Holmer continued their victorious career on Saturday at Widemarsh, when they defeated Hampton Court in no uncertain fashion. The visitors went to the wickets first, and when the first man was out 11 runs had been registered, and four runs later the second batsman retired to the pavilion. The bowling of Cripps and Thorne for Holmer was very deadly, in spite of the fact that the pitch did not give them much assistance, and four wickets had fallen for 25, 6 for 39, for 46, and the whole innings was finished for 59, only W. Thorne and the Rev. W. Wolfenden making double figures. Thorne took six wickets for 23 runs, and Cripps four for 31. When Smith and Goodwin opened the Holmer innings they played brightly, and before the former was dismissed 38 runs were on the board, he having claimed no less than 21 of them by sound cricket. Then H. Thorne came forward, and he was as successful with the bat as he was with the ball, for in a short time he had compiled 38, scoring one 5 and 17, amongst other hits. The second wicket fall was 119. T. Goodwin still remained master of the bowling until he hit one ball rather badly and was caught by Poulton off his own bowling. He played brightly, and his hits included 100 and eight 4's. A. N. Astbury and J. H. Sampson played out time, when the total was 149 for six wickets.

The Liberal Club had their colours lowered rather early on Saturday. They entertained Withington at home, and the visitors, aided by bad fielding on the part of the Liberal players, managed to score 100 runs. Wright and Heal bowled well, and were not backed up smartly by the men on the field, some very bad "misses" being witnessed. The score did not look very formidable, but soon altered the tale, for he bowled with deadly accuracy that seven wickets fell for 27. The first three wickets fell without a run being scored, and seven were down for 10. A good stand was then made, the score being increased to 24 for the next wicket, and on the 25th. Nothing further was scored, and the Liberals had to retire in the minority by 76 runs. There are no "notable performances" to be noted on the batting side at any rate! Wright and Heal made 28 between them, leaving 100 runs for the remaining nine men, including extras. There were seven "ducks."

Herford Post Office have little to congratulate themselves upon over their visit to Holme Lacy. They went to the wickets first, and only scored 22 runs. The bowling was well shared by the Holme Lacy men, for, truth to tell, it was almost impossible to bowl for any length of time. Holme Lacy passed the figure against them for the loss of the second wicket. Bryant and Menzies batted for their scores (21 and 20 respectively), and the total was scored by the whole side was 22.

Upton and District had a very enjoyable outing on Saturday last, when they played their return match with West Malvern, winning easily. The match was a bit fiery, and the ball flew about considerably. The main feature of the match was the bowling of T. V. R. Wilmshurst, who took 10 wickets for 6 runs, the home team being quite unable to cope with his deliveries. Owing to this achievement West Malvern only scored 26 runs, and he had to fight hard for his 10. T. V. R. Wilmshurst and compiled 71 by good cricket. He bowled very well.

Upton and District met with more than their match on Saturday, when they tried conclusions with Ludlow and South Shropshire. The journey to Ludlow was much enjoyed by the Herefordshire men, but the cricket might have been more to their taste. They went in first, and, after beginning brightly, they never recovered, and were all out

for 82, no less than 20 of the total being "extras," and no other individual score reached anything like that total. The Shropshire men, who had been very smart in the field, showed that they knew the way to use a bat, and Leominster were given a time at leather hunting, the like of which they have rarely experienced before, for no less than 119 runs were scored for six wickets. Faircloth batted admirably, and claimed no less than 119 of the total by brilliant cricket. He knocked the bowling all over the field, and scored rapidly. G. W. Marston had 50 to his credit ere he was bowled by Howell, Baker was not beaten when he had scored 47, Foster hit 30 in a very short time, and Leake made 27. The whole of the batting was first-rate, and out of the seven men who went to the wickets for Shropshire, only one failed.

Froome Valley played at Ledbury on Saturday, and they had a strong team in the field. Ledbury won the toss and commenced their innings with Berkeley and Lance, and after the former had made 18 he was bowled by Dent. James was leg before after playing well for 16, and Corington and Davies added 16 and 15 respectively before they were defeated. The other wickets fell cheaply, for

the batsmen could not get on at all with the bowling of Foley and Dent, and the innings closed for 36. Froome Valley started with E. Griffiths and P. E. Bradstock, and runs came freely. The score reached 32 before Griffiths was caught, after making 35 by good cricket. Foster, the Worcester-shire player, came in first wicket down, and started punishing the bowling severely. The score had reached 173 before Bradstock, who had made 67, was caught by James. Foster left at 185, after making 65 in his characteristic style, and then the bowlers soon finished the innings, the net result being 199 runs.

