MINOR COUNTIES' CHAMPIONSHIP.
BUCKS v. HERTS.

This match, which should have been a two days' fixture, concluded on Friday last, at Wolverton, the match being terminated at 6.30, Bucks losing disastrously by 10 wickets. Hertfordshire batted first, and put together the moderate total of 197, eight of the team reached double figures, Cowley being top-scorer with 42 to his credit. The Bucks fielding was weak, several easy catches being dropped, Page having three men misred off his bowling. Bucks once more exhibited their inability to bat, and they were all out for the patty score of 76, Ross alone doing anything worthy of note. Following on 121 runs in arrears, Bucks did better in their second attempt, scoring 123 runs. Shaw batted well for his runs, and Page (not out 21) and Eyles (22) put together useful scores. Hertfordshire only had to get 8 runs for victory, and these were obtained without loss. Coleman and Burton bowled unchanged in both innings, and each had splendid analyses. Bucks thus lost by 10 wickets, and the home county have yet to register their first point in the competition. Score and bowling analysis:—

MINOR COUNTIES CHAMPIONSHIP.

BUCKS. v. HERTS.

Bucks, who have yet to taste the sweets of victory in county cricket this season, suffered a heavy defeat at Wolverton at the hands of the neighbouring county of Herts. The visitors brought a strong side, and were fortunate in winning the toss, the pitch having been rendered soft by the morning rain. The first three batsmen put on 78 between them, but Coleman, who had a day out, batted brightest and best for 42, which included two sixes over the fence, and three 4's. Going in fourth, he was ninth man out at 193, the innings closing for 197. He and Hurton then demoralised the Bucks. batsmen, and only N. C. L. Ross, with 25, was able to withstand their deliveries to any extent. Bucks. followed on 121 in arrears, and promised well at the start, T. R. Kent and E. A. Shaw putting on 38 for the first wicket, until the latter was bowled for 29. The succeeding batsmen, however, were disposed of cheaply, but a splendid effort was made by Page and E. G. Eyles to avert an innings defeat. They hit with freedom, and put on 36 for the ninth wicket. Herts. polished off the eight runs required without loss. The spectators included Lieutenant-Colonel F. T. H. Bernard, the Prospective Candidate for North Bucks. Scores:—

SUSSEX v. YORKSHIRE. Played at Brighton on August 25, 26 and 27. THE BRIGHTON FESTIVAL. Drawn.

During the three hours and 50 minutes that play was possible on Thursday Yorkshire made 245 for four wickets. For that good score they were indebted almost wholly to Wilson and Rhodes, who, coming together with four men out for 74, added 171 without being parted in less than two hours and a-half, the former being 101 not out at the end of the day and the latter 77. Heavy rain prevented the game from being continued on Friday before three o'clock, and then things went badly for Sussex. Yorkshire took their total to 314, the last six wickets adding 69 in 55 minutes. The stand of Wilson and Rhodes realised 182 runs in 155 minutes. Neither player made a mistake of any kind, and the former hit seven 4's and the latter eleven. The wicket was all in favour of the attack when Sussex went in, and but for a fifth-wicket stand of 53 by Relf (A. E.) and Chaplin would have collapsed completely. As it was, six men were out for 53 at the end of the day. Hirst, assisted by a strong cross-wind, took five of the wickets—all bowled down. By the time the game was resumed on Saturday the wicket had dried considerably, and the Sussex tail did so well that the last four wickets put on 155. Chaplin played an admirable game, hitting loose balls severely and scoring his 71 in two hours and 10 minutes: he hit ten 4's. Cox, who defended strongly for 100 minutes, helped him to add 75 in 95 minutes for the seventh wicket. With Jupp and Vincett together the follow-on was saved and before the innings closed the score was taken to within 74 of that of Yorkshire. Jupp played very steadily for 32 not out and added 35 with Vincett for the ninth wicket and 57 (in 37 minutes) with Butt for the last. When Yorkshire went in again the play was very slow and uninteresting, Myers and Bates taking nearly an hour to score 39, but Denton made amends by making 50 himself in an hour. The innings was declared with three wickets down for 133, leaving Sussex an hour in which to bat before the drawing of stumps. The cricket was not taken seriously, all the regular bowlers being rested. Score and analysis:—
