NORFOLK v. BEDFORDSHIRE.

A QUIET DAY'S PLAY.

NORFOLK GET FIRST INNINGS LEAD.

Play was of a very quiet nature at Lakesham yesterday, and roughly five and a half hours were occupied in making 241 runs, and twenty wickets fell. The Rev. G. B. Haikes and R. W. Thurgar scored 57 between them in a little over an hour for the first wicket, but subsequently the bowlers met with a lot of success, and a score of one else scored more than 18 runs. There had been some rain during the small hours, and the afternoon was well advanced before the light was at all favourable for batting purposes, and this, combined with the ability of some of the bowlers to make the ball bouncier, accounted for the moderate success that was achieved. A cross breeze also helped the bowlers, and many of the batsmen played inside the going away ball, and were caught in the slips. Throughout the day the wickets were hit only and on the nice easy paced wicket but only three hours for a total of 100 runs. On by dismissing Bedfordshire. Norfolk also came well out. They were dismissed by 12 wickets, but not one, and with all leg wickets in hand, the home county left off with a lead of 37 runs. Wharmby, Pilgrim, C. J. H. Treglow and G. W. Birckbeck bowled skilfully, and was dismissed. The three professional bowlers bowled twenty overs each for a comparatively few runs, and Wharmby and Gibson obtained their wickets very cheaply. The uncertainty about the weather may have accounted for the poor attendance in the enclosure, and its appearance was very different from other "Ladies' Days" that we can remember. The band of the 16th Lancers again played delightfully.

Bedfordshire's only victory this season was obtained over Lancashire, and they had the same side which suffered a four wickets defeat at the hands of Suffolk at Felstead on Thursday. R. A. A. Berrisford re-appeared in the Norfolk side, and N. W. Stevens was also included. G. Williams and R. G. Pich dropping out. With the championship hanging in the balance, the issue of the match was of great importance to Norfolk, and it was a happy augury when the Norfolk captain won the toss for the first time this week. The home captain again took H. W. Thurgar in with him to open the Norfolk innings, and the pair gave the good start which was not good, and the bowling of A. F. Morcom and H. Grierson was very steady, and required very careful watching. Runs came rather slowly, an occasional raising ball adding to the difficulties of the batsmen. Pilgrim and H. L. Peel took up the bowling and 50 was reached in fifty-five minutes. G. B. Haikes obtained a lucky four through the slips off Pilgrim, and the captain gave over Morcom's hand, the old Cantab just touching it with the tips of his fingers. Wharmby came on to bowl, and from this point the game went in favour of the fielding side. Haikes was snappet at the wicket when 57 runs had been obtained in 65 minutes, the captain's share being 38 which included five 4s. G. A. Stevens came in and collected half-a-dozen, and was then bowled off by Leventhorpe. Thurgar was next joined by M. Falcon. The score was raised to 87, and then H. R. Orr, the Bedfordshire captain, who first played against Norfolk in 1882 put himself on to bowl, and got a wicket in his first over. Thurgar going down the pitch to miss the ball and was smartly stumped. Thurgar was the wicket number forty minutes for 23 runs. He did not appear thoroughly at his ease, and edged the ball more than usual. It was, however, a very serviceable innings for his side. Norfolk took another good wicket before lunch, Falcon picking a ball from Wharmby into the hands of Leventhorpe at forward short leg. G. W. Birckbeck and Norman Stevens were together when the luncheon interval was taken, and the score was 92 for four wickets, the innings having so far lasted 108 minutes.

