MINOR COUNTIES' CHAMPIONSHIP.
 LINCOLNSHIRE V. HERTFORDSHIRE.
 SENSATIONAL FINISH.

[BY "REFEREE"]

It seems to be the fate of county cricket matches at Grantham not to have a full two days' play. Generally it is the weather that causes a curtailment, rain, as a rule, knocking off one day out of two. But this year the elements were kind indeed, Thursday being the height of perfection for cricket, the sun shining from a gloriously blue sky, and a welcome breeze tempering the heat. And yet only a day and less than an hour's play has been witnessed, the cause this time being the inability of the batsmen to withstand the onslaughts of the bowlers, the latter being backed up by almost faultless fielding. When play started, no one would have dreamed that we should see three complete innings in the day closed, to say nothing of a further four Lincolnshire wickets. But so it was! Right along, the "stands" were almost of no account, and up to luncheon—that period which is often but preliminary to the great events—no less than fourteen wickets had been captured—the whole of the visiting team having passed through the mill, together with three Lincolnshires. And the pace of the downfall was very fairly maintained all the day through. The wicket was dry, and the manner of the outpoint is indicated by the fact that the first seven men out were all caught, the lead being given by A. E. Gibson with a right hand catch which dismissed A. K. of the same name. Fielding at point, A. E. with difficulty reached the ball with his right hand, and though he fell in the attempt, he held it securely. This was with the score at eight. At 37 three others had to follow (one catch by Pullein being finely taken), 2 runs later saw Wright, the tallest individual (6ft. 4in.) on the ground, return to the pavilion, and in short time the whole team were out, with 58 runs on, and these had taken something like an hour-and-a-half to get. The bowling of Day and Hallam brought them most excellent figures.

Some critics on the ground might have thought that the wickets were given away somewhat cheaply, but when the Lincolnshire men took up the batting it was at once seen that runs were not only hard to get, but danger was always ahead. The very first ball accounted for Pullein, and though Weigall's second ball was forthwith despatched to the boundary, there were only 10 on when Ward fell to a fine catch in the long field. Edwards followed without adding to the score, and at 19 Floyd had to go, at which point the luncheon interval was taken—a not unwelcome break in the rapid progress of the game. The resumption was not auspicious, for Weigall and Day had been dismissed and the figures were no higher than 33, but the next stand promised better, W. E. Thompson, the captain, and Riley being together until 65. Next, however, came an even better partnership, Riley and Hallam not only putting on the runs with apparently greater ease, but maintaining a good defence. From 65 to 106 was a big jump on a day like this, and when Riley had to go, just one short of his 50, he received the applause he well merited. Eight hits for 4's attested his vigorous batting. The end of the innings was then in sight, and at 112, with a lead of 54, came down Lincolnshire's last wicket. The visitors' bowling had been decidedly good, in fact throughout the day fine bowling and fielding were always in evidence.

When, at Hertfordshire's second attempt, two good men were out and only 7 runs on, we began to wonder whether the match would last out even one day! However, better things prevailed. Cowley proved the stay of his side, and his innings of 67 was a decidedly masterful one, obtained at a time when such a stand was simply invaluable. With Titchmarsh, Shelford, Wood, and Lemoine each getting well on into the teens of runs, the very respectable total of 158 was raised ere the fall of the last wicket, the resolute tackling of the situation by the last three men just landing the game into the second day.

There was just under an hour and a half left for play. In the ordinary way, the necessary runs for Lincolnshire to win—105—might have been knocked off, but not to-day! On the other hand, there was the probability that the eleven might be got out, in view of the previous procession, and, therefore, the period was not without interest. Any way, with only 4 runs on, Pullein was out to a good catch by A. K. Gibson. The County Captain followed at 22, and 11 runs later Day had to depart! Then, fortunately, ensued a better stand, Weigall and Ward remaining together until the board showed 58 runs, when Ward had to go. With 3 runs added came the call of time, the position then being that Lincolnshire required 44 runs to win, and 6 wickets in hand.

The attendance had been very fair indeed, amongst those present being Dr. Norman (St. Alban's, Secretary to the Hexis Club), Mr. R. Whitton and Mr. S. T. Watkins (Treasurer and Secretary respectively of the Lincolnshire C.C.), Capt. Ellison, Mr. G. F. Wells-Cole, Mr. E. T. Cooke, &c.

What little cricket we had yesterday to finish off the match was a point beyond the interesting; it was positively exciting, and every ball bowled was watched with anxiety. Lincolnshire's score stood at 61, and Burton's fifth delivery accounted for Weigall's dismissal without the addition of a run. The partnership of Edwards and Riley realised 13, when Edwards was smartly snapped at the wicket by Lemoine, whose really fine wicket-keeping was one of the features of the match. At 80 Riley was out, two runs later Hallam had to go, and at 84 Floyd departed to a good catch in the long field by Gibson. So when Allan

joined Gibson 21 runs were still required to win—a tall order at this particular match. But each batsman was particularly careful as to his defence, and with odd runs coming here and there, the position took a turn from hopeless to hopeful. Just when a hit for three would have settled the affair in favour of Lincolnshire, however, an appeal for lbw against Allan was successful, and thus Hertfordshire won by two runs. As on Thursday, the day was brilliantly fine, and a pity it is that less than one hour's play should have been experienced in such delightful weather. Details of the game:—
