Richardson (13) together, the score was 186 for four wickets at the interval, play having been in progress roughly two hours.

The run-getting proceeded merrily when play resumed, Gilman reaching his 50 after batting an hour and a quarter, with the total 220, while 275 Richardson also reached the half-century. Stanger's bowling here was proving quite expensive, the batsmen getting it away frequently to the boundary, while several hard drives were stopped at the line by the Durham fieldsmen, who were working splendidly in the field. Gilman was scoring rapidly and batting with delightful freedom, when requiring only seven to complete the century he was out to a catch at leg by Hendren on the third ball in the second over sent down by Turnbull, the Durham City professional holding a very hard stroke. In his splendid and faultless innings, which occupied him a shade under two hours, Gilman hit fifteen 4's and two 3's. The partnership had realised 185, and with a score of 200 for the fall of half their wickets the Northumbrians were faring exceedingly well.

S. Anderson now came in, and 40 runs were added for the sixth wicket fell, Richardson being clean bowled by Cairns, having been in an hour and forty minutes for 74, in which there were seven 4's, and which the only chance to be urged was a very good one to leg to Adamson when 27, off Hendren. Anderson was seventh out at 360, to a good catch mid-off by C. Brooks, off the bowling of Cairns, and the end of the innings was not long in coming. E. Milne, with 24 scored, being bowled by Hendren at 385, T. Ullathorne being clean bowled in the next ball from the Durham City professional, and Elsey two runs later. The innings lasted three hours and three-quarters.

The beginning of Durham's innings in response to so good a score was sensational in the extreme and entirely unexpected after the batting successes of the Northumbrians. At 16 C. Brooks was clean bowled by Skinner, who was bowling at a great pace, and at the same total H. Brooks was caught at wicket by Ullathorne off the bowling of Milne. A. L. Scott-Owen was also clean bowled by Skinner, and two runs later G. P. Gore was bowled by Milne, the wickets being down in a quarter of an hour for

A fifth wicket might have been secured with the fall of 35, Skinner failing to hold a hard return in Hendren. Bradford and Hendren advanced to a score of 101 before a separation was effected, Gillespie then making a splendid catch at mid-off, bringing back some ten yards and taking the ball in one hand and bringing about the dismissal of Hendren off the bowling of Norbury, who at 55 had been on in place of Milne, while Skinner had given way to Elsey. The retiring batsman had scored 44, including seven 4's and three 3's.

Bradford was now partnered by C. Y. Adamson, and another profitable stand was made, the score being taken to 172 before Adamson was out leg fore wicket to the bowling of Milne, with 30 scored, and another wicket was captured before the resumption of play, J. Turnbull being smartly taken in the slips by Milne off the bowling of Skinner, Bradford being still not out with 64 scored by capital stroke. So far the Durham innings has been in progress a shade under two hours.

Durham County succeeded in drawing their match with Northumberland, yesterday, on the County Ground, Jesmond, but by reason of a lead on the first innings, the majority of 85 being not nearly so large as appeared probable after the first day's play, the Northumbrians have commenced the season with the gaining of three points in the Minor Counties Championship.

In the uphill task facing them to avert a defeat, the Dunelmians made so excellent a recovery from their rather disastrous experience of the opening day, when seven of their wickets had fallen for 173 runs, in response to a total by the Northumbrians of 387, that at the close of another interesting day's play they were actually only 85 runs behind, with two men, in Harrison and Hendren, well set, and seven wickets to fall.

Dull and comparatively cool weather in comparison to the Indian summer-like conditions of the preceding day, was associated with the resumption of play at eleven o'clock, when again there was an excellent company present, the attendance in the afternoon, when the weather brightened, being nearly four thousand, and a record for the ground on a Whit-Tuesday.

T. A. Bradford, the not-out, with 64 scored, was accompanied to the wickets by T. Kinch, and runs came steadily against a frequently changed attack. Bradford gained the only individual century in the game when the total had been advanced to 227. The desired separation might have come when the score was 254, and the follow-on still not averted, Elsey, in the slips, failing to hold a fast one-handed chance by Kinch off the bowling of Norbury, the batsman's score then being 28. When the separation time was brought to a close, 14 runs were still wanted to avert the follow-on, the score being 275.

