hit out freely. Apthorp completed his side's century with a single, and hit Penfold to the boundary next ball. Apthorp hit four 4's off Raynor from consecutive balls.

After luncheon, Apthorp hit J. Ireland for four. Both batsmen helped themselves to runs, but the rate of progress was not very rapid. Apthorp got in front of a straight one from Cobbold, and had to retire at 155. His 40 included no fewer than seven 4's. H. L. Wilson very nearly succeeded in catching Morcom. T. Saunders made but a moderate stay; he was caught at 166 in hitting out at Penfold. Dr. McLinnell was secured by Blount for nought, and eight wickets were down for 169. Grierson was finely bowled by Penfold at 175, and Pilgrim left ten runs later, the visiting county having established a lead of 185.

H. L. Wilson and J. Francois began the Suffolk innings to the bowling of A. F. Morcom and H. Grierson. Francois was first to take his departure, being clean bowled by Morcom. C. M. Phillips did not stay long; he had obtained four when he succumbed to Grierson. Ireland left at 32, a victim to Morcom. When the home aggregate had been carried to 49, Wilson fell a victim to the wiles of Morcom. Blount's stay was not prolonged, for he had made only three when he was dismissed by Morcom. Half the wickets were now down for 53. K. G. Ireland got Morcom flukily to the pavilion, but did not trouble the scorers very much, for when he had made 5 he was clean bowled by the Bedfordshire amateur. Penfold came in. At 145, Grierson went on for Morcom, the latter having bowled 23 overs running. Penfold was captured in the slips when he had made 10, and after some brisk hitting by P. W. Cobbold and Raynor, the venture finally closed for 163, or 22 in arrears. Raynor, who was out with 44 to his credit, made by some very pretty cricket, was loudly applauded when he returned to the pavilion.

Bedfordshire had fifteen minutes' batting at the close of the day, and compiled 11 for one. K. Raynor securing Dr. McLinnell's wicket with the last ball of the day. Thursday morning opened dull. For Bedfordshire, Wharmby and Holdstock resumed to the bowling of Cobbold and Penfold. The visitors' aggregate had been carried to 18, when a smart stumping feat by C. M. Phillips got rid of Wharmby. E. E. Apthorp came in, and early started hitting, and with a fine stroke to leg obtained a boundary. A capital stroke to the on by the same player was similarly productive. Another quartetto to the amateur was the only notable feature of the next few minutes' play. Apthorp continued to do the bulk of the scoring. Raynor substituted Penfold. Holdstock was caught at this wicket in his first over. Three for 50. A. F. Morcom came next in order. Apthorp succumbed to an excellent catch by Francois off Raynor at 53. B. L. Peel was clean bowled by Raynor at the same total, so that with half the side out Bedfordshire were 75 to the good. Raynor had now taken four for three runs. G. S. Leventhorpe followed in and opened his

account with three to leg, following this up with a quartetto to leg off Raynor. J. F. Ireland took a trial with the ball at 68 in place of Raynor. Morcom got Cobbold prettily to the off for 4, so that the partnership had produced 22 runs. The same batsman drove Cobbold to the pavilion for four. Raynor resumed bowling, and immediately caught and bowled Leventhorpe. Six for 85. H. R. Orr scored a good boundary soon after his advent. The visitors' captain, enjoying some luck, gathered runs quickly, and he brought up 100 with a single. A run later he was taken by Wilson as the result of a mediocre shot. Raynor took T. Saunders' wicket with the aggregate at 164. H. Grierson was content to keep his stumps up while his partner made the runs. The game accordingly grew tedious. Morcom hit out more afterwards. He was bowled by Cobbold at 119. Grierson eventually opened his shoulders to Raynor twice in an over. He treated Cobbold similarly a few minutes afterwards, and the last wicket proved very lucrative. The innings closed at 147, or 159 on.

Grierson replaced Morcom, who went on at the other end. Wilson gave a hard chance in the slips with 10 on the board. The batsmen took every opportunity of running. Wilson was again let off. Phillips and Wilson made a very useful stand, and 42 had been scored in about an hour, when a separation was effected, Wilson being run out. Two for 42. Wharmby relieved Pilgrim with the ball, and was promptly despatched to leg for a couple by J. Ireland. The batsmen were playing confidently, and runs accrued with fair rapidity. The visitors' "skipper" took a turn at bowling. This proved remunerative for the homesters who hit out finely. Ireland was first to leave. Morcom getting him caught at the wicket at 95. A. K. Watson joined Phillips, who caused 100 to be signalled, and just afterwards he completed his 50, a very valuable innings. Watson made some good shots, but at 124 he was unluckily caught at the wicket off his glove. K. Raynor soon bused himself, and he was closely pursued by Phillips, who continued to display excellent form. Wharmby dropped Phillips rather badly. The batsman was defeated by Morcom next ball, however, and so five batsmen were out for 142. Raynor left at this total, caught at point, and finally the Rev. F. N. Bird made the winning stroke.
