Shelley's 88 included 1 six and 6 fours, Heslop's 69 contained ? fours, and Bazalgette, 65 included ? fours. In the Devon innings, Shelley and Orchard put on 152 runs for the first wicket. For the visitors, there were 19 fours, ? threes and ? twos in Budge's 192 not out, an innings of 6 hours. He was reported as batting with 'considerable difficulty' after he had reached 150 due to the strain of batting for so long. He gave no chances during his innings. There were ? fours in Cummins's 85 and ? fours in Knight's 69. In the Dorset innings, Budge and Cummins added 175 for the sixth wicket, and Budge and Goodden put on 103 runs in an unbroken partnership for the seventh wicket. MINOR COUNTIES CHAMPIONSHIP.

DEVON v. DORSET.

Devon's last home match in connection with the Minor Counties Cricket Championship commenced at Exeter yesterday, Dorset being the visitors. Devon won the toss, and, on a rapidly drying wicket, J. P. Shelley and J. F. Orchard opened the innings, the bowling being shared by Cummins and Webb. Runs came slowly at the start, and chiefly in singles. Shelley out Cummins finely past cover for 3, and a similar number was obtained by Orchard off Webb. Subsequently each batsman played with confidence, their strokes being beautifully timed. The hundred was hoisted as the result of one hour and twenty minutes' cricket. Continuing after lunch, Shelley promptly on-drove Webb for 6, whilst Orchard pulled Cummins around to square leg for a boundary. At 150 Shelley was caught near the pavilion rails for 88. L. H. Crookwell was taken in the slips after scoring 4, but another stand was seen when the Rev. G. L. Heslop joined Orchard. The latter was playing very fine cricket, and with a 7 wide of point he reached his century. He was eventually caught at mid-on by Gooden, for 122. He gave a chance at 61, and again after he had passed the hundred. Otherwise his display was faultless, and he hit twelve 4's.

The subsequent batsman hit out, and the last wicket fell with the total at 435. Dorset had under an hour's batting, during which time they lost two wickets for 44 runs.

Runs came pretty freely, and after three-quarters of an hour's play the century was reached. At 130 Cpt. Basalgette took the ball, and in the first over he dismissed Knight. Two wickets then fell for a small addition to the score, but H. B. Cummins assisted Budge to make a stand. It was by far the best partnership of the game, and it resulted in Dorset scoring the three points on the first innings. Budge, who carried out his bat for 192, gave a brilliant exhibition. MINOR COUNTIES COMPETITION.

DEVON v. DORSET.

The inability of half-a-dozen or more of the best players in Devon to play in the match against Dorset, which commenced at the County Ground, Exeter, yesterday, necessitated a weak side being placed in the field. There were four alterations in the home eleven as compared with the original selection, neither W. Wretford (practically the only fast bowler the County possessed), R. Knight, R. G. Cruys, or R. St. Mary being able to play, and their places were filled by L. Crookwell, the Rev. G. L. A. Heslop, F. R. Coates, and Capt. Basalgette. There were also notable absences in Lieut. Christian, W. F. Sturt, H. V. I. Webb, and Light. Dorset are not so strong as on Monday and Tuesday, when they defeated Cornwall by about 60 runs. Devon won the toss, and commenced batting at noon on a rather difficult wicket, the recent heavy rain having made the ground somewhat soft. J. F. Orchard and J. P. Shelley opened the Devon innings against the bowling of Cummins and Webb. After the two homesters had been together for half-an-hour there was an almost unanimous appeal for a catch by Orchard. Both batsmen were playing, but the umpire gave his decision in favour of the Sidmouth amateur. The total was carried to 50 in a little less than an hour, Shelley frequently driving well, while Orchard was often responsible for brilliant strokes. The first century was signalled after an hour and twenty minutes' play, both batsmen now scoring quickly, despite changes in the bowling.

At the luncheon interval the score stood at 106 without loss. Shelley and Orchard continued to do well on the resultants, but when 152 had been compiled Shelley had had luck in being caught in the deep field a couple of yards away from the boundary.

