INTER-COUNTY POLICE CRICKET.

Wiltshire v. Berkshire.

(commanding the 49th Regimental Dept.), Captain F. L. H. Hillier (Superintendent, Newbury), Mr. D. J. Davis (Maidenhead), Holding (Clewer), Goddard (Wokingham), Maunders (Faringdon), Gibbs (Wantage), Foster (Abingdon), Inspectors Grant (headquarters), Randall (Hungerford), and Haddington (Newbury). Inspector Williams and Superintendent Gamble (Newbury) were unavoidably absent. Major Poulton, after the usual loyal toasts had been honoured, proposed the health of the Wiltshire Constabulary, and the Royal Engineers, and the two forces, which he hoped would long continue. He also thanked the officers of the 49th Regimental District, and especially Colonel Barker and Major D. B. Maurice, D.S.O., for kindly offering the use of the Barracks Cricket Grounds to the benefit of that day's match, and referred to the good feelings existing between the military and police of the district. Captain Ilewyns and Colonel Barker mutually responded. The band of the Royal Engineers gave a selection of music, which was greatly enjoyed. During the afternoon Mrs. A. F. Poulton and Mrs. D. B. Maurice visited the ground to witness the match, and a number of officers and constables of the force, their wives and other relatives, and the Newbury Borough Police also being present. Everything possible was done by the officers and non-commissioned officers and men at the barracks for the comfort of the visitors. The Berkshire Police, having won the toss, decided to take the field, and the first wicket was made by P.C.'s Clayton and Wiggin, who made 53 runs before being separated. P.C.'s Sparks, Tubb, and Thompson also did good service in making 21, 11, and 13 respectively, and the innings closed with a total of 65 runs. Sergeant Shaw (15), Inspector Wells (16), and P.C.
