The bowling analysis for H-E O b + CR + W O b agree with EADT + H Adv that Linfold took bowlers, Treadgill 2, Water 2 and Wood G D O yet their dismissal detail contradict their bowling analysis. I therefore reject the alternative and consider bowling analysis should prevail

EADT + H+E Obs + H Adv + CR + WObs all agree that Coleman dismissed Pinfold, Wood L, Cornell, Wood G + Tredgett - therefore accept these as bowled Coleman. I much prefer the EADT card + narrative but if Bob wishes to have different catches I will not object.

VISITORS COLLAPSE.
SENSATIONAL BOWLING BY COLEMAN.
(From Our Special Correspondent.)

Suffolk paid a visit to Bishop Stortford on Tuesday, when they commenced their second match of the season in the Minor Counties Championship against Hertfordshire. Winning the toss, the home team batted first, and were dismissed for 189, which was satisfactory to the visitors who were by no means up to full strength. The Suffolk innings, however, was one long procession, Coleman being invincible on a wicket which just suited him, and after a deplorable exhibition of batting the whole side were dismissed for 54.

J. G. Anderson and H. B. Cowley opened for Herts. to the bowling of Penfold and Trudgett. Cowley made the first notable hit of the match, square cutting Trudgett to the boundary for 4. Suffolk early met with success, for with 10 runs on the board Penfold hit Anderson's leg stump with the fifth ball of his second over. C. H. Titchmarsh joined Cowley. The Bury pro. was bowling extremely well, and for a time the batsmen were very quiet. Titchmarsh was at the wickets a quarter of an hour before he scored, then hitting a 4 off Penfold. Cowley made some pretty shots all round the wicket. The Suffolk fielding was distinctly good, Bennett being especially prominent in the slips. With the score at 50, Waters went on vice Trudgett. It was from the other end that a separation was to come, however. Titchmarsh playing on to Penfold at 51, Golding next became associated with Cowley. The total had only been increased by six however, when Cowley was caught in the slips by Bennett off Penfold. Cowley had played most attractive cricket, and the Suffolk men must have been very glad to see him leave just when he appeared set for a lot of runs. The start was a decidedly good one for the visitors, for whom Penfold was bowling as well as he has ever done, and seemed to have quite recovered from the injury to his knee which somewhat handicapped him at Newmarket. Three three runs only over the mark, one being a maiden. Then they Cuthbertson and Golding both helped themselves to 4's of the first ball. Waters then dealt with success. Cuthbertson being dismissed by a lovely one-handed shot. The first over by Penfold of the match being a fine catch, and was deservedly applauded by the spectators. A P. Leighton a local man, who has made some big scores as Bishop Stortford, was out. However, he was clean bowled by Waters before he had scored, and five wickets were down in just over the hour for 50 runs. Coleman started him in the long field. The aim was in his eye, and he failed to judge it properly. He should have caught it, but again made the mistake of striking with it with one hand. Double change was tried for G. D. Wood and Trudgett going on for Penfold and Waters. The 100 appeared as a result of an hour and a half's play, and when lunch was taken the total stood at 104 for six wickets.

Trudgett and Penfold were the bowlers after lunch. In Penfold's second over Coleman again gave a chance, skying one, which G. D. Wood might have scored, but was not. The 100 came at 121 being made by Penfold off Trudgett for a well-played 25. With Coleman the outgoing batsman and helped to put on 41, and his knock was a decidedly useful one for the former who, having just been out, was again very smart, and P. K. Cornell kept wicket splendidly. W. H. Marsh joined Coleman, and the latter drove Trudgett over the screen at the very end of the over. The 100 was again made by Major Wood off Trudgett, and H. M. True, Suffolk managed to do a little better on their second attempt, but it was useless to fight against the inevitable, and time and again the absence of the "army" of slips who were clustered around in anticipation. There was one bright period in the play on Wednesday morning from the Suffolk standpoint, and that was the really fine bowling of Coleman, who had scored 90 for three wickets overnight, lost the remainder in an hour for the addition of 47 more runs, to make 137, and circumstances were factors in the defeat of a team who from tea time on the first day were always fighting an uphill battle.

