A new test match in connection with the Minor Counties Championship was opened at the St. Clew... The first match between Cornwall and Carmarthen... The match was a very close one, with the visitors leading by a single wicket... The game was without incident until Coad drove... The score was now Cornwall 40 for three... Coad's contribution was 15, Vibart during this period having put on 11 runs...

Cornwall and Carmarthen opened the return two days' match at Penzance on Thursday. Winning the toss, Cornwall took first knock. Gee removed Whitworth's bails with his second ball (1 for 0), and W. N. Bickford-Smith scored 14 off James in one over, but in his next James had his revenge, removing Smith's off stump with a beauty (two for 18). Coad and Vibart carried the score to 40, when Coad returned one to Gee (three for 40). Hain and Vibart played with confidence, and 80 went up in seventy five minutes. Vibart hit Gravell right out of the ground for 6, and was then caught behind the wicket for a well got 45 (four for 114). Tresawna joined Hain, who reached his half-century before lunch. On resuming, the first ball disposed of Tresawna (five for 147), and the next five batsmen carried the score to 218. Carmarthen opened with Evans and Howell, and after a quarter of an hour's play for 8 runs W. N. Bickford-Smith at slip picked up a sharp one from Howell, and two balls later brought off a similar catch at the other end, removing Ike Evans (two for 8). With 101 scored for six wickets, rain stopped play.

A full and exciting day's cricket was witnessed on Friday. Gee and Davies continued the visitors' innings on a soft and rapidly drying wicket, and runs came steadily till Trevarthen took the ball from Williams, and with the score at 31 bowled Davies. Four runs later Gee fell to a brilliant catch at square leg by Hain, who, falling full length, got the ball just off the ground, and without any addition to the score Trevarthen clean bowled Lewis and Williams.

Cornwall, with a lead of 83, opened their second innings at 12.15. W. N. Bickford-Smith was badly nussed from a skier to mid-on before he had scored, and then severely punished the bowling, but lost Tresawna at 28. With Coad in the score mounted rapidly, Bickford-Smith hitting freely, but when he had made 47 he was run out in attempting an impossible run, Lockyer stopping a smart drive, and the wicket falling with both batsmen in the middle of the crease. Before the second wicket fell Cornwall had a lead of 150 with nine wickets in hand, and were practically in an impregnable position, but a further blunder by the batsmen threw away Vibart's wicket before he had scored, the busy wicket-keeper upsetting the umpire in his effort to beat the ball. The second and third wickets fell at 76. Coad left at 77, Hain and J. C. Bickford-Smith at 85, and Whitworth at 89. Trevarthen, who was missed in the slips, played sound cricket, but the innings closed at 114, leaving Carmarthen 198 to get to win, 3 1/2 hours remaining for play.

Evans and Williams, the first pair, played with extreme caution, and ten was hoisted after 20 minutes' play. Trevarthen relieved Hawken, and with 30 runs on took Evans' off stump, and bowled Williams with a single added. Gravell, the hitter of the side, stepped out to drive Whiting, and was smartly stumped, and Whiting beat James with a beauty. With four men out in one hour for 40, the game had again veered round in Cornwall's favour, and the home side were feeling with rare smartness. The batsmen could not get the ball away, and Lockyer, who had shown fine defence, let out at Whiting, and Whitworth, running round, brought off a brilliant catch in the long field. Five for 31, and with a single added Gee gave a sitter to Hawken at mid-off. Davies and Howell carried the score to 68, when the pro. put one up to J. C. Bickford-Smith, and W. N. Bickford-Smith, who had relieved Trevarthen, clean bowled Howell at 79. Geo. bowling from the pavilion end, removed Whitworth's wicket with his second ball (1 for 0). W. N. Bickford-Smith nearly snicked James for 4 and on drive him for a like number. Coad and Vibart now joined partnership, the former putting James for 4 and 3 in successive balls, while a full pitch he promptly cut or

## COUNTY CRICKET.

### CARMARTHENSHIRE'S COLLAPSE.

#### CORNWALL WIN WELL.

(Last season Cornwall won by an innings and 182 runs).

The return match between Cornwall and Carmarthen opened on Thursday at Penzance in brilliant weather, but the ground had not recovered from heavy rains earlier in the week, and the wicket was on the soft side. Cornwall made four changes from the side which visited Wales, and the batting was strengthened by the inclusion of Hain and Williams. The sun shone brilliantly when the game opened, and the wicket was drying rapidly. Cornwall won the toss and took first innings. James sent down a maiden, and with his fourth ball Gee beat Whitworth without a run on the board. Smith got 14 off James' third over, but the scoring was very slow, Gee having the batsmen in difficulties. Three wickets fell for 40, but Vibert and Hain put on 70 for the next partnership by free hitting. Vibart hit Gee out of the field, but was missed when he had made 20. Hain played stylish cricket, and was well set at lunch. Before lunch the visitors tried four bowlers, but Gee was the only one to trouble the batsmen.

Tresawna was caught off the first ball after lunch, and half the side were out for 157. Hain fell to a fine catch in the long field, having batted for eighty minutes without blemish. With his departure the rate of scoring slackened, and four wickets fell after lunch for the addition of 40. The 200 went up after two and a half hours' play, and the innings closed at 3.30 for 218. James took three wickets for 75, and Gee six for 76.
