

CARDIFF WIN EASILY AGAINST LLANELLY.

Cardiff's match with Llanelly on the Cardiff Arms Park on Saturday (for Bainton's benefit) was opened quietly by the visiting eleven. Warner and Lohmann were dismissed by Bainton for a duck and 8 runs respectively, and Trubshaw was clean bowled after knocking up only 17. Simpson retired after hitting three singles, and Randall only spent half a minute at the wicket, his middle stump being taken by R. T. Gabe. E. Roberts was soon dismissed by Gabe for 2, and Rowe was run out by a smart throw-in for 1. After the lunch interval, however, Percy Rees, the first man in, carried a useful score to 53 before he was caught by Horspool off Gabe. Rees was the only hope of the winning side, however, and the remainder of the innings was a failure.

Tait and Waring opened for Cardiff, the former being beaten when 41 by a ball from Simpson. H. G. Symonds hit up 27 before he was caught by Pugh, and then Waring and Bainton were soon dismissed, and the only remaining scorers of note were Gabe, who made 56, and J. J. Horspool, 33, not out. There were 43 extras in the Cardiff total.