The not out, Golding (25) and 2. H. Cuthbertson (18) returned at 130 to the bowling of Penfold and Trudgett. With only four runs added to the overnight total Penfold bowled (Golding, and in the next over hit Cuthbertson—Golding was the first two wickets falling for the addition of 17 runs. Coleman was the next to join Marsh, and hit off vigorously. When he had made 21, however, he was out to a very smart catch behind the wicket by P. K. Cornell, the sixth wicket falling at 130. The eighth over next became associated with Marsh, but at 126 he was sent back by another fine catch by Penfold in the slips of Trudgett. H. M. Harford got a nasty snick in the hand from Penfold, but bowled him out half an hour later. Penfold and Trudgett were bowling extremely well. Burton left at 130, Bennett bringing off a very fine catch of Trudgett. The innings closed for 137, Marsh being the last man to be dismissed, some 40 minutes before the remaining wickets on Wednesday fell to him for the addition of 47 runs. Trudgett bowling as well as he ever did. He took six wickets for 70 runs, and Penfold four for 42.

D. Mustard and F. P. Wood started on the practically impossible task of getting 275 to win, facing the bowling of Coleman and Burton. The previous day on several occasions Burton had been the target for "no ball" and "no boundary" but yesterday he was pulled up twice in succession in his first over. Coleman was again making them kick a lot, but pitched them a length which made it necessary to play them a square and Wood made some nice shots, and with several extras the first four overs produced 28 runs. At 28, however, Wood touched one from Coleman, and fell into the inevitable trap, being caught in the slips by Penfold. H. Wrinch joined Mustard, but at the same total the latter was caught at the wicket, although the decision evidently came as a surprise to the batsman. S. G. Bennett partnered Wrinch, who drove Burton nearly to the pavilion. Bennett shaped very well, and made some long shots, getting Coleman to the pavilion rails and making two runs.

The usual way to Coleman in the slip. Titchmarsh joined Bennett and snicked Coleman over his wicket for four, but was then bowled. Bennett was the next to leave, being out to a brilliant catch by Marsh in the slips off Penfold, and half the side were dismissed for 53 runs. Major Wood joined Penfold, and the latter drove Coleman all along the floor to the screen a fine shot. The Mayor was caught without scoring, bagging his "brace." P. P. Cornell, another candidate for a "pair," then partnered Penfold, and the two fell victim, being caught in the wicket off Burton. Penfold, Trudgett, and Waters were dismissed without further addition to the score, and Suffolk were disposed of for the second time, Herts winning by 208 runs. Coleman again came out with some wonderful figures, capturing seven wickets for 25 runs.

CRICKET IN SCOTLAND.

The Indians commenced their tour by easily beating an eleven of the Northern Counties at Inverness; but cricket is not a strong force so far North. They afterwards proceeded to Galashiels to meet the select of Scotland. At least, it ought to have been the select, but a few apparently did not appreciate the honour of representing their country and the team that took the field differed greatly from the original choice. However, the playing strength of the side was not seriously diminished and in the end the Indians were lucky to escape with a draw which another half-hour would probably have turned into a victory for Scotland. The visitors were disappointing as much more was expected of them; and, indeed, except in the taking of catches and at the wicket, where Sesha Ghari gave an exceeding smart display, the Scots with justice might claim a superiority.

J. A. Ferguson, of Perthshire, was the outstanding success of the match. His 47 in the first innings was perhaps the finest exhibition of batting in the game, and before that he had taken five of the Indians' wickets for 36. T. P. Herriot also did splendidly in this, his first big match, and R. G. Tait as usual gathered a lot of runs in his wonted breezy style. The bowling showed a marked improvement compared with that seen in the Irish match, and the introduction of J. H. Bruce Lockhart, the light blue, and Ferguson was mainly responsible. Lockhart, though expensive, paid his way and always kept the Indian batsmen from settling down, and D. Chapel at length justified his inclusion by dismissing five of the Indians for 34 in the second innings.

Financially, the match proved another failure though it was no worse than the Irish International at Glasgow. No matter where these matches are played there is never likely to be a large balance.

Carlton finished a most successful season on Saturday by beating Clydesdale by a substantial margin. This club has won some three-fourths of its matches, generally with consummate ease, and suffered defeat only once. Unfortunately they did not meet the other highly successful combinations of the season with the exception of Perthshire, when a draw resulted.

The Western Union Championship was practically decided when Uddingston got off with a draw in their match with Poloc, at Shawholm on Saturday. J. Grieve, the mainstay of Poloc, was assisting Scotland at Galashiels, and this fact was expected to ensure an easy victory for Uddingston; but for once they were caught napping and they probably had the rain to thank for escaping defeat, as at the finish they were 28 behind and had only two wickets to fall. Uddingston have won this championship almost every year since its inception, but this season they would experience little satisfaction seeing that several of the most important clubs in the west had dropped out. The real championship of the West was decided the previous Saturday, when Uddingston overcame DrumPELLIER for the second time this year.

Broadbent, the Uddingston professional, will probably be found in the ranks of Aberdeenshire next season as an amateur. A cricketer whose fame is widely known will shortly be announced as having filled his place.