He played a splendid innings, and thoroughly deceived the runs. Crookwell, of Torquay, did not remain at the wickets long, being caught in the slips after making four. The score continued to rise rapidly when the Rev. G. L. A. Heslop joined Orchard, the second century being photographed after Devon had been at the wickets two hours and a half. A few minutes later the Sidmouth amateur reached his 100 with a capital drive. Orchard had batted without a mistake, his batting style being particularly admirable. He hit well all round the wicket, his driving being particularly well-timed. Heslop and Orchard took the score to 282, when the last-named was caught at mid-on for a well-earned 152, his right wrist having seen badly hit a minute before as the result of a hard throw in, which necessitated play being suspended for a minute. The Sidmouth man was batting for three hours, his innings being one of the best seen on the ground for a considerable time. Heslop, who had a rather narrow escape in the slips almost at the close of his innings, batted exceedingly well after he had played himself in, and was not long in making 50. A strong drive by the Exmouth captain, brought the score up to 320 a few minutes after 4 o'clock. The two-lag named carried the total to 342, when Heslop, who was forcing the game, was bowled for 28. A dozen runs were added when Cpt. Hartley was bowled for eight, but the homesters being out for 222. It was evident that the players had received instructions to hit. Devon's sixth wicket was not long in falling, Budge being bowled when he had made 13. Coates, who scored two, had his left hand damaged as soon as he commenced bat, through Basalgette driving back hard. The fourth hundred was made a few minutes later, the Exmouth captain and W. Ashford then sharing the batting. The last-named had his stumps disorganised when he had contributed 22, the score for the eighth wicket being 424. Basalgette was soon after bowled for 65, which brought to a conclusion a splendid innings. Devon's innings terminated for 435.

Dorset were left with an hour to bat. Cpt. Hartley and Aston were entrusted with the bowling, and when 22 had been registered the United Services professional bowled Greenhill for 18. Another dozen runs were added when Davies finely caught the Rev. W. H. Arundell behind the wickets. W. B. Budge and W. T. Knight remained together until stumps were drawn for the day. Scores:--

DEVON v. DORSET.

This match, which commenced at Exeter on Wednesday, resulted in a win for Dorset, on the first innings, by four wickets. The home county batted practically the whole of the first day, compiling 435 runs. This play ceased on Wednesday Dorset had lost two wickets for 44 runs, the five not out batsmen being W. H. Budge and W. T. Knight. Yesterday morning the two, batted in excellent style, and were not separated until the partnership had reached 100. The next batsman was out before he had made 10, the next two batsmen to handle the wicket were dismissed with 66, but on Cummins joining Budge the score again rose rapidly. The two batted in excellent style and increased the total from 101 to 320, when Cummins was bowled by Heslop. C. F. Goodden soon got the upper hand of the Dorset's exceedingly weak bowling, and the additional 100 runs were obtained without loss. Budge having placed 192 to his credit and Goodden 44, Budge, who was at the wickets for five and a half hours yesterday, batted in a brilliant manner. He secured the first 100 runs in a delightful style, but after this it was apparent that he was batting under considerable difficulty, owing to the unusual strain through being at the wickets so long. The bowling on both sides was exceedingly weak, which, with the good wicket, accounted for the high scoring. Scores:--

When stumps were drawn Dorset had lost two wickets for 44 runs. On Thursday, by a remarkable day's batting, Dorset wrested points from Devon after the latter had established a strong position. The innings lasted 4½ hours, and in the time remaining before stumps were drawn, Dorset, beginning badly, lost two wickets for 41, Budge being not out 13 and Knight not out 4. These two on the second day made a capital stand, and after Knight was out for 69, and two other wickets had been cheaply obtained, Budge and Cummins made another big stand for the sixth wicket, putting on 175, whilst Gooden, who followed, helped Budge to increase the total to 440, Dorset having, when stumps were drawn, a lead of five runs, so gaining a point in the competition as the result of a first innings advantage. Budge was at the wicket all the day and showed brilliant form. He was only eight short of a double century, and the innings is a long way his best performance either for club or county. After an idle day on Monday owing to rain the start of this match was delayed on Tuesday until noon and there were a couple of interruptions later. Surrey gained an advantage by winning the toss and late in the afternoon declared—prematurely, as many thought—with eight wickets down for 221, leaving Middlesex an hour in which to bat before stumps were drawn. Hayward was in an hour for 4, but Hobbs scored 59 out of 94 in 95 minutes by faultless and skilful cricket. The best batting of the day was shown by Campbell, who forced the game splendidly and obtained his 55 out of 89 in 59 minutes; he hit two 6's and six 4's in his delightful display. Hayes made his 69 in 135 minutes, but was not seen at his best, though his innings was a most valuable one. Middlesex quickly lost Douglas and Hendren, but by the end of the day Warner and Tarrant had taken the score to 47 without further loss. Yesterday the weather showed a great improvement, the conditions being almost reminiscent of summer. For some time runs came readily, chiefly from Warner, who played with confidence from the start. The follow-on was saved with only two men out, and it was not until the third wicket had added 62 in 65 minutes that Tarrant was caught at long-on. Then followed three useful stands, Hearn (J. W.) helping to put on 28, Baker 48, and Mann 42. The last named hit freely and well for 32, though he was almost caught off Platt when 18. Warner reached 50 in 110 minutes and 100 in three hours and a-half; in all he made 137 out of 261 in 240 minutes, being first in and last out, and hit fourteen 4's and ten 3's in his chanceless display.
