DEVON v. KENT II.

FIVE INNINGS BY F. H. CARROLL.
 This Minor Counties' Championship match commenced at Exeter yesterday. Devon made two alterations from the side which lost to Surrey, H. G. Freeman and W. F. Start standing down for B. W. Burdett and R. J. Russell, of Sidmouth. Kent included six professionals. On a good wicket Kent took first knock, but from the first ball of the match Davies smartly stumped Collins. Another wicket fell with the score at 11, but K. Barlow and L. H. Troughton improved the situation, adding 50 runs before being separated, and then Christian bowled Troughton. R. Knight bowled for Wreford at 70, and in his second over dismissed Barlow, who had played a patient innings for 48. Kent found runs difficult to obtain, the Devon fielders being very keen. At lunch seven wickets were down, and on the resumption three overs were sufficient to finish off the Kent innings, which closed for 186 runs.

Devon commenced their innings in a far more disastrous manner than the hop county, for Morfee, a fast bowler, bowled Knight in his first delivery. F. E. Carroll joined Captain Bassalatte, and 50 runs were added when the Barnouth man was brilliantly caught at mid-off by Troughton. E. W. Burdett was stumped taken behind the wicket from Morfee's next ball, and at 11 R. J. Russell was bowled by Kent's fast bowler. Light was caught at point by Barlow off Preston, and Shelley's wicket was taken by Morfee without either adding to the score. Morfee sent down a rather short-pitched ball which jumped, and Davies, in attempting to hit it, received a blow on the head, and it was some little time before he was able to return. Carroll and Davies batted well, cutting and driving in fine style, the former soon reaching his half-century. With the total at 135 Davies fell a victim to Tuff, his innings of 45 including eight 4's. Major Garratt next partnered Carroll, and Kent's total was passed with a splendid drive by Garratt, but immediately after Carroll concluded his grand innings of 98, being caught at mid-on by Hickmott off Morfee. During his effort he hit no less than sixteen 4's, and gave no chance. The score then stood at 188. Garratt was soon after clean bowled by Morfee. After nearly 2 1/2 hours' batting Devon registered 200. The home team were all out for 207, having passed Kent's total by 21.

Kent again took to the wickets at 5.30, and Barlow and Troughton faced the bowling of Christian and Wreford. Troughton was caught in the slips when the score stood at 37. The half-century was registered without further loss, and when stumps were drawn Kent had scored 105 for two wickets. Scores:—

DEVON v. KENT II.

DEVONIANS DEFEATED BY 105 RUNS.
 Continuing this Minor Counties' match at Exeter yesterday, in splendid weather, Kent resumed their second innings with Capt. Barlow and Collins, two wickets having fallen overnight for 105 runs. Barlow, who played a fine innings for 61, was caught in the deep field by Shelley off Knight. The score was then 156 and F. N. Tuff accompanied Collins, but the former, with only 8 to his credit, was neatly caught behind the wickets off Wreford. Adding four runs more to the total, Hodge was smartly stumped by Davies. After nearly an hour's batting the double century was registered and Collins also attained his 50. Wickets fell rather cheaply. Morfee was taken in the slips for one, and immediately after the 250 was telegraphed. Collins was clean bowled by Wreford. His innings of 77 included eleven 4's. Roberts fell a victim to the same bowler with 23 to his credit. The amateur's bowling was quite up to the mark, and he was responsible for Hickmott's wicket. The home field was getting rather slack and runs came fairly freely. Preston and Smith, the last pair, made a praiseworthy stand, carrying the score from 185 to 315, when the wicket-keeper smartly caught Preston, and Kent finished with 294 runs to the good.

