DORSET v. BERKSHIRE.

The opening fixture of the Dorset County Cricket Club in the Minor Counties' Championship (Southern Division) commenced at the Dorchester Recreation Ground on Monday, when their opponents were Berkshire, who secured the divisional championship last year. The weather was ideal for cricket, it being bright and warm; but the attendance of the general public was disappointingly small. A representative team had been selected for the home county and was under the captaincy of Mr. C. P. Goodden. The Berks eleven, captained by Sir C. Y. Nepean, was identically the same as that which gained such a decisive victory over Devon on Saturday, a victory due not a little to the effectiveness of their googly bowler Lockhart, who has been chosen to represent Scotland against the Indian XI. on Thursday.

Winning the toss, the visitors took first knock on the excellent wicket that had been prepared by T. Woolley, groundman to the Dorchester Cricket Club. The first pair of batsmen were H. Brougham and Shoosmith. The former, a stylish batsman, scored with freedom all round the wicket, and was not dismissed until he had placed 64 to his credit. Shoosmith did not reproduce the brilliant form that he showed against Devon, but creditable scores were made by the subsequent batsmen, so that the respectable total of 199 for six wickets had been compiled when the lunch interval arrived. Luncheon was partaken of in the pavilion, and was served by Mr. G. T. Smith, of the Junction Hotel. On the resumption the Berkshire innings was finished off with unexpected rapidity, for with the addition of but 16 runs all the side were out. This was due to some splendid bowling by Woolley, who had the distinction of performing the "bat trick." He first dismissed Lockhart, and with his two following deliveries he clean bowled Wichelow and Hawksworth was out lbw. Woolley's success was recognised alike by the players and spectators with the heartiest of applause, and by his effective trundling the visitors score was much smaller than at one time appeared probable.

Dorset opened their first innings with T. H. Fowler and J. W. Hardy, and in the first over, with but one run on the board, Hardy was out leg before wicket to Belcher's bowling. The incoming batsman, Knight, did not long survive him, for he mistimed a "googly" sent down by Lockhart and was bowled. Fowler was then joined by the Rev. W. H. Arundell, and for a few overs the game proceeded quietly, the batsmen being unable to get the ball beyond the fieldsmen, particularly when Lockhart was bowling. Playing brilliant cricket the batsmen gradually assumed the upper hand, and as the result of little over half-an-hour's play the 50 was hoisted. Fowler's hitting was especially clean and forcible, and both he and his partner earned frequent applause for their smart running between the wickets. Not long after the 50 was signalled a double change was tried in the bowling, Hawksworth being substituted for Belcher and Woodburn for Lockhart. This kept down the rate of scoring, and in Woodburn's third over Hawksworth, holding at point, missed an easy chance of catching Fowler, who in the next over survived an appeal for stumping. Commendatory mention must be made of Todd's smartness behind the wickets. The next noteworthy incident was a lofty hit for six by Fowler into the cemetery, Woodburn being the bowler. This had the effect of Lockhart being again requisitioned, and from his first ball Fowler narrowly escaped being stumped, while four balls later the Rev. W. H. Arundell was out leg before wicket, after contributing a meritorious score of 25. The hoisting of the 100 after an hour and twenty minutes play synchronised with the early dismissal of Gordon, four wickets being then down. Crismiss came in to partner Fowler, who was batting with the utmost confidence and freedom, but in his fourth over Crismiss was out lbw to Lockhart, who with his next ball clean bowled Patey. There was considerable amusement among the spectators whether Lockhart would execute the Dorset bowler's (Woolley's) success and secure the hat trick, but the Dorset captain, who was the next batsman, quickly set this at rest by sending the first ball he received to the boundary. Goodden and Fowler both helped the score along, but with the total at 135 a great disaster befell Dorset, Fowler being

smartly stumped off Lockhart's bowling. His valuable score of 86 was recognised by the spectators with hearty applause. Harrison signalled his appearance at the wickets by sending a delivery from Lockhart into the cemetery, and after a merry play of 14 he succumbed to a beautiful ball from Hawksworth, whose next ball spread-eagled Greenhill's wickets. Dorset's score was then 154 for 9. Woolley, the last man in, kept his end up while his captain opened his shoulders at the bowling, and the innings eventually closed at 5.20 for 172, Berkshire thus securing a useful lead of 43. As will be seen from the analysis Lockhart came out with the excellent record of seven wickets for 86 runs.