Eastnor were at home to Bromesberrow on Saturday, and won comfortably by means of good cricket, Phillips playing well for 36. Altogether they made 121, and in the face of that total the visitors had little hope of winning the game. They failed in their attempt, and were all out for 29, thanks to the splendid bowling of Winter and Court.

In the Ross League on Saturday, Ross second XI. were in such fine form at home, that they knocked up nearly 200 runs (196) for six wickets, against Bishopwood, the chief scorers being Willden (59), Thomas (74), Price (20), and Meredith (29). The visitors managed to play out time for the loss of six wickets, but their total runs was only 78, and time saved them a very bad defeat.

Ross were so much superior to the Monmouth Grammar School on Saturday, that they dismissed them twice for 82 runs, and made 117 themselves for once out. Ellis bowled marvellously for Ross, and in the two innings took twelve wickets, whilst Jeffery had the best batting average, making 40 runs.

Ruardean, who were on their own ground on Saturday, defeated Mitcheldean by a small margin. The home team batted first and only made 58, Bruce taking six of the wickets. Mitcheldean did not do so well, and were dismissed for 41 runs, Whittington taking six wickets for a very low average.

Upton Bishop were defeated at Perrystone by 27 runs, after a good game. The homesters knocked up 38 runs, mostly with the help of Lord (21), Thornley (31), and Alexander (17), whilst Upton Bishop only replied with 61. It can be said that Thornley won the match, for in addition to making 31 runs, he bowled seven of his opponents.

Colwall met the Royal Grammar School, from Worcester, on Saturday, at the Recreation Ground, Colwall, and after a pleasant game victory came to the home team, for whom Tossell played a brilliant innings of 109, which included nineteen 4's. For the visitors Hobson played a steady game for his 25, and Mr. Chessall hit five 4's in his bright score. Tea was kindly given to both teams by Mr. W. H. Lawton. The school were handicapped by several of their best men being away at Windsor. G. Woodhead took three for 27 runs, and C. Evans one for 1.

Bromyard were severely handicapped in their match on Saturday with Tenbury in having to make the journey without their crack bowler, J. P. Yorall, and consequently suffered a heavy defeat. The visitors' batting was much below standard, and with the exception of Elwell, who kept his end up a good length of time for ten runs the batsmen gave a very miserable display, and were dismissed for 47. Bromyard opened sensationally when Tenbury went in to bat. From Tandy's first ball Morton was given marching orders. This, however, proved to be only "a flash in the pan," for when the brothers Baldwin became associated they sent the ball in all directions, "W.J." lifting Elwell out of the field for six twice in an over. Before a separation could be effected, these two players had won their side the game. Sampson played a delightful game, also being not out at the finish for 23.

A correspondent writes under the headings: Local Cricket League. Does this encourage sport? "I was present at a cricket match at Perrystone Court on Saturday afternoon last, between Perrystone Court and Upton Bishop, in the Ross and District Amateur League Competition. From the commencement of the play it was noticeable that players on both sides were most anxious to secure a victory. Perrystone batted first and scored 88 all out. There was more than an hour and a half left to play, but although (through, I believe, the kindness of General Clive), tea was ready on the ground the home captain led his men at once on to the field ready to continue the game without even allowing the customary ten minutes' interval, and in the space of six minutes from the close of Perrystone's innings two Upton Bishop batsmen were at the wickets. Now what I complain of is the unsatisfactory and unsocial conduct of the home team in leaving the visitors no time to have tea. Tea-time in these village cricket contests has always been to me an enjoyable twenty minutes or so, when players of opposing sides can have a friendly chat on things cricket or otherwise. I take it that where tea is provided it is an "unwritten law" of cricket that an adjournment should

be made for that purpose by both teams, and I think conduct such as I have described does not tend to encourage sport and pleasant games, which is, after all, what we expect in cricket. In closing I may add that I am a supporter of 'The Bishops,' and have always found them a thorough sporting side. Although they have oftentimes tasted the bitterness of defeat they have taken them in the proper spirit, and I am sure can set an example to some teams in that respect. There is nothing of the 'win, tie, or wrangle' about them. The result of this game was that Perrystone won by 27 runs when only three minutes from time."

There is something to be said from the point of view of my tea-loving correspondent, but in first-class spectacular cricket, of which I have been compelled to endure a good deal, the tea interval has a most baneful influence, contributing materially to induce that feeling of "sloppiness" which needs no encouragement among cricketers. Perhaps in the country village it is different, and with an invitation tea waiting it would have been difficult to get me out into the field again without refreshment. But after all is said and done I have more than a sneaking regard for the keenness of Perrystone. Enthusiasm is the very salt of sport and, while there is much to be said against too much of the pot hunting fever being infused into our grand old summer game, a little more interest in the result of a game, such as a league contest invokes, would often be a good thing.