Bradford, out to a catch at mid-on by Anderson in the first over sent down by Elsey yesterday morning, had been at the wickets altogether two hours and three-quarters, and the only chance to be urged against the steady and admirable innings of the left-hander was a difficult one at the wickets on Monday evening when he had scored 11. His chief hits were twelve 4's and one 3. A. L. Scott-Owen, in with Kinch, the runs to save Durham following on were soon gained. At 290, Scott-Owen, stepping right out to a tempting delivery from Gilman, should have been stumped, but he did not profit much by the favour, for four runs later he was caught by Anderson on the leg boundary off the same bowling. With a 2, a 6, and a single, R. Cairns reached the other end, where he was bowled by Elsey, and in a minority of 85 Durham's innings closed, after being in progress two hours and forty minutes. In Kinch's steadily-played 49 not out, there were five strokes to the boundary.

The Northumbrians had half an hour's batting before the luncheon interval. Norbury and C. F. Stanger-Leathes opening the innings. Norbury had scored only 7, and the total was 20, when his dismissal came in an exactly similar manner to that

on Monday, Gore snapping him at the wickets of Harrison's bowling. J. S. Nesbit assisted to raise the score to 33 by the time of the adjournment, but a run later, when play was resumed, was clean bowled by Harrison with 23 scored, and only a single had been added when J. Gilman, without a run made, was bowled by Hendren. Now partnered by Richardson, Stanger-Leathes, with the total a run short of the century, reached his fifty with a single, following a drive for six out of the ground off Harrison, having been at the wickets an hour.

The partnership for the fourth wicket realised 82 runs, and raised the score to 147, when Stanger-Leathes was caught by Bradford at mid-on off the bowling of Cairns, who had gone on at 111 for Harrison. An hour and a half at the wickets, Stanger-Leathes, in playing most attractive cricket again in making 67, hit one 6, eight 4's, one 3, and eleven 2's.

Joined by S. Anderson, Richardson scored freely, and when fifth out at 178, caught in the slips by Harrison off the bowling of Cairns, had compiled 58 by stylish cricket in fifty-five minutes, with one 6 and six 4's his principal strokes. Anderson and Gillespie carried the score quickly to 240, the latter being then out, and three runs later Anderson and C. M. Skinner were also dismissed, the innings, after lasting two hours and twenty minutes, being shortly afterwards declared closed with eight wickets down for 221.

The Northumbrians were leading by 206 runs when the declaration was made, and Durham, going in with two hours and a quarter remaining for play, had only a draw in view, and they succeeded in effecting this admirably. C. Y. Adamson and Bradford ran up 60 for the first wicket by steady cricket, though Adamson never settled down to his usual stylish batting. Bradford, with 36 scored, was then bowled by Milne, and at 76 T. Kinch was bowled by Norbury, who also upset Adamson's wickets at 88, the innings then being just over an hour old—an interesting position.

However, no further success attended the efforts of the Northumberland bowlers, Harrison and Henderson now becoming associated, and, while taking no undue risks, they at times hit the frequently changed bowling to all parts of the ground. In brief, they ran the score up to 322 without either being dismissed, Harrison in his innings of 70 hitting one 6, eight 4's, and one 3; and Henderson in his 62 making chief strokes of one 6, several 4's, and three 3's. rank him just below Hayward. I have not noticed a reference to the fact that every batsman scored double figures for Surrey in their match with Hampshire. So far as I am aware, this is only the tenth time in a Championship match in which the eleven batsmen have each run into double figures. Seldom too, has a side notched 499 runs without a century contribution.

It was Hayward's eighth century against Notts; is this a record? Yet Notts won the match, although none of their batsmen scored a talent-money innings, nor, for that matter, did the other ten Surreyites. Are our leading batsmen feeling the effect of this prolonged drought? Yet if a batsman wants to keep in perfect health, he has but to score a succession of big innings under a tropical sun; he will have no need for Antipon or even a Turkish Bath. With grounds red-hot well nigh, and as hard as adamant, fielding all the day long must be worse than the tread-mill. You can water the wickets, but not the entire playing field. When will the longed-for rain come?