The game continued to go badly with the home side, and after the interval four more wickets fell in forty minutes for the addition of only 20 runs. No addition had been made to the lunch total when Birkbeck was caught at slip. R. A. A. Berrisford came in and sent up the 100, and then he too succumbed to Wharmby through the assistance of Morcom at slip. C. J. H. Treglow next partnered N. Stevens, but with the total at 133 the seventh and eighth wickets fell. Stevens and E. J. Fulcher being caught on Pilgrim's bowling. Stevens had been at the wicket a full three-quarters of an hour for 7. Treglow and Allsopp made a useful stand for the ninth wicket. The latter was lucky with a couple of strokes, but he brought off some good shots, and Orr took up the bowling before Treglow was caught at slip. The Grammar School captain batted very well for his 10. Gibson whizzed in, and obtained 2 singles, and then saw Allsopp brilliantly caught at third man by Saunders. In this way six wickets fell after lunch in an hour and a quarter for the addition of 41 runs, and the innings which closed at half-past three produced 138 runs in three hours. Wharmby was the chief agent of destruction. He and Pilgrim bowled with great headlines, and Wharmby's figures, seven wickets for 35 runs, was a fine performance, even allowing that the wicket may have helped him a little. He was assisted by some very good catching. Morcom and Leventhorpe were in the enclosure, and it is worthy of note that the stumps were not once hit during the innings.

Bedfordshire commenced their innings at twelve minutes to four, with H. L. Peel and Holdstock. M. Falcon led the home attack from the pavilion end, and Gibson operated from the opposite wicket. Peel made one fine

shot past cover point on Falcon, but with only 3 runs scored Falcon dismissed Holdstock and G. S. Leventhorpe with successive balls, the professional being caught at slip, and the amateur bowled first ball. E. E. Athorp followed in and commenced strongly on the leg side, but with the total at 23 he hit a ball well off the wicket into Allsopp's hands at slip. Peel was next partnered by A. F. Morcom, and the former got Gibson round smartly to the ring. The light improved, and with the sun getting through, the weather conditions were most pleasant. The score was raised to 40, and then in response to a unanimous shout for a catch behind the wicket, Peel retired. The total was 40, and minutes batting. Falcon was again the successful bowler, and at this stage he had taken all four wickets for 32. Wharmby became associated with Morcom, and with 8 runs added the latter was cleverly caught at slip by G. Stevens. This was the first of Gibson's wickets, and with the dismissal of Morcom half the side were out in fifty-five minutes for 48 runs. Gibson got two other wickets quickly. Geoffrey Stevens making his second catch of the innings in dismissing Wharmby, and Treglow catching the Bedfordshire captain at third man. The seventh wicket fell at 62, and then C. Saunders and H. Grierson were associated in a valuable catch for the eighth wicket, 32 runs being added in half an hour. Allsopp and Haikes failed to break up the partnership, and the innings closing at a quarter to six for 102, having lasted nearly two hours. Gibson bowled unchanged, and was right at the top of his form. He and Falcon were splendidly supported in the field, and the smart catching was a particularly good feature. Holding a very useful lead of 37 runs, the home side went in a second time, with nearly half an hour left for play. Thurgar and Gibson were the dozen overs bowled by four Bedfordshire players produced only 8 runs. Play will be resumed this morning at 10.45.

NORFOLK v. BEDFORDSHIRE

REMARKABLE PLAY.

NORFOLK'S THIRD WIN OF THE WEEK.

