**CRICKET.**

**MINOR COUNTIES CHAMPIONSHIP**

**KENT v. BUOKS.**

On Monday and Tuesday local cricket enthusiasts had the special privilege of witnessing second class county cricket at Folkestone. On the Folkestone Club's ground Kent's second eleven and Buckinghamshire met in the Minor Counties Championship (south and east). The weather being all that could be desired, the match should have attracted a large number of spectators, but the attendance was very small in comparison with the importance of the fixture. Kent was represented by a strong team, the players including Morfee, Preston, Jennings, and L. H. W. Troughton, all of whom have played for the first eleven this year. The game began at 11.30, Kent batting. Collings and Jennings went in first, but they were soon separated, Jennings being caught by P. J. Paravicini. The wicket fell for 16 runs. Snowdon joined Collings, and these two carried the score to 50. A good stand was made by Troughton and Snowdon, who knocked up 112 runs, so that at the fall of the third wicket Kent had 162 to their credit. Snowdon made 69 and Troughton 71. There was another period of bright cricket with Powell and Hosie batting, the pair carrying the score to 231. Hosie was the next to be dismissed, his total being 21. Powell made a longer stay, and scored 46 runs. Morfee was caught for 5, and Roberts for 8. Hickmott, however, batted splendidly, his 41 not out being very useful. Preston and Smith made low scores. Altogether Kent obtained 321 runs, which made Buckinghamshire's chances of winning rather small. Scoring was somewhat slow at the start, but was very fast at the finish.

Bucks. went in about 4.30. Morfee and Hickmott bowled, and Jennison had only made two runs when his wicket was taken by Morfee, who sent down some very fast balls. Franklin partnered Ross and the pair promised to do well. Both were batting well, when Franklin was caught by Collins, the second wicket falling for 17. Ross was subsequently caught by Snowdon, his contribution being 25 runs. Wright played very cautiously and was still in when stumps were drawn. He made the highest score with 38. Kent fielded very well, and runs were few and far between. The interest flagged rather until Hearne joined Wright. The former hit capitally, and had knocked up 21 when the game closed, the score being 134 for nine wkts.

Bucks. finished their first innings on Tuesday morning, the last wicket making 75 runs. Wright added 19 to his overnight's score, and Hearne also 19. Bucks' total was 173. They followed on and did a great deal better in their second innings. Kent's bowling was quite ineffective, and at the fall of the second wicket Bucks had made 236 runs. Ross and Jennison each made a good stand, the former obtaining 82 and Jennison 87. A feature of the play was the splendid catch (off Hearne) by Preston. The side were all out for 312.

Kent commenced their second innings at a quarter to five, and two wickets were quickly down for 23 runs. Powell and Jennings gave a creditable display, both batting smartly. Jennings was run out, the third wicket being taken for 96. The next two wickets fell rapidly, Morfee being run out for 1, and Collins making a duck, the first on the Kent side. Powell continued to force matters, and runs were snatched at every opportunity. Hosie made some splendid hits. Powell was at length caught by Le Gros, having made 64 runs. Hosie followed him to the pavilion soon after. Roberts and Hickmott next batted, and play was very keen. The finish was very exciting, but the required number of runs was obtained, and Kent won by three wickets. Scores:—

SOMERSET v. SURREY.

Played at Taunton on August 3, 4 and 5 and left drawn. Somerset won the toss and, as there had been a good deal of rain in the early morning, put Surrey in. The home bowlers, however, were unable to take advantage of the state of the wicket and before stumps were drawn Surrey had run up 446 for six wickets in four hours and three-quarters. In all, they made 528 for seven wickets in five and a-half hours. Hobbs stayed whilst 50 were made for the first wicket, and Goatly helped Hayes to add 127 for the second in 80 minutes. The last-named made his 101 in just under three hours without a mistake. Bird and Harrison put on 75 in half-an-hour and Ducat and Hitch 180 in 75 minutes (the first 103 in 35). Ducat's play was faultless and Hitch offered only one chance—a difficult one when 35. The former hit fourteen 4's and the latter a 6 and fifteen 4's. The Somerset batsmen could do little against Rushby, who at one period got six wickets for 13 runs, and were called upon to follow-on 395 in arrears. Hardy and Bisgood then made 77 for the opening partnership, but with two men out for 95 the game was given up, not a ball being sent down on the third day owing to rain. Score and analysis:—
