Cambs. made two changes in the team, which met Suffolk, A S Ling and F Roberson displacing C Pigg and Sheldrick. Winning the toss, Cambs. opened their innings with W C Hunt and F Hayward, against the bowling of A F Morcom and Wharmby. The latter was soon dismissed, being caught in the slips off Morcom. L J Reid followed, and runs began to come at a good rate, Hunt playing splendid cricket, and scoring all round the wicket. A mistake between the two batsmen nearly cost Hunt his wicket, but the ball was badly thrown in, so the wicket keeper could not gather it. Directly afterwards Reid was splendidly caught in the slips, being taken low down, off Morcom. Only two runs were added when Leventhorpe brought off another fine catch at the other end, dismissing Hunt. A S Ling started with a two, but did not appear to be at all home, and when at six he was cleaned bowled in trying to pull Morcom. Things were looking very bad for Cambs., four wickets being down for 46. The captain, H C Tebbutt, then joined C H Pigg, but runs were very scarce, owing to the fine fielding of the Beds. players. Without the score being added to Bocoock in attempting to hit Orr's slow breaks to the leg boundary was easily caught. Rose soon set about Wharmby, getting him nicely to the leg boundary. The next ball he skied into the longfield, where Saunders was standing close to the pavilion, and the innings closed at 3.30 for 155.

Beds. opened their innings with B L Peel and Holdstock, against the bowling of Coulson and G A Rose. Both the batsmen batted extremely well, and with the score at 34, Tebbutt went on in the place of Rose. They continued to score all round the wicket, and 50 was sent up in three quarters of an hour. Two runs later, however, Peel was nicely caught at third man by Pigg for 22. At 83, L J Reid displaced Coulson with the ball, and with his first delivery he dismissed Wharmby. The Beds. captain, H R Orr, got Reid away, and the hundred was hoisted in an hour and twenty minutes. Holdstock completed his fifty by getting Tebbutt to the leg boundary. Orr severely punished Reid's slow breaks, getting to the boundary twice in succession. Soon after, however, he fell a victim to a nice catch at the wicket by Watts off Reid. Coulson went on in the place of Tebbutt, and in his first over the Cambs. total was passed by two good drives by Holdstock. C H Pigg was then put on in the place of L J Reid at 159, and with the fifth ball of his first over he had Holdstock caught at point. He had scored a splendid 71, which included five 4's and seven 3's. Throughout the two hours he was at the wicket he never gave a chance. A F Morcom, the old Cambridge Blue, did not stay long, for he was nicely taken at cover point by Tebbutt. Apthorpe was missed at the wicket off Rose, and the next ball he hit for six. Tebbutt then went on in the place of Rose, and Apthorpe hit to the boundary three times in one over, sending up the second century. He completed his 50 directly after the restart. He continued to bat splendidly, and drove Grierson to the boundary in excellent style. H R Orr relieved Morcom at 157, and in his first over he effected a separation by getting Roberson bowled, the partnership having realised 82. The next over sent down by Wharmby, secured Hunt's wicket with a " Yorker," he having been at the wicket an hour and forty minutes for seventy-one, his best hits being six 4's and three 3's. Bocoock came next, and was bowled by Wharmby—the first ball sent down to him. The next man, C H Pigg, soon set about punishing the slow howling of Orr, making a six and a four, which wiped off the deficit on the first innings. His life soon ended, for after hitting another nice six he was caught at the wicket. Watts sent the second century up with a six off Orr, but the next over he was out to a catch close on to the boundary. Tebbutt hit out mightily, and scored 25 in six hits. From the opening balls of the next over he made a six and a four, completing his 50, and sending up 250. Morcom displaced Orr 13 runs later, and his first delivery was despatched for four by Tebbutt. With Rose as a partner runs came at a very fast rate, until Rose skied an easy catch to point which Orr made no mistake with. The end soon came, for Coulson was run out through a misunderstanding; the innings therefore closed for 280, soon after 4 o'clock, Tebbutt being not out for a brilliant 64, which included two 6's and eight 4's, and during his innings he never gave a chance. Beds left with 109 runs to get to win, and two hours to get them in, started with Peel and Saunders against the bowling of Rose and Coulson. MINOR COUNTIES' CHAMPIONSHIP.

