**BERKS' FINE START.**

**CENTURY BY SHOOSMITH.**

The Berkshire Cricket Club had a most successful season last summer, while it secured the championship of the Southern Counties of the Minor Counties competition, but the start made on Wednesday and Thursday in Bletchley Park against Buckinghamshire seems to indicate that that success is to be followed up well this season.

Berkshire won the toss, and put Buckinghamshire in first. This policy worked, for the home team found Hawksworth irresistible, only three of their players securing double figures. Mr. P. C. Frith and Mr. M. Wright were the only two who made anything of a stand. The former obtained 54 and the last-mentioned 33. The innings closed for 153, Hawksworth coming out with an average of 7 for 27—a truly remarkable performance. Berks at once began to score, and Mr. Bennett and Shoosmith hit out freely. Shoosmith, who is the professional at the Reading Sports Ground, has had a splendid season, and it is satisfactory that he has kept up his form for the county matches. His century included two 6's and thirteen 4's, and although he was missed once or twice he gave an almost faultless display. Like each of the other Berks men to bat (with the exception of Dr. Woodburn) he succumbed to a catch. When the score was at 400 for 6 Sir Charles Nepean applied the closure. The Berks batting was remarkable for its consistency. Brougham 28, G. Belcher 46, Dr. Woodburn 6, G. M. Bennett 59, Shoosmith 123, H. 27, Sir C. Y. Nepean 45, not out, Captain Rowe 32. Included in the Berks team were H. Brougham, who this year secured his "blow" for Oxford, and hit 60 in the Varsity match, and J. B. Lockhart, the Cambridge University "googly" bowler.
