Drizzle on the first day limited play to four hours and rain shortly after 5.00 pm on the second caused the match to be abandoned. For the home side, there were 1 five, 12 fours, 7 threes and 7 twos in Goatly's 99, an innings of 7 hours. Spring's 63 was scored in under 30 minutes and contained 13 fours. In the Surrey first innings, Knight and Goatly put on 148 runs for the first wicket, and Ratty and Vigar 54 for the eighth wicket. For the visitors, there were 1 five, 17 fours, 7 threes and 7 twos in Cowley's 147, scored in 7 minutes. Titchmarsh's 76 included 7 fours.

SURREY 11. v. HERTS.

On the Reigate Priory Cricket Ground on Wednesday and Thursday of last week the match took place between Surrey Second Eleven and Hertfordshire in the Minor Counties Championship. Although a lot of rain fell on Wednesday and play only lasted about four hours, the Surrey eleven put up the capital score of 417. Goatly and Mr. D. J. Knight, the sixteen-year-old Malvern boy, made a fine stand for the first wicket, scoring 148 in seventy minutes. Fine weather prevailing on Thursday, the match was resumed. Hertfordshire played up splendidly and 367 stood to their credit before all were out. The Old Harrovian and Cantab, Mr. R. B. Cowley, played perfect cricket for 147, including a 5 and seventeen 4's. The article is excellently illustrated, and so clear to me seems Mr. Vaile's explanation regarding the "googlie" break, that if I were starting my cricket career I would most certainly try to cultivate the "googlie."

CRICKET IN INDIA.

During the three hours and 50 minutes that play was possible on Thursday Yorkshire made 245 for four wickets. For that good score they were indebted almost wholly to Wilson and Rhodes, who, coming together with four men out for 74, added 171 without being parted in less than two hours and a-half, the former being 101 not out at the end of the day and the latter 77. Heavy rain prevented the game from being continued on Friday before three o'clock, and then things went badly for Sussex. Yorkshire took their total to 314, the last six wickets adding 69 in 55 minutes. The stand of Wilson and Rhodes realised 182 runs in 155 minutes. Neither player made a mistake of any kind, and the former hit seven 4's and the latter eleven. The wicket was all in favour of the attack when Sussex went in, and but for a fifth-wicket stand of 53 by Relf (A. E.) and Chaplin would have collapsed completely. As it was, six men were out for 55 at the end of the day. First, assisted by a strong cross-wind, took five of the wickets—all bowled down. By the time the game was resumed on Saturday the wicket had dried considerably, and the Sussex tall did so well that the last four wickets put on 155. Chaplin played an admirable game, hitting loose balls severely and scoring his 71 in two hours and 10 minutes; he hit ten 4's. Cox, who defended strongly for 100 minutes, helped him to add 75 in 95 minutes for the seventh wicket. With Jupp and Vincett together the follow-on was saved and before the innings closed the score was taken to within 74 of that of Yorkshire. Jupp played very steadily for 32 not out and added 85 with Vincett for the ninth wicket and 57 (in 27 minutes) with Butt for the last. When Yorkshire went in again the play was very slow and uninteresting, Myers and Bates taking nearly an hour to score 39, but Denton made amends by making 50 himself in an hour. The innings was declared with three wickets down for 133, leaving Sussex an hour in which to bat before the drawing of stumps.