Defeating Bedfordshire forty minutes before time by 118 runs, Norfolk gained their third victory of the Week, and thus equalled the record of the 1805, 1801, and 1801 eleven. Saturday's victory was accomplished after some remarkable play, and at two o'clock in the afternoon Norfolk were in great danger of being beaten. With eight men out, they were leading by only 106 runs, and it had been a great struggle to get even that number. Mr. Haikes having had his back to the wall an hour and a-half to collect 22. He was caught off the last ball before lunch, and at this point the odds seemed greatly in favour of Bedfordshire winning. Fine bowling and fielding, and a rain-affected wicket were the chief factors in the downfall of so many batsmen during the first two hours' play, and the remarkable change subsequently effected was attributed to the influence of the sun on the wicket during the luncheon interval. The wicket unquestionably improved, and Allsopp, Treglow, and Fulcher gradually played Norfolk into a position of great good fortune. The credit of Norfolk's fine victory is due to the work of these three men. The young Norwich School captain batted very patiently and well for 70 minutes, and then when Norfolk appeared fairly safe, Allsopp and Fulcher hit out brilliantly, 66 runs being put on in thirty-five minutes. This fine last wicket partnership was left incomplete, as at a quarter to four the Norfolk batsmen were dismissed, and the first wicket fell with 24 runs to get 245. Norfolk followed up their advantage by some fine bowling, and with the batsmen straining every nerve to help the bowlers on, the result was a great success, and by twenty-five minutes to six Norfolk had gained a brilliant victory. Rain set in soon after stumps were drawn on Friday evening, and a shower delayed the resumption of the game on Saturday morning for half an hour. Leading by 86 on the first innings, R. W. Thurgar and H. Grierson obtained 3 runs without loss on Friday evening. The ball cut through, and now and again poked awkwardly, whilst Wharmby made the ball go away in a disconcerting manner. The early batsmen also experienced a difficulty in timing Morcom, and with 2 runs added the first wicket fell. Gibson being caught by the Bedfordshire captain, Mr. Morcom. Geoffrey Stevens came in, and helped to take the score to 13, and at this stage Norfolk lost two more valuable wickets, Stevens being caught behind the wicket, and Thurgar bowled by M. Falcon. Falcon and G. B. Haikes were next associated, and with the total at 20, another disaster befel Norfolk. Falcon being bowled by Morcom. G. W. Birckbeck joined the pair, and the pair offered a stubborn resistance. The batsmen tried to go away, and the batsmen had to fight very hard for their runs, the Bedfordshire field being well placed, and even when the fieldmen were absent, the bowlers were very slow. The Bedfordshire men were on their toes, and batted up their bowlers splendidly. The fifth stand had lasted nearly half-an-hour, when Pilgrim sent a good catch at slip. The total was 37. G. W. Birckbeck was next valuable 10. N. W. Stevens went in and helped in another good stand. Several good newcomers brought only singles, and the newcomer was a narrow escape of being caught at cover off Wharmby. Peel took up the bowling, and the Norfolk captain was cut over by a ball from the new bowler. There was a brief stoppage, and on resuming, both batsmen made steady runs in front of the wicket. The sixth partnership had lasted three-quarters of an hour, the score being raised to 87 to 85, when Stevens was bowled by Peel for 35. The total was 121. Norfolk lost another valuable wicket in a lunch, which was taken at a quarter-past one, with 8 runs added. Haikes attempted to drive Grierson down the pitch, and the latter was bowled. Morcom captain turned the back on the hands of Morcom at slip. Haikes had made a great effort to place his side in a better position, and a half for 23 runs provided testimony of the difficulties which surrounded the batsmen, and also furnished tribute to the excellence of the Bedfordshire bowling. Haikes was seventh out at 89, and at the adjournment Norfolk were leading by 108 runs, and had three wickets in hand.

The sun came out before the players retired for lunch, and there was a prospect of a hot afternoon. R. A. A. Berrisford left soon after the interval, Peel bowling him at 71, but C. J. H. Treglow and Allsopp gave some trouble, and the captain changed his mind, and sent on himself to puzzle the batsmen. Allsopp did most of the run-making, and it was a past cover point off his bat which sent up the 100 when the innings had lasted nearly three hours. Allsopp appeared to be favoured by fortune on two occasions when Morcom was bowled, but despite several changes in the attack the pair remained in possession of the run, being added in an hour. The splendid stand was ultimately broken by a good ball from Pilgrim, which got past the Norwich School captain's defence, and hit the wicket. Treglow was at the wicket seventy minutes, and he assisted in raising the score from 68 to 124. His own contribution amounted to no more than 13, but the great value of his effort did not rest wholly upon his own figures. His ninth stand produced 53 runs in six-and-a-half minutes, and on R. J. Fulcher, Allsopp completed his 50 by hitting Pilgrim for 6, an off drive into the enclosure. This was the first hit of more than a single which had been made off the young Bedfordshire bowler. Fulcher helped Allsopp to make things lively, and when Orr went on to bowl the ball was frequently at the boundary, Fulcher making three or four runs, whilst Wharmby also came in for punishment, and for a fine run. He was detained from nearly every ball, the contrast with the previous slow methods being most marked. It brought with it a suspicion that the wicket

