CORNWALL COUNTY LEAGUE.

At Truro on Thursday, a meeting of the Cornwall County League was held at the Red Lion Hotel, Mr. Roberts (Penzance) presiding. Troon claimed two points from Penzance on the ground of two wrong decisions of the umpire in a match lost by three runs. It was alleged by Troon that two clear hits to the boundary were made and only two runs were allowed for each, while Williams (Penzance) ran over the boundary line with the ball once but did not signal, while Godrich (Penzance), fielding, signalled for a boundary, and the batsmen stopped running, but only two runs were allowed. It was also alleged that a Troon batsman was given out leg before, with a distinctly leg ball. Had they received their proper runs they would have won the match by one run.—After discussion and evidence, it was decided, that the result stand.—Lanhydrock Club waived their claim of two points from Newquay for non-fulfilment of a fixture, as it was hoped to arrange a date.—St. Austell complained of the bad state of the Lostwithiel pitch, and the matter was referred to the annual meeting.—Helston Club were granted an extension of time until August 26th, to complete two home League fixtures with Redruth and Camborne, postponed owing to bad weather.—It was decided that the League final be played at Truro on Friday, September 8th, if Helston represented the Western Division, and on September 9th if Troon took the position. Messrs. F. B. Lewman and J. A. Cumberledge were appointed umpires. Viscount Clifden will be asked to present the cup.