Major Garratt and Capt. Christian opened the second innings for Devon, and after Morfee had delivered three no balls the interval for luncheon arrived. On resuming, Capt. Christian was given out leg before, having put on 15 runs. Much was expected from Carroll, who in the second innings against Surrey knocked out 170, and also made 96 in the first innings on Wednesday, but Morfee this time clean bowled him after he had only made one run. Major Garratt was playing very steadily when, with 20 to his credit, he had his off stump removed by Morfee. The home county had three wickets down for 48, but with the partnership of Burdett and Knight the outlook began to brighten. At 78, however, Burdett fell a victim to Hickmott when he had scored 15. The century was reached by Light with a fast drive to the boundary. Two wickets fell very cheaply, both Knight and Davies being caught in the slips. Light had just passed his half century when he was out by a stinger which fell into the hands of Barlow, off Hickmott. The Devon innings concluded for 186, and Kent thus won by 105 runs. Scores:—

their opponents. There has been no such amateur since the day of A. G. Steel. He is a rapid scorer—witness 101 in 105 minutes against Yorkshire last week—and yet, unlike most men who use the long handle, he seems to give few chances. He is the only batsman for many years to notch a century in each county match of the same year against Yorkshire. W. G., of course, did it, in 1874; so did Cranston, also for Gloucestershire, in 1890; MacLaren for Lancashire in 1899, and Lionel Palairet for Somerset in 1901.

Hayward's 202 was in striking contrast to his 170 not out against Essex in May. The latter was the most perfect innings I have seen this year. He has two styles: when much depends on him he plays every ball as it should be played by a master, and scores at the rate of about 30 runs an hour. But when, as against Derbyshire last week, other batsmen are in form, his runs come at the rate of 50 runs an hour, and he is evidently bent on enjoying himself: having done so he gets out, as if he had had enough for the time and longed for a rest. His first-class centuries now number 95; surely the century of centuries is now in sight. Fry has scored 83, Tyldesley 72, Denton 52, Warner 50, Perrin and Hirst 49, Quaipe 45, Jessop 45. It is practically certain that W. G.'s record—126—will hold its place for many years, if not for all time. I may here say that Perrin has had only 18 innings this year, and five of them have run into three figures.

What delightful matches we had last week-end; of three of them it may be said that they were "anybody's match" at the close of the second day. Would Kent beat Surrey? Would Warwickshire snatch their first victory over Yorkshire since 1904? Could Lancashire succumb to Sussex? Seldom has there been so little to choose between the rival teams when a match was half over. Thus, Surrey scored 218, Kent 245; Warwickshire 311 to Yorkshire's 310; whilst only 4 runs separated Sussex and Lancashire. In the latter match the value of an insignificant innings was never more in evidence. When the last man, Cook, went in Lancashire wanted 24 to bring them level with Sussex; Cook's 8 not out resulted in a partnership of 28, which just put his side ahead and made them certain of at least three points. Last year the same batsman stayed in an hour for 3 runs, and so enabled Lancashire to win a wonderful match by two wickets against Notts. By-the-by, I note that certain persons are complaining of Lancashire's bad luck in their previous match against Essex, when they declared in the second innings—412 for 5—and would have won had not time interposed. Somebody has suggested that 3 points should be given to each county. What nonsense! Laws are made to be obeyed. Lancashire had only themselves to blame; they had no business to stop short at 181 in the first hands, seeing that they had choice of innings and a perfect wicket too. Essex fairly earned three points by their first display, although they owed their lead of 134 entirely to the centuries from the bats of Fane and Perrin. Some day we may restrict matches to one innings aside; until then, a lead on the first innings ought to be rewarded when a match is not played to a finish.

Let us draw the veil over Yorkshire's second innings against Warwickshire, and congratulate Field on about the best bit of bowling he has ever done. It is pleasanter to have a look in at Trent Bridge on the same day where John Gunn and Payton reeled off 266 in just over two hours, the former then proceeding to dismiss Jessop's team in double-quick time. Notts. are the great batting side of the year; never before have the Gunns, Hardstaff and Payton been in such fine form in the same season. One or other of them must tour in Australia. John Gunn is a useful bowler, but would he prove as handy in the field as his brother or Hardstaff? If Notts. had only one of their old bowlers back again—Grundy, Wootton, McIntyre, Alfred Shaw, J. C. Shaw, or Attewell—they would be the Champion County again. By his wonderful scoring against Gloucestershire—94 and 150 not out—John Gunn raised his season's average 9 points. The old time-marking days at Trent Bridge have gone; no county plays brighter cricket to-day. I rejoice, for in the past Notts. have perhaps done more for cricket than any other county, if only in the number of bowlers they sent all over the country.