was playing much easier. The second century appeared at twenty minutes to four, the last 100 runs having been obtained in sixty-three minutes. Allsopp was batting altogether one hundred minutes for 60. It would be impossible to overestimate the value of his ninth stand. When he went in, Norfolk were in danger of being beaten, and he played steadily and well. He gradually changed the aspect of the game, and then when Norfolk were quite safe he hit off finely. Among his hits were one 6, six 4s, three 3s, and seven 2s. Norfolk were batting altogether four hours for their 207, and a glance at the bowling figures will show how well the Bedfordshire bowlers kept the run down.

Bedfordshire were tired from their long outing, and their thoughts did not run in the direction of making 242 runs in the 2 hours left for play. There was, however, a possibility of the visitors being dismissed within that period of time, and when Orr, Peel, and Holdstock were sent back in the first half-hour for 23 runs the game seemed taking a course extremely favourable for the chances of a Norfolk victory. The total was only 9 when Gibson bowled the Bedfordshire captain, and with 2 runs added Falcon brilliantly caught and bowled Peel. Holdstock was next dismissed, and the score to 25, and then the first wicket was caught at cover point. Haikes going on at Gibson's end and getting the wicket with his second ball. Athorp was next dismissed, and the bowlers were temporarily checked. The Bedfordshire wicket-keeper made some excellent shots, and Norfolk were wanting another wicket badly when Wharmby was dismissed by a sensational catch at long-off. Treglow running several yards, and shooting up his right hand, he reached and held the ball. Morcom came in and ran 2 for what appeared a possible to the wicket-keeper, and the score was raised to 37. Five for 67, and seven-and-a-half minutes left. Saunders kept his end up, whilst Athorp played bright cricket, and the score was raised to 82, when Athorp was cleverly stumped. He had a narrow escape of a similar fate off the previous ball, going out on each session to drive Haikes and missing the ball. A little more than an hour Athorp obtained 23 out of 57, and hit five 4s. Leventhorpe was the only one of the remaining batsmen to give any trouble, although Saunders continued his snail-like methods. Leventhorpe had a slice of luck when he was in the wicket, hitting a full toss in Birkbeck's direction, and the ball dropping out of the fieldman's hands and falling over the boundary at long leg to score 6. In the same over Birkbeck got Saunders caught at slip. At the same total—118—Grierson was smartly caught at mid-on by Berrisford. Allsopp had just previously relieved Falcon, and in his first over he captured the last two wickets, bowling Leventhorpe and a pleasing success against Pilgrim. The match and the Week thus came to a satisfactory conclusion at twenty-five minutes to six. Norfolk winning forty minutes before time by 118 runs. In setting Bedfordshire out in an hour and thirty-five minutes for 102, the Norfolk bowlers accomplished a smart performance. Stevens secured most wickets, his average 11 runs each, but the other three bowlers played a good part in the victory.

NORFOLK v. BEDS.