Following the tea interval the visitors commenced their second innings with Brougham and Shoosmith to the bowling of Woolley and Patey, and by attractive cricket they carried the score to 26, when a change in the bowling proved successful, Cummins securing Shoosmith's wicket for a score of 16. He was succeeded by Belcher, who was clean bowled by Cummins after scoring two. The same bowler with a good ball accounted for the dismissal of Strange, whose contribution of 10 was chiefly obtained by glances to leg. No other wicket fell before the drawing of stumps, the score then being 59 for three wickets, Berkshire being thus 102 runs on.

Play was resumed at 11.30 on Tuesday morning in dull weather, and in the presence of but few spectators. Brougham continued to bat in attractive style, and his retirement was not brought about until he had exceeded the half-century by two. He had an excellent partner in Bennett, to whom fell the honour of being the top scorer in the match, his score reaching 88. Notwithstanding frequent changes in the bowling, no fewer than six bowlers being called upon, the Berkshire men passed their first innings score, and with a well-played 39 by Woodburn and a stylish not out innings of 47 by Wichelow the total reached 200. Dorset were thus left with the formidable task of making over 300 runs to win the match. This they failed to accomplish, although they are to be complimented upon a plucky effort. As in the first innings, Fowler was again the star performer with a characteristic score of 64, and with two-figure contributions by six of the other batsmen the home eleven were credited with a total of 232. A keenly fought and interesting match thus resulted in a victory for Berkshire by 99 runs. In the second innings the wily Lockhart was again in evidence, and his record of 13 wickets for 164 runs for the whole match is a proof of the effectiveness of his googlies.

A FOURTH WIN.

Dorset gave Berkshire a closer game on Monday and Tuesday than was anticipated, but a victory by 99 runs is very satisfactory. Most of the Berkshire batsmen made runs, but the feature of the game was the fine display by that stylish bat G. G. M. Bennett who in the second innings made his best score for Berkshire this season, viz. 88. Last season "G.G." scored over 600 runs for the royal county and for several seasons he has been a mainstay of the county batting. H. Brougham, the Oxford University batsman has developed into a very fine player, and scores of 64 and 52 were credited to him. Wichelow may be gratified at his 47 not out in the second innings, thus justifying his inclusion. Dorset made a good fight of it, praise being especially due to Fowler, who put up scores of 56 and 64. In bowling Berkshire were largely indebted to J. Lockhart's "goggles," the Cambridge 'varsity bowler capturing altogether 12 wickets, so that he has now taken 20 wickets for the county. Belcher and Hawksworth had four each. Berkshire's run of success should cause additional interest to be centred on the return matches at the County ground, Reading, starting next Monday.

SOME GENEROUS SUPPORTERS.

Berkshire, who did so well last year in the Minor Counties Championship, are now playing at the top of their form, having beaten Bucks, Cornwall, Devon, and Dorset on their present tour. The matches at Reading, which are advertised, will commence on Bank Holiday. Teams will be selected from the following players: Sir C. Y. Nepean (captain), G. G. M. Bennett, H. Brougham, G. Belcher, E. Garnett, Captain Hill, J. H. B. Lockhart, H. P. Morris, A. J. Murdoch, F. E. Rowe, Captain E. F. Rowe, W. Y. Woodburn, H. F. Willocks, Hawksworth, Shoosmith, and Wichelow. Owing to the poor support of the public last year the club was faced with a deficit of £26, and the following gentlemen have kindly sent donations to wipe off this deficit: Mr. J. H. A FURTHER VICTORY.

On Monday and Tuesday Berkshire were engaged at Dorchester, where Dorset furnished the opposition, and after a stiff struggle the Royal County succeeded in winning this, the fifth match of the reel. Once again Berkshire batted first, and ran up a total of 215, H. Brougham being top scorer with 54. Dorset replied with 172. The Berkshire second innings realised 290, G. G. M. Bennett having the bad fortune to narrowly miss a century. A feature of the innings was the success of the young local professional Whichelow, who justified his inclusion by scoring 47 not out. Requiring 333 runs to win, Dorset put up a gallant fight, but they were beaten by 89 runs. J. H. B. Lockhart was the most successful Berkshire bowler, and during the course of the match he captured 12 wickets. Full score:—