Herefordshire fared rather badly in their fixture with the Newport Club of the Hereford Association on Saturday, losing by 103 runs. The visiting eleven first defended the wickets, and at the luncheon hour had lost four men for 113 runs. Up to this time Grassott had bowled with some success, and two of the Newport "reds" had been dismissed. One, however, in Silverlock, remained, and he owed his return to the wickets after lunch to his lucky stars and to Howdow, the home captain, who failed to hold a simple catch when Silverlock was 33. The seriousness of this mistake was proved by that professional knocking up seven over the century. He packed admirably, and after lunch never gave a chance until he was caught behind the wickets. It is often in such many fears, and is not the first big innings he has scored against Herefordshire. A remarkable feature of the match was the number of extras against Herefordshire, they being no less than 82. In the field the home team were slower than their opponents, and the helplessness of Herefordshire's defeat is attributable to slackness in this respect.

Tuppley and District were at home on Saturday to Holmer, who, unfortunately, only brought a weak team, and were badly beaten. The last ball was sent down, and brought, with a big hit, put the sphere to rest. For Presteign George (pro.) took six wickets for 30 runs, and Stedman four for 33. The feature of the Presteign innings was the brilliant play of George, the professional, who added 92 to the total by means of excellent cricket. In the course of his innings, he only practically gave one chance, and that a hard one, which was not taken, and his innings included a number of threes and fours, and a six. W. Restall came next with 33, which were well compiled and included some vigorous hits, and T. Lewis made twenty not out. M. Kemp (19) was the only other member of the team who reached double figures.

When Ledbury went to face the bowling, Berkeley was caught after making two, and Barratt sent back when he had made 11, but, on James becoming associated with Hayes, runs came freely, and they scored no less than 115 between them, the latter claiming 82. Phillips made 34, and Williams followed up his success with the ball by making 15. For six wickets, 195 runs were on the board.

Ross did splendidly against Monmouth on Saturday, at Ross, beating them very soundly. The home team sent out Thomas and Bevan to face the bowling, and they did very well, Thomas collecting 42 runs in fine style before he was beaten, and Bevan 24. Two men were then got rid of cheaply, but Cutfield stayed until he made 59, at which point the innings was declared closed, Cutfield being still unbeaten. The visitors were the toss, and batted first, but the splendid bowling of Thornely and Lyndon, jun., the home team failed, with the exception of E. A. Baldwin (21) and W. A. Perrystone (9), the total being 31. It must be remembered, however, that Upton Bishop only lost eight men to their opponents' eleven. On Perrystone going in to bat F. G. Phillips and Lyndon shared the bowling, which was very good, the former taking four wickets for nine runs, and the latter five for 22. The finish of the game was very exciting, for on the last man being out in three runs were still required to win. There were hit off by H. Phillips, and a very pleasant game ended in a win for the visitors by the narrow margin of two runs.

A match between Holme Lacy and Allensmore took place at Holme Lacy on Saturday, and resulted in a win for the home team. Menzies bowled well for the home team, and took the last four Allensmore wickets in the final over of the match, and great excitement was evinced when he bowled the last man with the last ball of the match. He took eight wickets for 16 runs. It is not often that a cricket match has such an exciting finish as this one had, and it would undoubtedly be all the better for the game if there were more. Excitement is attractive, and if a game is at all exciting it cannot help being popular. Great interest has been aroused in cricketing circles in Leominster by two incidents which occurred at Burton Court on successive Saturdays. On August 5th Hampton Court visited Burton Court taking with them T. Eckley, of Leominster, a promising bowler. While he was bowling, Mr. Thornely, one of the batsmen, was "backing up" from the bowler's end, and the bowler eventually stumped him by bringing his hand back instead of delivering the ball. On the following Saturday, Leominster visited Burton Court, and they, too, took Eckley with them, and the same thing happened, Mr. Thornely being the victim. "I remember," writes a correspondent "seeing the thing done on the Grange some years ago in a match against Presteigne, Mr. Philip Davies, I believe, being the bowler. There are two opinions about the action. One is that the action is in accordance with the rules of cricket and that the bowler is justified, and the other that although it is in accordance with the rules, that it is an unsportsmanlike way of dismissing an opponent. It would be interesting to know if this is ever done in first-class cricket."

There is no doubt the man is out who is caught out of his ground in the way described. It is not "nice" perhaps, to take a wicket in that way, but if we are going to play the game in that spirit, then the fielding side should not take advantage of the accident to a man who slips while running between the wickets; in fact, all sorts of absurdities would ensue if the little mutual considerations which adorn the game were carried too far.