Beds again lost this match, which was commenced on Friday, at Lakenham. There had been some rain during the small hours of Friday morning, and the afternoon was well advanced before the light was at all favourable for batting purposes, and this combined with the ability of some of the bowlers to make the ball bump, accounted for the moderate success that was achieved. A cross breeze also helped the bowlers, and many of the batsmen played inside the going away ball, and were caught in the slips. Throughout the day the wickets were hit only twice, and on the nice easy paced wicket better scores might have been expected. As it was Norfolk batted three hours for a total of 136, and got themselves out of what seemed an unfavourable position by dismissing Bedfordshire for a total of 102. Wharmby, Pilgrim, Gibson, and M. Falcon all bowled skilfully, and with marked steadiness. The three professionals bowled above twenty overs each for a comparatively few runs, and Wharmby and Gibson obtained their wickets very cheaply. Bedfordshire's only victory this season was obtained over Cambridgeshire, and they had the same side which suffered a four wickets defeat at the hands of Suffolk at Felixstowe on Thursday. A. F. Morcom and H. Grierson were very steady, and required very careful watching. Runs came rather slowly, an occasional rising ball adding to the difficulties of the batsmen. Pilgrim and B. L. Peel took up the bowling, and 50 was reached in fifty-five minutes. G. B. Raikes obtained a lucky four through the slips off Pilgrim, the ball passing over Morcom's head, the old Cantab just touching it with the tips of his fingers. Wharmby came on to bowl, and from this point the game went in favour of the folding side. G. A. Stevens was finely caught left-handed at slip by Loventhorpe. Thurgar was joined by M. Falcon. The score was raised to 87, and then H. R. Orr, the Bedfordshire captain, who first played against Norfolk as far back as 1882, put himself on to bowl, and got a wicket in his first over, Thurgar going down the pitch to miss the ball and be smartly stumped. The game continued to go badly with the home side, and after the interval four more wickets fell in forty minutes for the addition of only 20 runs. Six wickets fell after lunch in an hour and a quarter for the addition of only 44 runs, and the innings, which closed at half-past three, produced 136 runs in three hours. Wharmby was the chief agent of destruction. He and Pilgrim bowled with great steadiness, and Wharmby's figures, seven wickets for 35 runs, was a fine performance, even allowing that the wicket may have helped him a little. He was assisted by some very good catching, Morcom and Loventhorpe taking three apiece, and it is worthy of note that the stumps were not once hit during the innings. Bedfordshire commenced their innings at twelve minutes to four, with B. L. Peel and Holdstock. M. Falcon led the home attack from the pavilion end, and Gibson opened from the opposite wicket. Peel made one fine shot past cover point off Falcon, but with only 9 runs scored Falcon dismissed Holdstock and G. S. Loventhorpe with successive balls, the professional being caught at slip, and the amateur bowled first ball. E. E. Apthorp followed in, and commenced strongly on the leg side, but with the total at 23 he hit a ball well off the wicket into Allsopp's hands at slip. Peel was next partnered by A. F. Morcom, and the former got Gibson round smartly to the ring. The light improved, and with the sun getting through, the weather conditions were most pleasant. The score was raised to 40, and then in response to a unanimous shout for a catch behind the wicket, Peel retired. The total was 40, and Peel claimed 15 as the outcome of forty minutes' batting. Falcon was again the successful bowler, and at this stage he had taken all four wickets for 32. Wharmby became associated with Morcom, and with 8 runs added the latter was cleverly caught at slip by G. Stevens. This was the first of Gibson's wickets, and with the dismissal of Morcom half the side were out in fifty-five minutes for 48 runs. Gibson got two other wickets quickly, Geoffrey Stevens dismissing Wharmby, and Treglown catching the Bedfordshire captain at third man. The seventh wicket fell at 62, and then T. Saunders and H. Grierson were associated in a valuable stand for the eighth wicket, 32 runs being added in half an hour. Allsopp and Raikes failed to break up the partnership, and the separation was ultimately effected by Gibson bowling Saunders. Grierson soon followed his late partner. Boreford taking a good catch at third man. Nine men were out for 96, and shortly afterwards Boreford caught Pilgrim, the innings closing at a quarter to six for 102, having lasted nearly two hours. Gibson bowled unchanged, and was right at the top of his form. The bowlers were splendidly supported in the field, and the smart catching was a particularly good feature.