Bedfordshire at Cambridge.

In the third match of their tour, commenced at Cambridge on Tuesday, Bedfordshire experienced a welcome change from the fate that has attended them in most of their matches this season. Instead of being in arrears they were, as in the first match between these counties at Bedford, always on top, and it is interesting to note that Bedfordshire and Cambridgeshire figure at the bottom of the championship table for their division. Bedfordshire beat Cambridgeshire on the occasion of the first meeting, and that was the only victory they had obtained prior to this match, while Cambridgeshire had not gained a single point.

The hosters were fortunate enough to secure first knock on Tuesday on a wicket which appeared altogether favourable to the batsmen, but they completely failed to make any good use of it. Morcom and Wharmby, who opened the attack, succeeded in capturing the first four wickets at a cost of 46, and it should be mentioned that three of the wickets were due to fine catches by Leventhorpe, who was fielding in really fine style. Morcom bowled the other batsman, who was Ling, the well-known Brentford goalkeeper. C. H. Pigg and Tebbutt put rather a different aspect on the game by a stand of nearly an hour, during which they added 53 runs. Pigg was the first to leave after making 30, but he might have been out when he had made 18, as he gave a rather sharp chance to the visiting captain. Tebbutt followed his partner after sending up the hundred, being out in a rather unfortunate way. He hit the ball towards Pilgrim at mid-on, and his partner, thinking a catch would be made, did not attempt to run. The result was that although Pilgrim failed to bring off the catch, he returned the ball to Apthorpe with a smartness which was sufficient to get Tebbutt, who had got halfway up the pitch, run out. Six wickets were down at lunch time for exactly 100, and after the resumption 24 were put on before Watts was caught in the slips off the fast bowler. Roberson and Bocock carried the score to 148 before being separated, and both left at the same total. Bocock was out to a fine catch by Saunders close to the boundary, and at 155 Saunders brought the innings to a close with a similarly brilliant effort.

Of the bowlers Wharmby took 3 wickets for 38, Morcom 3 for 57, Grierson 1 for 21, Pilgrim 0 for 25, and Orr 1 for 1. It is interesting to note that the Bedfordshire captain sent down five overs and only had a single scored off him.

Bedfordshire had about two and three quarter hours to bat before the drawing of stumps, and they soon made themselves certain of securing at least three points. Peel and Holdstock opened the innings, as usual, and though they began cautiously, both men showed form which indicated the likelihood of a big score. Peel was out to a catch at deep slip after batting about three quarters of an hour for 22 out of 52, and Wharmby succumbed to a bowling change, after he had assisted to put on 31. With Orr in, the cricket brightened up considerably, and the century was hoisted after an hour and twenty minutes batting. The skipper made 23 before being caught at the wicket, and Holdstock succumbed to a catch at point for a nicely played 71. With these four wickets down, the Cambridgeshire total was passed, and after Morcom's brief stay, Apthorpe and Hastings Squire, who played in place of Dr. McLinnell, hit the weak bowling all over the ground. The Dunstable man was particularly severe, and when stumps were drawn, he stood at 65, and the total was 247 for 5 wickets. Scores:—

Yesterday, Beds. fully maintained the splendid advantage they gained on Tuesday, for Apthorpe and Squire continued to hit freely, and with the total at 327 for 5 wickets the innings was declared closed. The Dunstable Grammar Schoolmaster has not been seen to better advantage. He reached his century after a little more than an hour's batting, and was not out 120 when the innings was closed. He hit two 6's and fifteen 4's, and only one chance at the wicket marred his dashing display.

Batting a second time Cambs. lost six wickets before the arrears were knocked off. Hunt, who came in with one wicket down for 13, batted finely, and was fifth out at 101 for a very mori-

torious 71, scored in an hour and forty minutes.