Yorkshire and Worcestershire won both their matches last week, and Lancashire lost both theirs, Kent took only three points out of Hampshire, thanks to Remnant's surprise century. But during the week Kent batsmen scored five centuries. I have already referred to Hardinge's double triumph. I will simply add here that his has been a somewhat odd career. He had his first County trial match when he was only sixteen years old—just one match, and against Lancashire in 1902, when he scored 2 not out and 6. Very little was seen of him until 1907 when in May he scored his first century—129 against Sussex. In 1908 three centuries came from his bat—127 against Derbyshire, and 153 and 126 against Essex. It is certainly very remarkable that his next century was his double of last week after an interval of three seasons. Will Kent play him regularly when Carr and Mason are available? Whom of the present team are to be left out? Yorkshire at present are keeping close to Kent's heels, but Kent is our choice for the Championship. No other county has so many sterling batsmen. Lancashire without Tyldesley, Surrey without Hayward, Yorkshire without Hirst, would be shorn of half their strength; but Kent have at least half-a-dozen batsmen who at one time or another are certain to knock up a century. Hutchings may be off-colour, but that makes no difference. Just look at their match at Old Trafford; Humphreys failed to score in the first innings, but Seymour quickly made that alright; in the second innings Humphreys helped to win the match when no other batsman did much. Day got a century against Hampshire, but he did not play at Old Trafford. I don't like contrasting the counties; every county must play its own natural game. Yet at Southampton Kent scored 359 in three hours and a quarter, whilst at Trent Bridge Notts took 4 hours and a quarter to make 224. Of course one knows that Surrey's bowling is stronger than Hampshire's at the present time. But Kent score rapidly in all their matches. And the explanation is their nursery at Tonbridge. If it be true, as stated by a Lancashire reporter, that Lancashire fielders missed no less than ten chances in the Kent match, and chances given by the batsmen who made big scores, then no wonder Kent beat them; and Lancashire deserved the thrashing they got.

Down at the Oval I met an old friend who was present to support his own county, Hampshire. He told me a capital story which was quite new to me. The North were playing the South at Tunbridge Wells in 1875. (By the by, there were no less than seven North v. South matches played that year, viz., at Lords', Prince's, Nottingham, Hull, Huddersfield, Loughborough, and Tunbridge Wells.) It was reported that more than one of these matches was run by a publican as a speculation, W.G. being the great attraction. But let that pass: here's the story. My friend's memory is very exact, for he reminded me that in this match Allan Hill, the famous fast Yorkshire bowler, got the wickets of W.G., his brother Fred, and Charwood, the Sussex crack batsman at that time, in his first over. The match was arranged on a gala style, and in an adjoining field were all sorts of amusements. Cocoa-nut shying was one. In the luncheon interval some of the players strolled into the field, Fred Morley, the left-hand bowler of Notts and M.C.C., being one of them. Morley at once paid a penny for three shies at the cocoa-nuts and brought down

three nuts. A second penny had similar results. So had a third, a fourth, a fifth and a sixth. He never missed the mark once. The proprietor looked aghast; things were getting desperate; his entire stock of nuts would disappear. At last he exclaimed: "I don't know who you are, but you must be possessed. No more, thank you. Here, I'll give you half a crown and one nut and we'll cry quits." Needless to add that Morley was perfectly satisfied with the proposed terms; as he said, he knew what to do with the money, but not with the eighteen nuts he had won. Soon after hearing this I strolled round the Oval during the interval. Imagine my surprise at seeing a conjuror standing on the path with a small table and a crowd of spectators on the terrace watching his manipulation of coins which suddenly vanished. It was a very clever and most harmless entertainment, for which he received a capful of coppers. But one did not expect to see it on a county cricket ground. Had he obtained permission? I noticed that he left the ground before the game was resumed: so evidently he was not on cricket bent.