Holding a very useful lead of 34, Norfolk went in a second time, with nearly half an hour left for play. Thurgar and Gibson were sent in, with instructions to take no risks, and the dozen overs bowled by four Bedfordshire players produced only 3 runs. Rain set in soon after stumps were drawn on Friday evening, and there were intermittent showers during the night and morning. There was no sun, and after the application of the heavy roller the wicket was very damp. Wickets fell very fast on Saturday, the ball out through, and how and again popped awkwardly, whilst Wharmby made the ball go away in a disconcerting manner. The early batsmen also experienced a difficulty in timing Morcom, and with 2 runs added the first wicket fell, Gibson being caught by the Bedfordshire captain off Morcom. At 13 Norfolk lost two more valuable wickets, Stevens being caught behind the wicket and Thurgar bowled by Wharmby. M. Falcon and G. B. Raikes were next associated, and, with the total raised to 21, another disaster befel Norfolk, Falcon being bowled by Morcom. G. W. Birkbeck joined his captain, and the pair offered a stubborn resistance. The ball was difficult to get away, and the batsmen had to fight very hard for their runs, the Bedfordshire field being well placed and, even when the fieldsmen were passed the ball travelled very slowly. The Bedfordshire men were on their toes and backed up their bowlers splendidly. The fifth stand had lasted nearly half-an-hour when Pilgrim went on and got Birkbeck caught at slip. The total was 37, and Birkbeck's share was a most valuable 10. N. W. Stevens went in and helped in another good stand. Several good drives brought only singles, and the newcomer had a narrow escape of being caught at cover off Wharmby. Peel took up the bowling, and the Norfolk captain was out over by a ball from the new bowler. There was a brief stoppage, and on resuming both batsmen made some good strokes in front of that wicket. The sixth partnership had lasted three-quarters of an hour, the score being raised from 37 to 63, when Stevens was bowled by Peel for a most serviceable 13. Norfolk lost another valuable wicket before lunch, which was taken at a quarter past one as with 6 runs added Raikes attempted to drive Grierson, who had relieved Wharmby, and the Norfolk captain turned the ball into the hands of Morcom at slip. Raikes had made a great effort to place his side in a better position, and the fact that he was at the wicket an hour and a half for 22 runs provided testimony of the difficulties which surrounded the batsmen, and also furnished tribute to the excellence of the Bedfordshire bowling. Raikes was seventh out at 69, and at the adjournment Norfolk were leading by 103 runs, and had three wickets in hand. The sun came out before the players retired for lunch, and there was a prospect of a hot afternoon, with the batsmen in a worse plight than before. R. A. A. Boreford left soon after the interval, Peel bowling him at 71, but C. J. H. Treglown and Allsopp gave some trouble, and the score crept up slowly. The Bedford captain changed his bowling, and went on himself to puzzle the batsmen. Allsopp did most of the run-making, and it was a 4 past cover point off his bat which sent up the 100 when the innings had lasted nearly three hours. Allsopp appeared to be favoured by fortune on two occasions when Morcom was bowling, but despite several changes in the attack the pair remained in possession, 50 runs being added in an hour. This splendid stand was broken by a good ball from Pilgrim, which got past the Norwich School captain's defence, and hit the wicket. Allsopp completed his 50 by hitting Pilgrim for 6, an off drive into the enclosure. This was the first hit of more than a single which had been made off the young Bedfordshire bowler. Fulcher helped Allsopp to make things lively, and when Orr went on to bowl the ball was frequently at the boundary, Fulcher making three 4's off successive balls. Wharmby also came in for punishment. Allsopp was batting altogether one hundred minutes for 69. It would be impossible to over-estimate the value of his magnificent effort. When he went in Norfolk were in danger of being beaten, and he played steadily and well. He gradually changed the aspect of the game, and then when Norfolk were quite safe he hit out finely. Bedfordshire were tired from their long outing, and their thoughts did not run in the direction of making 242 runs in the 21 hours left for play. There was, however, a danger of the visitors being dismissed within that period of time, and when Orr, Peel, and Holdstock were sent back in the first half-hour for 25 runs the game seemed taking a course extremely favourable for the chances of a Norfolk victory. The total was only 9 when Gibson bowled the Bedfordshire captain, and with 2 runs added Falcon brilliantly caught and bowled Peel. Holdstock and Wharmby took the score to 25, and then the first named was caught at cover point, Raikes going on at Gibson's end and getting the wicket with his

second ball. Apthorp followed in, and the success of the bowlers was checked. Apthorp was eventually stumped. Loventhorpe was the only one to make any stand and he compiled a very useful 37. The venture closed for 129, so that the home county won by 112 runs. Score and analysis:—
